Banking & Finance

1. RBI Fines Bank Of America, N.A., HDFC Bank

- RBI has imposed a penalty of Rs 10,000 each on Bank of America, N.A. and HDFC Bank Ltd for violation of certain norms.
- The penalty on Bank of America, N.A. has been imposed for violation of Reserve Bank of India's instructions on reporting requirements under Liberalised Remittance Scheme of FEMA 1999.
- Brian Thomas Moynihan, current chairman and CEO of Bank of America.
- The penalty on HDFC Bank is for violation of directions on acceptance of deposits from non-residents.
- Besides, penalties have been imposed on five cooperative banks for noncompliance with various regulatory norms.
- The cooperative banks which have been penalised are The Patliputra Central Cooperative Bank, Bihar; The Balasore Bhadrak Central Co-operative Bank, Odisha; The Dhrangadhra People's Cooperative Bank, Gujarat; Patan Nagarik Sahakari Bank Ltd., Patan, Gujarat; and The Mandal Nagarik Sahakari Bank, Gujarat.
- In all cases, the RBI said the penalties are based on the deficiencies in regulatory compliance and is not intended to pronounce upon the validity of any transaction or agreement entered into by entities with their customers.

2. SBI MF gets RBI nod to buy 9.99% stake in Karur Vysya Bank

 The Reserve Bank has given its approval to SBI Mutual Fund (SBI MF) for acquiring up to 9.99% of the paid-up

share capital or voting rights of Karur Vysya Bank Ltd (KVB).

- If SBI MF fails to acquire major shareholding within a period of one year from the date of RBI's letter, this approval shall stand cancelled.
- Besides, SBI MF must ensure that the aggregate holding in the bank does not not exceed 9.99% at all times.
- Further, if the aggregate holding falls below 5%, prior approval of RBI will be required to increase it to 5% or more of the paid-up share capital or voting rights of KVB.
- KVB, meanwhile, announced the opening of four branches, of which three are in Tamil Nadu and one in Bengaluru. With this, the total number of branches has increased to 831.

3. Bank lending to pvt corporate rises 14.9 pc in Sep: RBI data

- Bank lending to the private corporate sector grew 14.9 per cent in September 2023 from 14.7 per cent a year ago, according to the Reserve Bank data.
- Another set of banking data released by the central bank showed the share of term deposits bearing a 6 to 8 per cent interest rate rose to 78.6 per cent in September 2023 against 12.5 per cent in March 2022.
- According to data on outstanding credit of banks at September-end 2023, loans to industry accounted for nearly onefourth of total bank credit; they increased by 8.6 per cent (year-on-year) in September 2023 (against 12.3 per cent a year ago); working capital loans growth has remained in double digits for the last six quarters.



4. RBI says 97.26% of Rs 2000 notes back in the system

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on December 1 said 97.26 percent of the Rs2000 banknotes in circulation as on May 19, 2023, has been returned to the banking system.
- The total value of Rs2000 banknotes in circulation, which amounted to Rs3.56 lakh crore as at the close of business on May 19, 2023 when the withdrawal of Rs2000 banknotes was announced, has declined to Rs9,760 crore as at the close of business on November 30, 2023, the RBI said in a statement.
- The RBI had announced the withdrawal of Rs2000 denomination banknotes from circulation on May 19, 2023 as part of the central bank's clean note policy.
- The facility for deposit and exchange of the Rs 2000 banknotes was available at all bank branches in the country initially upto September 30, 2023, which was later extended upto October 07, 2023

5. TSI bags '200 cr via credit fund

- Piramal Alternatives and CDPQ-backed performing credit fund have agreed to extend a '200 crore sum to ATM (automated teller machines) operator Transaction Solutions International (India) Pvt Ltd (TSI) in a structured credit transaction.
- The capital, raised against convertible securities, will help with TSI's business expansion initiatives and accelerate its ATM deployment.
- 6. RBI, Bank of England sign MoU on cooperation and information exchange related to CCIL

- In a tactical move that could encourage the European Securities and Markets Authority (ESMA) to restore recognition to at least one of the Indian central counterparties (CCPs), the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Bank of England (BoE) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for cooperation and exchange of information in relation to the Clearing Corporation.
- The MoU establishes a framework for the BoE to place reliance on the RBI's regulatory and supervisory activities while safeguarding UK financial stability.

7. RBI imposes monetary penalty on four cooperative banks

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed monetary penalties on four cooperative banks for deficiencies in regulatory compliance.
- These co-operative banks are: Jijamata Mahila Sahakari Bank Ltd, Shri Laxmikrupa Urban Co-operative Bank Ltd, The Konark Urban Cooperative Bank Ltd and The Chembur Nagarik Sahakari Bank Ltd.
- These penalties have been imposed in the exercise of powers conferred on RBI under certain provisions of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the banking regulator said.

8. RBI cancels licence of Kolhapur-based Shankarrao Pujari Nutan Nagari Sahakari Bank

Shankarrao Pujari Nutan Nagari
Sahakari Bank Limited, Ichalkaranji,
Kolhapur is prohibited from conducting
the business of 'banking' which
includes, among other things,
acceptance of deposits and repayment
of deposits as defined in Section 5(b)
read with Section 56 of the Banking



Regulation Act, 1949 with immediate effect, the Reserve Bank of India said.

- The RBI said the Shankarrao Pujari Nutan Nagari Sahakari Bank does not have adequate capital and earning prospects.
- As such, it does not comply with the provisions of Section 11(1) and Section 22 (3) (d) read with Section 56 of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.
- On liquidation, the Reserve Bank said that every depositor would be entitled to receive deposit insurance claim amount of his/her deposits up to a monetary ceiling of '5,00,000 from Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation (DICGC) subject to the provisions of DICGC Act, 1961.
- As per the data submitted by the bank, 99.85% of the depositors are entitled to receive the full amount of their deposits from DICGC.

