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Second Meeting of the U.S.-India Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET)

- Meeting Held in New Delhi.
- Background:
 - Launched in 2023.
 - Led by the Indian National Security Council Secretariat and the U.S. National Security Council.
 - Aimed at cooperation in critical and emerging technologies (CET) such as space, semiconductors, telecommunications, clean energy, and biotechnology.
- Key Points:
- Innovation:
 - Unlocking over \$90 million in government funding over the next five years.
 - Establishing the U.S.-India Global Challenges Institute to promote research in semiconductor technology, sustainable agriculture, and more.
 - Space Technology Cooperation:
 - Agreement to launch the NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar, a jointly developed satellite to map Earth's surface every 12 days to combat climate change.
 - Exploring opportunities for collaboration in the Lunar Gateway Programme, which aims to build a space station around the moon under the Artemis programme led by the U.S.
 - Telecommunications
 - Partnering to deploy cost-effective Open Radio Access Network technology.
 - Strengthening cooperation in developing 6G technologies.
- Biotechnology:
 - Developing a joint Strategic Framework to optimize and strengthen the global biopharmaceutical supply chain.
 - Launching the "Bio-X" initiative to promote cooperation and enhance competitiveness in the biotechnology sector.
- Clean Energy:
 - Enhancing mineral security partnership by co-investing in lithium resource projects in South America and rare earth deposits in Africa.

Krishi Sakhi: Empowering Rural Women in Agriculture

- On June 18, 2024, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will award certificates to over 30,000 self-help groups as Krishi Sakhis in Varanasi.
 - This initiative recognizes the crucial role of women in agriculture and aims to enhance their skills.
 - The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, in collaboration with the Ministry of Rural Development, signed an MoU on August 30, 2023, to launch the Krishi Sakhi convergence program (KSCP).
- Krishi Sakhi Convergence Program (KSCP)
 - Part of the 'Lakhpati Didi' program, KSCP aims to transform rural India by empowering women as Krishi Sakhis.
 These women are trained and certified as Para-extension Workers, which aligns with the objectives of the "Lakhpati Didi" Program.
 - Training Modules Provided To Krishi Sakhi's:
 - Agro-ecological practices
 - Farmer Field Schools
 - Seed banks
 - Soil health and conservation

- Integrated farming
- Livestock management
- Bio-inputs
- Communication skills
- Employment Opportunities: Certified Krishi Sakhis to earn between INR 60,000 to 80,000 per year through various MoA&FW schemes.
- Certification Status: 34,000 out of 70,000 Krishi Sakhis certified.
- Phase 1 States: Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Odisha, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, Meghalaya.

- About
 - CPPI (Container Port Performance Index) for 2023 is developed jointly by the World Bank and S&P Global Market Intelligence.
 - It evaluates port performance based on vessel time spent in port.
- Purpose:
 - The index helps stakeholders, both public and private, to assess and improve port efficiency.
 - By identifying areas for enhancement, it aims to benefit all involved parties.
- > Top Container Port:
 - Yangshan Port in China emerged as the top-ranked container port in CPPI 2023.

Angel Tax

The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) has recommended the removal of Angel Tax.

- About
 - The Angel Tax was first introduced in 2012 under the Income-tax Act, 1961.
 - It applies to unlisted companies that raise capital by issuing shares at a price exceeding their fair market value.
- Purpose:
 - The tax was primarily aimed at preventing money laundering and ensuring compliance with tax regulations.
 - It targeted instances where companies might issue shares at inflated prices to evade taxes.
- Proposed Removal:
 - Advocates argue that its elimination would simplify tax compliance for businesses.
 - The removal is expected to encourage investment in startups and facilitate their growth without tax-related hurdles.

National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA)

➤ NFRA plans to increase the number of audit firms it inspects annually to further improve the audit quality and financial reporting standards in India.

- > About:
 - Establishment: NFRA was constituted in 2018 under Section 132(1) of the Companies Act, 2013, by the Government of India.
 - Headquarters: New Delhi
- Objective: NFRA's primary objective is to enhance the quality of corporate financial reporting across India.
- **Composition:** NFRA is composed of a chairperson appointed by the Central Government and can have up to 15 members, including both part-time and full-time members.
- Functions and Responsibilities:
 - **Policy Recommendations:** NFRA recommends accounting and auditing policies and standards for approval by the Central Government.
 - Monitoring and Enforcement: It monitors and ensures compliance with accounting and auditing standards by companies.
 - Audit Oversight: NFRA oversees the audit of accounts conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.