9. SBI to acquire 20 per cent stake in SBI Pension Funds for '230 crore

- The Executive Committee of the Central Board (ECCB) of State Bank of India (SBI) has accorded final approval to the Bank for acquiring 20 per cent stake held by SBICAPS (SBI Capital Markets Ltd) in SBIPFPL (SBI Pension Funds Private Ltd).
- The acquisition, which will be completed by December 15, 2023, is for a cash consideration of '229.52 crore.

10. Union Bank collaborates with Accenture to boost operational efficiency

 Union Bank of India said it will be collaborating with Accenture to design and develop a scalable and secure enterprise data lake platform to boost its operational efficiency.

- This will also enhance its ability to offer customer-centric banking services and manage risk.
- Manimekhalai, Managing Director & CEO, Union Bank of India
- Using predictive analytics, machine learning and artificial intelligence, this platform will leverage structured and unstructured data from within the bank as well as from external sources to generate business-relevant insights.
- The program will enable the bank to develop robust data visualization and reporting capabilities including interactive dashboards and reports for business, operational and regulatory purposes.
- Employees will have access to business intelligence that can enhance customer service and operational agility across the bank's branches, contact centers and digital channels.
- As a result, the bank will be able to make informed decisions and identify new data-led opportunities for value creation.
- These will have an impact across its business portfolio including corporate, retail, and micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) banking, and as well as across functions like risk management, treasury, customer service and operations, among others.

11. CARE upgrades rating of IDBI Bank's Tier-II bonds

- CARE Ratings has upgraded the rating of IDBI Bank's Basel III Compliant Tier II Bonds aggregating '2,000 crore from 'A+' to 'AA-' and revised the outlook from 'positive' to 'stable'.
- The credit rating agency also reaffirmed the 'Al+' rating for the bank's Certificate of Deposits aggregating '10,000 crore.



- The revision in the rating assigned to the long-term debt instruments of IDBI Bank factors in the continued improvement in the bank's financial risk profile, with improvement in profitability and asset quality parameters with comfortable capitalisation levels over the past two years ended September 30, 2023, the agency said.
- The rating continues to factor in the bank's franchise with an increasing focus on retail lending in the past few years and relatively high current account savings account (CASA) deposit proportion.

12. RBI MPC Meeting: RBI enhances UPI transaction limit for hospitals, educational institutions to '5 lakh

- RBI Monetary Policy Committee has kept the key policy repo rate unchanged at 6.5% by a unanimous decision.
- This is the fifth meeting on the trot that the MPC decided to maintain the status quo on the repo rate.
- RBI raised the GDP growth projection for FY24 to 7% from 6.5% earlier on buoyant domestic demand and higher capacity utilisation in the manufacturing sector.
- The Indian economy rose by 7.2% in the 2022-23 fiscal ended March 2023.CPI inflation projected at 5.4% for FY24 with Q3 at 5.6% and Q4 at 5.2%.
- The retail inflation projected at 5.2% for Q1 FY25, 4% in Q2, 4.7% in Q3.
- RBI allows reversal of liquidity facilities under SDF and MSF even on weekends and holidays.
- UPI limit has been increased to hospitals and educational institutions from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 5 lakh per transaction.

 The Reserve Bank of India has exempted the requirement of Additional Factor of Authentication (AFA) for transactions up to '1 lakh for certain categories of payments. These include subscriptions to mutual funds, payment of insurance premiums, and payments of credit card bills.

13. RBI Imposes Fines On 4 Banks, Revokes Urban Cooperative Bank's Operating License

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed fines on four banks and revoked the license of Urban Cooperative Bank Limited for not abiding by its rules.
- This bank operates in Sitapur, Uttar Pradesh. The RBI has affirmed that this cooperative bank has insufficient funds for operations, and there is no prospect of future earnings. Therefore, the bank is being shut down.
- The RBI has imposed fines on four cooperative banks, including Patan Cooperative Bank, District Central Bank, Rajarshi Shahu Cooperative Bank, and Primary Teachers' Cooperative Bank.
- Among these, three banks each face a fine of Rs 1 lakh, and another bank has been fined Rs 10,000. The penalties have been imposed by the severity of the malpractices followed in these banks.

14. Bol launches exclusive savings bank product for women

- Bank of India (BoI) has launched an exclusive savings bank product for women (Nari Shakti Savings Account) with an independent source of income.
- The savings account, has features such as personal accident insurance cover of up to '1 crore, discounted health insurance and wellness products,



rebates on locker facilities for gold and diamond SB AC holders.

15. Poonawalla Housing Finance rebrands as Grihum Housing Finance post TPG takeover

- Following a change in ownership,
 Poonawalla Housing Finance has been rebranded as Grihum Housing Finance with global private equity firm TPG now holding 99.02 per cent stake in the housing finance company. Before being promoted by Poonawalla Fincorp, the housing financier was a part of the Magma Group.
- The Housing Finance corporattion has recorded a CAGR of around 28 per cent in the last six years and has a network of 195 branches at present.

16. SBI to sign 70 million euro LoC with KfW for solar projects

- The State Bank of India (SBI) signed 70 million euro (about Rs 630 crore) Line of Credit (LoC) with German Development Bank KfW for promoting solar project in the country.
- The agreement signed at the bank's IFSC Gift City Branch in Ahmedabad. The LoC is aimed at supporting Solar Photovoltaics (PV) projects in India.
- The country's largest lender SBI reported a 9.13 per cent growth in consolidated net profit for the September quarter to Rs 16,099.58 crore as against Rs 14,752 crore in the year-ago period.

17. RBI authorises Bandhan Bank to disburse pensions to railway employees

 Bandhan Bank has announced that it has been authorised by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for the disbursement

of pensions through e-PPOs on behalf of the Ministry of Railways.

- Indian Railways is the largest employer in the country with an employee strength of nearly 12 lakhs.
- Chandra Shekhar Ghosh- MD & CEO of Bandhan Bank
- The Bank will soon be integrating with the Ministry of Railways to operationalise the pension disbursement process.
- This authorisation enables Bandhan Bank to disburse pensions to all employees of the Ministry of Railways who have retired from their service.
- This mandate also provides the Bank an access to around 50,000 average Indian Railways retirees every year across all offices including 17 zonal railways and 8 production units of Indian Railways.

18. Housing finance firm Sitara secures '120 crore of debt from British International Investment

- Affordable housing finance firm Sitara has secured '120 crore in debt finance from UK's development finance institution British International Investment (BII).
- The firm will utilise the funds to grow its loan book and expand operations to new locations.
- Founded in 2015, Sitara is a housing finance company registered with the National Housing Bank and regulated by the RBI.

19. RBI imposes monetary penalty on 5 cooperative banks

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on December 14 said it has imposed a monetary penalty on five cooperative banks citing various rule violations. These cooperative banks are



Mumbai-based Janakalyan Sahakari Bank, Pune Merchants Co-operative Bank, Pune Municipal Corporation Servant's Co-operative Urban Bank, Indapur Urban Co-operative Bank and Patan Urban Co-operative Bank.

 RBI has imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 5 lakh on Janakalyan Sahakari Bank for non-compliance, Rs 1 lakh on Pune Merchants Co-operative Bank, Rs 5 lakh on Indapur Urban Cooperative Bank Bank, Rs 2 lakh on the Patan Urban Cooperative Bank and Rs 5 lakh on Indapur Urban Cooperative Bank Bank.

20. IndusInd Bank launches industry-first community banking program for Diamond Cohorts with 'Indus Solitaire Program'

- IndusInd Bank announced the launch of its 'Indus Solitaire Program,' a community banking initiative meticulously crafted for the diamond industry.
- This curated banking program will be offered through Bank's flagship branches in prime locations across various cities with concentration in Mumbai and Surat and will provide a range of exclusive benefits.
- Through the 'Indus Solitaire Program',
 IndusInd Bank is all set to offer a whole
 gamut of tailored banking services for
 the Diamond Industry, that includes
 24*7 locker access at specific branches,
 add-on family accounts, debit and credit
 cards that come with membership
 benefits at top-tier hotels, concierge
 services, complimentary golf lessons and
 movie tickets, zero cross-currency mark up fee on foreign exchange,
 complimentary lounge access, along with
 an appealing rewards structure and
 overseas hospitalization coverage on

credit cards and customized diamond industry employee salary account.

21. RBI directs banks to refrain from investing in any scheme offered by Alternative Investment Funds

- The Reserve Bank of India has directed all Commercial Banks, Co-operative Banks, Non-Banking Financial Companies including Housing Finance Companies and Financial Institutions to refrain from investing in any scheme offered by Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs), which has downstream investments either directly or indirectly in the bank's debtor company.
- RBI has stated that the debtor company means any company that has taken a loan from the bank anytime during the preceding twelve months.
- RBI has further directed banks to liquidate their investment from such AIFs within thirty days

22. MSME lender U Gro Capital raises '250 crore from Dutch development bank

- DataTech NBFC U GRO Capital has raised '250 crore from the Dutch Entrepreneurial Development Bank FMO through rupee-denominated nonconvertible debentures (NCDs).
- The MSME-lending-focused NBFC has provided credit to more than 80,000 small businesses.
- Prior to this, it had raised '240 crore from Denmark's Investment Fund for Developing Countries (IFU) in May 2023.

23. Karur Vysya Bank, HDFC Life enter into corporate agency tie-up

 Private sector Karur Vysya Bank and HDFC Life have entered into a corporate



agency agreement to offer life insurance products to their respective customers.

 This corporate agency arrangement would enable customers of Karur Vysya Bank to avail HDFC Life's wide range of life insurance products which include solutions for protection, savings and investment and retirement.

24. After a year of waiting, RBI grants at least six payment aggregator licences

- After over a year of waiting, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) granted its final approval for at least six payment aggregator licences, thus lifting the ban on entities such as RazorPay and Cashfree Payments for acquiring new merchants.
- The final nod for the payment aggregator licence has come for Razorpay, Cashfree Payments, Open Financial, EnKash, Google Pay, payment India

25. Sebi proposes optional T+0, instantaneous settlement for equity cash segment

- The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) is contemplating the implementation of a same-day settlement cycle, known as T+0, in two phases.
- This is seen as a preliminary step towards instantaneous settlement.
- The shorter T+0 settlement cycle is being considered for the equity cash segment as an optional mechanism, in addition to the current T+1 (Trade plus one day).
- As per the SEBI consultation paper, the implementation of T+0 and the instant settlement cycle of trades will be done as an option along with the current T+1 settlement cycle continuing.

- SEBI introduced the T+3 settlement cycle in 2002, the T+2 settlement cycle was introduced in 2003 and the current T+1 settlement cycle was introduced in 2021 and was fully implemented by January 2023.
- Under the T+1 settlement cycle, if an investor buys shares on Monday, he/she will receive them in their demat account on Tuesday.
- Similarly, if the shares are sold on Monday, they will receive the money in their bank account on Tuesday.
- SEBI has proposed the implementation of T+1 and the instant settlement cycle in two phases.
- In the first phase, an optional T+0 settlement cycle would be introduced for trading till 1:30 pm. The settling of those trades under the T+1 cycle could be settled on the same day by 4:30 PM.
- Under the second phase of implementation, optional immediate or instant trade-by-trade settlement of trades could be done till 3:30 pm. After the implementation of the second phase, the first phase (T+0 settlement) will be discontinued.
- SEBI has proposed to begin the implementation of the T+0 settlement cycle with the top 500 listed companies as per market capitalisation. This is proposed to be done in three phases of 200, 200, and 100 companies.
- As per SEBI, T+0 and the instant
 settlement cycle will bring advantages
 like instant receipt of funds and
 securities to the investor. Also, it will
 eliminate the risk of any kind of
 settlement shortage and give greater
 control over funds and securities to the
 investor.



26. RBI issues draft omnibus SRO framework for banks, NBFCs

- RBI issued a draft omnibus framework for self-regulatory organisations (SROs) for banks, NBFCs and other entities regulated by it.
- In order to be eligible to apply for an SRO license, the applicant shall set up a not-for-profit company with adequate net worth and the ability to create infrastructure to discharge various responsibilities on a continuing basis.
- In order to be eligible to apply for an SRO license, the applicant shall set up a not-for-profit company with adequate net worth and the ability to create infrastructure to discharge various responsibilities on a continuing basis.
- The applicant must also represent the sector and have the specified membership, or should at least submit the road map for attaining specified membership within a reasonable timeline.

27. Kotak Mahindra Life Insurance launch TULIP, combination of term, ULIP

- Kotak Mahindra Life Insurance launched a new product, T.U.L.I.P, a term with a unit-linked insurance plan.
- The product is a plan that gives a life cover up to 100 times the annual premium while permitting customers to earn returns like a ULIP product.
- Kotak Mahindra Life Insurance MD: Mahesh Balasubramanian.

28. RBI to offer higher amount to banks at VRR auction on Dec 22

 The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has stepped up the amount it is willing to offer the banking system in the 7-day

- variable rate repo (VRR) auction, scheduled on December 22, to '1.75lakh crore against '1-lakh crore offered last week to help banks overcome liquidity deficit.
- In the overnight segment, the weighted average rate continues to be slightly above 6.75 per cent (the marginal standing facility/MSF rate).
- Hence, huge bidding interest can be expected in the forthcoming VRR auction.
- In his latest monetary policy statement, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das observed that system liquidity, as measured by the net position under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF), turned into deficit mode for the first time in September 2023 after a gap of nearly four and a half years since May 2019.

29. IndusInd Bank Launches 'eSvarna', India's First Corporate Credit Card On RuPay Network

- IndusInd Bank announced the launch of 'IndusInd Bank eSvarna', India's first Corporate Credit Card on RuPay network.
- This launch positions IndusInd Bank as the first in the country to integrate UPI functionality with a Corporate Credit Card.
- The IndusInd Bank eSvarna credit card on the RuPay network comes with an array of exclusive perks and rewards.

30. Ola Electric files IPO papers with Sebi; first by auto company in 20 years

 Ola Electric filed preliminary papers with capital markets regulator Sebi to raise funds through an initial public offering (IPO)-- the 1st issue by an automaker in India in more than 20 years.



 The proposed IPO is a fresh issue of equity shares up to Rs 5,500 crore and an offer for sale (OFS) of 95,191,195 equity shares, according to the draft red herring prospectus (DRHP).

31. RBI Releases Draft Licensing Framework for Authorised Persons Under FEMA

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) released a draft 'Licensing Framework for Authorised Persons (APs)' under Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA), 1999.
- The RBI had, in its June monetary policy meeting, said that the Central Bank decided to rationalise and simplify the licensing framework for APs to effectively meet the emerging requirements of the rapidly growing economy.
- According to RBI release, the focus of the draft norms is on rationalising the authorisation framework for money changers in view of the widespread availability of banking services to public, to look at alternate models for facilitating foreign exchange related services and improve the scope of services being offered by AD-Category II entities.
- It added that it will also review the regulatory framework for APs.

32. Reserve Bank of India approves IDFC-IDFC First Bank merger

- Reserve Bank of India has given its nod for the reverse merger of IDFC Ltd with its banking subsidiary IDFC First Bank.
- The boards of IDFC First Bank and IDFC have approved the reverse merger in July.
- As part of the composite scheme of amalgamation, IDFC FHCL would first

- merge with IDFC and then IDFC into IDFC First Bank Ltd.
- IDFC began as an infra lender in 1997. It got in-principle approval from the RBI to set up a bank in April 2014, and in October 2015, it launched IDFC Bank when on-tap licensing began, following which loans and liabilities of IDFC were transferred to the bank.
- In December 2018, it took over Capital First, a consumer and MSME-focused non-bank since 2012, and was renamed as IDFC First Bank and became a fullservice universal bank.

33. RBI permits lending, borrowing in government securities except T-bills

- In a move that will add depth and liquidity to the government securities (G-Secs) market, the RBI has permitted permit lending and borrowing of G-Secs.
- The RBI said G-Secs issued by the Central government excluding Treasury Bills will be eligible for lending/borrowing under a Government Security Lending (GSL) transaction.
- This move comes even as India is set to be included in the globally tracked JP Morgan's Government Bond Index-Emerging Markets (GBI-EM) index, starting June 28, 2024.
- Securities obtained under a repo transaction, including through Reserve Bank's Liquidity Adjustment Facility, or borrowed under another GSL transaction will also be eligible to be lent under a GSL transaction.
- Further, G-Secs issued by the Central Government (including Treasury Bills) and the State Governments will be eligible for placing as collateral under a GSL transaction.
- In addition, Securities obtained under a repo transaction, including through



- Reserve Bank's Liquidity Adjustment Facility, or borrowed under another GSL transaction will also be eligible to be placed as collateral under a GSL transaction.
- GSL transactions may be contracted using any mutually agreed trading process/platform, including but not limited to, bilateral or multilateral, quote driven or order driven process, anonymous or otherwise, RBI said in its "Reserve Bank of India (Government Securities Lending) Directions, 2023".

34. SEBI Extends Deadline To June 2024 To Add Nominees In Mutual Funds, Demat Accounts

- Markets regulator Securities and Exchange Board of India extended the deadline to June 30 next year for demat & mutual fund account holders to provide a nomination.
- Earlier, the deadline to nominate a beneficiary or opt out of it by submitting a declaration form was Dec. 31, 2023.
- Madhabi Puri Buch is the current chairperson of the Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- Further, SEBI asked asset management companies (AMCs), depository participants and Registrar and Transfer Agents (RTAs) to encourage the demat account holders and mutual fund unit holders to fulfil the requirement for nomination/opting out of nomination by sending a communication on fortnightly basis by way of emails and SMS to all such unit holders who are not in compliance with the requirement of nomination.
- 35. Central Bank of India enters in co-lending partnership with Kisetsu Saison Finance for MSME loans

- Public sector lender Central Bank of India entered into a strategic co-lending partnership with Kisetsu Saison Finance, India for MSME Loans.
- Bengaluru-based M/s. Kisetsu Saison Finance is an NBFC with AUM (Assets under management) of the Company as of September 30, 2023, was more than Rs. 8200 crore. Mr. Matam Venkata Rao, Managing Director & CEO of Central Bank of India.
- Co-lending or co-origination is a set-up where banks and non-banks enter into an arrangement for the joint contribution of credit for priority sector lending.
- To put it simply, under this arrangement, both banks and NBFCs share the risk in a ratio of 80:20 (80 percent of the loan with the bank and a minimum of 20 percent with the non-banks).

36. RBI tweaks D-SIB designation methodology, inserts digital payments aspect

- The Reserve Bank of India has revised the methodology for designating a bank as a Domestic Systemically Important Bank (D-SIB) by incorporating digital payments, value as well as volumes, under the substitutability indicator in the assessment.
- The data requirement under this subindicator stands revised from 'Payments
 made in INR using RTGS and NEFT
 systems' to the total value of Digital
 Payments made in Rupees (75 per cent
 weightage) and total volume of Digital
 Payments made in Rupees (25 per cent
 weightage). The digital payments
 include all payments other than paperbased instruments, the RBI said in a
 statement
- The Reserve Bank of India on 28th
 December released the latest list of



- domestic Systemically important banks. ICICI Bank continued to be in the same bucketing structure as last year whereas State Bank of India and HDFC Bank moved to higher buckets.
- SBI shifted from bucket 3 to bucket 4 and HDFC Bank shifted from bucket 1 to bucket 2.
- For SBI and HDFC Bank, the higher D-SIB buffer requirements on account of the bucket increase will be effective from April 1, 2025, said India's top bank.
- The additional Common Equity Tier 1
 (CET1) requirement will be in addition to
 the capital conservation buffer.
- The Reserve Bank had announced SBI and ICICI Bank as D-SIBs in 2015 and 2016.
- Based on data collected from banks as on March 31, 2017, HDFC Bank was also classified as a D-SIB, along with SBI and ICICI Bank.
- The current update is based on the data collected from banks as on March 31, 2023 and factoring in the increased systemic importance of HDFC Bank post the merger of erstwhile HDFC Limited into HDFC Bank on July 1, 2023.
- In case a foreign bank having branch presence in India is a Global Systemically Important Bank (G-SIB), it has to maintain additional CET1 capital surcharge in India as applicable to it as a G-SIB, proportionate to its Risk Weighted Assets (RWAs) in India, i.e., additional CET1 buffer prescribed by the home regulator (amount) multiplied by India RWA as per consolidated global Group books divided by total consolidated global Group RWA.
- **37.** RBI extends Payments Infrastructure Development Fund scheme till **2025**

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has extended the Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) scheme till December 31, 2025.
- The scheme was first launched in 2021 for three years.
- All eligible installations since the inception of the PM Vishwakarma Scheme, i.e., September 17, 2023, may prefer claims under the PIDF Scheme.
- Moreover, apart from physical and digital devices, Soundbox devices and Aadhaar-enabled biometric devices have been made eligible for subsidy under the scheme for installations made from October 1, 2023.
- The RBI also said that the amount of subsidy for devices deployed in special focus areas, including North Eastern States, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, has been increased from 75 per cent to 90 per cent of the total cost.
- This will be irrespective of the type of device and for installations made from October 01, 2023 onwards.
- It was primarily launched to facilitate and subsidise the development of payment acceptance infrastructure in tier-3 to tier-6 cities and the northeastern states of India.
- It envisaged creating 3 million new touchpoints every year in India. Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh are also the focus areas.

38. NPCI launches ASBA-like facility for secondary market


 The 'UPI for Secondary Market' initiative is supported by key stakeholders, including clearing corporations, stock exchanges, depositories, stockbrokers, banks, and UPI app providers.



- During this pilot, investors can block funds in their bank accounts, which will only be debited by the clearing corporations upon trade confirmation during settlement.
- ASBA-like facility of 'Trading supported by blocked amount in secondary market' through block mechanism was approved by the market regulator Sebi, based on the Reserve Bank of India approved facility of single-block-and-multiple-debit in UPI, with the implementation timeline of 1 January, 2024.
- During this pilot, investors can block funds in their bank accounts, which will only be debited by the clearing corporations upon trade confirmation during settlement.
- Clearing corporations will directly process payouts to these clients on a T+1 basis – which means any trade-related settlements must be completed within one day from the day of the transaction.
- HDFC Bank, HSBC, ICICI Bank, and Yes
 Bank are serving as sponsor banks for
 the clearing corporation and exchanges.
- Application Supported by Blocked Amount (ASBA) is a process used to apply for Initial Public Offerings (IPOs) or Follow-on Public Offerings (FPOs) in India.

39. Sebi proposes action points to ease rumour verification regulations

- SEBI proposed changes to the verification of market rumours for listed companies, including relaxation on the 24-hour timeline, verification only on material impact on stock prices, and clarity on the pricing of preferential issuances, buybacks and deals.
- It has included the suggestions of the Industry Standard Forum(ISF) for feedback.
- Rumour verification by the company within 24 hours of 'material price movement'
- Currently, it is 24 hours of 'reporting in the mainstream media'
- Determination of 'material price movement' based on price range of securities
- A lower percentage move considerable as 'material' for high price range shares
- Factor-in movements of benchmark indices to decide material movement





Economy

1. India's Power Consumption Grows 8.5% To 119.64 Billion Units In November

- The country's power consumption grew nearly 8.5% to 119.64 billion units in November, showing a surge in electricity demand due to festivities and increased economic activities. In the year-ago period, power consumption stood at 110.25 BU, higher than 99.32 billion units recorded in November 2021, according to the government data.
- The peak power demand met -- the highest supply in a day -- rose to 204.60 GW in November.
- The peak power supply stood at 187.34 GW in November 2022 and 166.10 GW in November 2021.
- The power ministry had estimated the country's electricity demand to touch 229 GW during summer. The demand did not reach the projected level in April-July due to unseasonal rain.
- The peak supply, however, touched a new high of 224.1 GW in June before dropping to 209.03 GW in July. Peak demand touched 238.19 GW in August. In September this year, it was 240.17 GW. The peak demand was 222.16 GW in October 2023.

2. Highest Ever Coal Dispatch from Captive & Commercial Coal Blocks in November

 Coal production from captive/commercial coal mines during November 2023 comes to 11.94 million tonne (MT), with a growth of 37% compared to 8.74 MT during November 2022.

- At the same time, coal dispatch from Captive/commercial coal mines during November 2023 is 12.92 MT with a growth of 55% compared to 8.36 MT the previous year.
- The average daily coal dispatch from such mines in the month of November 2023 is the highest ever with 4.3 lakh tonnes per day.
- Coal production and dispatch from captive and commercial coal blocks has shown a remarkable growth during the period of April to November 2023.
- The total coal production from captive & commercial coal mines during the period 1st April 2023 to 30th November 2023 was around 83.90 MT, while the total coal dispatch was 89.67 MT indicating a y-o-y growth of 24% and 31% respectively, from the same period of FY 2022-23.

3. GST collection rises 15% in Nov to Rs 1.68 lakh cr

- GST revenue collection for November 2023 came at nearly Rs 1.68 lakh crore, which is a 15% jump on an annual basis, said government.
- Gross GST collection crossed Rs 1.6 lakh crore mark for the sixth time in FY24.
- "The gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue collected in the month of November, 2023 is Rs 1,67,929 crore out of which CGST is Rs 30,420 crore, SGST is Rs 38,226 crore, IGST is Rs 87,009 crore (including Rs 39,198 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 12,274 crore (including Rs 1,036 crore collected on import of goods).
- The government has settled Rs 37,878 crore to CGST and Rs 31,557 crore to SGST from IGST.



- As per Ministry of Finance, the total revenue of Centre and the States in the month of November, 2023 after regular settlement is Rs 68,297 crore for CGST and Rs 69,783 crore for the SGST,".
- During the month, the revenues from domestic transactions (including import of services) are 20% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year.
- It is for the sixth time that the gross GST collection has crossed '1.60 lakh crore mark in FY24.

4. IOC raises Panipat refinery expansion cost by 10%, pushes completion deadline by a year

- Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), the nation's top oil firm, has revised the estimates of cost of expanding the Panipat refinery in Haryana by 10 per cent to Rs 36,225 crore and pushed back completion deadline by more than a year to December 2025.
- IOC is expanding its 15 million tonnes a year refinery, about 100-km north of New Delhi, to 25 million tonnes.

5. India's emission intensity reduced by 33% between 2005 and 2019: Govt report

- India reduced its GDP emission intensity by 33 per cent between 2005 and 2019, achieving the target 11 years in advance, according to a government report.
- The report also said India's GDP grew at a cumulative annual growth rate of 7 per cent but its emissions rose by only 4 per cent per year during this period, suggesting that the country has been successful in decoupling its economic growth from planet-warming greenhouse gas emissions.

6. India's Goods sector surpasses services in exports for first time

- For the first time the Goods (Merchandise) sector has surpassed the services sector in Export.
- The export has reached 762 billion dollars in the last financial year.
- The Goods (Merchandise) export has gone upto 453 billion dollars, while services export was at 309 billion dollars.

7. India's coal imports drop over 4 per cent to 148 million in Apr-Oct period

- India's coal imports dropped 4.2 per cent to 148.13 Million Tonnes (MT) in the April-October period of the ongoing financial year.
- The country's coal imports were 154.72
 MT in the corresponding period of the previous fiscal.
- Of the total imports in October, inbound shipments of non-coking coal stood at 16.88 MT, against 11.69 MT imported in October last year.

8. India's forex reserves surpasses \$600 billion mark after nearly four months

- India's foreign exchange reserves increased to USD 604 billion, surpassing the USD 600 billion mark after a gap of about four months.
- The forex reserves were last above the USD 600 billion mark on August 11 this year.

9. India's industrial production growth rises to 16-month high of 11.7 % in October

 India's industrial production growth rose to a 16-month high of 11.7 percent



in October against a contraction of 4.1 per cent in the same period last year.

- The data released by the National Statistical Office showed that the manufacturing sector's output grew by 10.4 per cent in October 2023 while Mining production rose 13.1 per cent during the month.
- Factory output is measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production

10. Nine states record a higher rate of inflation in November, shows data

- As many as nine states have recorded a higher rate of inflation compared to the national average in November.
- While the average Indian consumer's cost of living rose by 5.55 per cent compared to the same time last year, it increased by 7.65 per cent in Odisha, 6.99 per cent in Rajasthan, and 6.78 per cent in Haryana.
- States like Bihar, Karnataka, Punjab,
 Telangana, Gujarat, and Uttar Pradesh —
 which have a higher inflation rate than
 the national average —recorded a rise
 between 5.56 per cent to 6.54 per cent.

11. India's overall exports in November 2023 is estimated at USD 62.58 Billion; an increase of 1.23 percent over Nov 2022

- India's overall exports (Merchandise and Services combined) in November 2023 is estimated to be USD 62.58
 Billion, exhibiting a positive growth of 1.23 per cent over November 2022.
 Overall imports in November 2023 is estimated to be USD 67.88 Billion, exhibiting a negative growth of (-) 6.16 per cent over November 2022.
- India's overall exports (Merchandise and Services combined) in April-November 2023 are estimated to be USD 499.46

- **Billion**, exhibiting a negative growth of (-) 1.39 per cent over April-November 2022. Overall imports in April-November 2023 are estimated to be USD 560.90 Billion, exhibiting a negative growth of (-) 7.58 per cent over April-November 2022.
- The estimated value of services export for November 2023 is USD 28.69 Billion, as compared to USD 26.93 Billion in November 2022.
- The estimated value of services import for November 2023 is USD 13.40 Billion as compared to USD 15.39 Billion in November 2022.

12. Reserve Bank of India sets sovereign gold bond issue price at Rs 6,199/gram

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI)
 announced that the issue price for the
 next tranche of Sovereign Gold Bond
 has been fixed at Rs 6,199 per gram and
 will open for subscription on December
 18 for five days.
- The Sovereign Gold Bond (SGB) Scheme 2023-24 - Series III will be open for subscription during December 1822, 2023.
- The SGBs will be sold through scheduled commercial banks (except small finance banks, payment banks and regional rural banks), Stock Holding Corporation of India Limited (SHCIL), Clearing Corporation of India Limited (CCIL), designated post offices, National Stock Exchange of India Limited and Bombay Stock Exchange Limited.
- The investors are compensated at a fixed rate of 2.50 per cent per annum payable semi-annually on the nominal value.
- The maximum limit of subscription shall be 4 kg for individuals, 4 kg for HUF and 20 kg for trusts and similar entities per fiscal year.



- The finance ministry said the tenor of the SGB will be eight years with an option of premature redemption after the fifth year to be exercised on the date on which interest is payable.
- The Reserve Bank of India issues the bonds on behalf of the central government.

13. Trade deficit narrows to nearly \$21bn in Nov

- India's trade deficit in November narrowed to \$20.6 billion as goods exports and imports fell.
- Goods exports declined due to a shrinkage in key product categories, including engineering goods, petroleum products, and garments.
- The fall in imports was driven by oil and coal.
- Despite the global economic slowdown and high inflation, India's exports numbers are healthy, according to Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal. Services exports increased, resulting in a trade surplus and helping narrow the overall trade deficit.
- However, exports remain weak due to sluggish global demand.

14. Gross Direct Tax collections for current Financial Year register over 17 percent growth

- The Gross Direct Tax collections for the Financial Year 2023-24 have registered a growth of over 17 percent.
- Before adjusting refunds, Gross
 Collection of Direct Taxes stands at over
 15 lakh 95 thousand crore rupees as
 compared to 13 lakh 63 thousand crore
 in the corresponding period of 2022-23.
- The Ministry of Finance has said that the Direct Tax collections for this finance year up to 17th December, show that

- net collections are at 13 lakh 70 thousand crore rupees which is an increase of 20.66 per cent.
- The Ministry added that advance Tax collections for the Fiscal Year 2023-24 stand at over 6 lakh 25 thousand crore rupees which shows a growth of 19.94 per cent.

15. Indian economy to grow 6.3% in FY24 and FY25: IMF

- Indian economy is likely to log 6.3% growth in FY24 and FY25 on the back of macroeconomic and financial stability, International Monetary Fund's Executive Board.
- The international fund lauded the macroeconomic policies and reforms of the government, stating that India could achieve even higher growth, with greater contributions from labour and human capital.
- IMF's growth projection is much lower than the Reserve Bank of India's Monetary Policy Committee growth forecast of 7% for FY24.
- The MPC revised its growth numbers in December owing to a strong performance in the first half.

16. 13 states raise Rs 19,692 crore; Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh top list

- Thirteen states raised Rs 19,692 crore, against a notified amount of Rs 19,592 crore through the auction for state government securities. In the previous week, eight states had raised Rs 12,100 crore.
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data showed that Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh raised the highest amount of Rs 4,000 crore each



Karnataka raised the amount of Rs 4,000 crore through two papers – Rs 2,000 crore through a 15-year paper with a cut-off yield of 7.60 per cent, and Rs 2,000 crore through a 16-year paper with a cut-off yield of 7.64 per cent.

17. Net FDI into India touches 21-month high at \$5.9 billion in October

- The net foreign direct investment (FDI) into the country at \$5.9 billion rose to a 21-month high in October 2023, primarily due to strong gross inflows and lower repatriation.
- Sequentially, net FDI rose from \$1.54 billion in September 2023 and \$1.16 billion in October 20222, according to Reserve Bank of India data.
- The major source countries were
 Mauritius, Singapore, Cyprus and Japan,
 contributing more than four-fifths of the
 total FDI inflows in October 2023.
- Around four-fifths of the gross inward FDI equity flows were received in manufacturing, retail and wholesale trade, electricity and other energy sector, and financial services sector.

18. India's total debt rises to Rs 205 lakh crore in Sep quarter

- The country's total debt, or the total outstanding bonds which are being traded in the market, rose to USD 2.47 trillion (Rs 205 lakh crore) in the September quarter, according to a report.
- The total debt amount in the March quarter of the previous fiscal was USD 2.34 trillion (Rs 200 lakh crore).
- The report is a collation of data from the RBI, Clearing Corporation of India, and SEBI.

- The central government's debt stood at \$ 1.34 trillion, or Rs 161.1 trillion, in the September quarter, up from \$ 1.06 trillion, or Rs 150.4 trillion, in the March quarter, Vishal Goenka, Co-Founder of Indiabonds.com, said, quoting data provided by the Reserve bank of India.
- Indiabonds.com, which was launched in 2021, is a Sebi-registered online bond platform that provides investing solutions. The report is a collation of data from the RBI, Clearing Corporation of India, and the Securities and Exchange Board of India. At Rs 161.1 trillion, the central government's debt constitutes the highest 46.04 per cent share of the total amount.
- State governments' debt share was 24.4 per cent, or \$ 604 billion (Rs 50.18 trillion), the report said.
- Treasury bills were worth \$ 111 billion, or Rs 9.25 trillion, constituting 4.51 per cent of the total debt, it said.
- Corporate bonds had a 21.52 per cent share of the total debt at \$ 531 billion (Rs 44.16 trillion) in the second quarter of the current fiscal, as per the report.

19. The Centre released '72,961.21 crore as tax devolution to States

- Earlier, an instalment of '72,961.21 crore was released on December 11, 2023. This is in addition to the tax devolution which is due to the States on January 10, 2024.
- Of this latest '72,961.21 crore installment disbursed, the largest share has gone to Uttar Pradesh at '13,088.51 crore, followed by Bihar at '7,338.44 crore and Madhya Pradesh at '5,727.44 crore.
- Of this latest '72,961.21 crore installment disbursed, the largest share has gone to Uttar Pradesh at '13,088.51



crore, followed by Bihar at '7,338.44 crore; Madhya Pradesh at '5,727.44 crore; West Bengal at '5,488.88 crore; Maharashtra at '4,608.96 crore; Rajasthan at '4,396.64 crore and Odisha at '3303.69 crore. The remaining States' share has been lower than '3,000 crore and ranged from '281.63 crore (Goa) — '2,976.10 crore (Tamil Nadu).

- The Finance Commission had recommended that states be given 41 per cent of the divisible tax pool of the Centre during the five-year period 2021-22 to 2025-26, which is at the same level as was recommended by the 14th Finance Commission.

20. India's forex reserves reach \$615.97 billion, highest in 20 months

- India's foreign exchange (FX) reserves rose for the fifth time in the week ending December 15, touching an over 20-month high of \$615.97 billion- the highest level since March 2022.
- In the previous week ended December 8, reserves had risen by \$2.82 billion to \$606.86 billion, as per the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data. They had touched an all-time high of \$645 billion in October 2021.
- Within reserves, foreign currency assets increased by \$ 8.35 billion to \$545.05 billion as of December 15, whereas gold reserves rose \$446 million to \$47.58 billion. Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were up \$135 million to \$18.32 billion. Further, data showed that India's reserve position with the IMF stood at \$5.02 billion, \$181 million higher on the week.

21. CBDT notifies ITR-1, ITR-4 forms for AY 2024-25

- CBDT has notified two new return forms, ITR-1 (SAHAJ) and ITR-4 (SUGAM), for the Assessment Year 2024-25.
- These forms will come into effect from April 1, 2024.
- ITR 1, or Sahaj, can be filed by a resident individual having income of up to '50 lakh from salary and agricultural income.
- ITR 4, or Sugam is for income of up to '50 lakh and income from business and profession.
- ITR 1, or Sahaj, can be filed by a resident individual having income of up to '50 lakh and who receives income from salary, one house property, other sources (interest), and agricultural income of up to '5,000.
- ITR 4, or Sugam, can be filed by individuals, Hindu undivided families (HUFs) and firms other than limited liability partnerships (LLPs) having total income of up to '50 lakh and income from business and profession.

22. IT major Infosys loses \$1.5 billion contract from global customer

- IT major Infosys announced the termination of its \$1.5 billion agreement with an undisclosed global company, focused on artificial intelligence (AI) solutions, signed in September.
- The Salil Parekh-led IT services giant had announced the \$1.5 billion contract for a 15-year period, inked on September 14, 2023.

23. Domestic Coal Based Power Generation increases by 8.38 % during April-Nov 2023

 India has witnessed a remarkable 7.71 percent surge in power generation and



- 11.19 percent in Coal-based power generation from April to November this year, as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- The Ministry said that India is ranked third-largest consumer of energy in the world, with an annual electricity demand increase of about 4.7 percent.

24. Current account gap narrows to 1% of GDP at \$8.3 bn in Q2FY24: RBI

- India's current account deficit (CAD)
 narrowed sequentially to \$8.3 billion, or
 1 per cent of gross domestic product
 (GDP), in the quarter ended September
 (Q2FY24) due to lower merchandise
 trade deficit and growth in services
 exports.
- The CAD was \$9.2 billion, or 1.1 per cent of GDP, in Q1 and \$30.9 billion, or 3.8 per cent of GDP, in Q2FY23.
- The CAD for the April-September quarter of FY23 was 2.9 per cent of GDP in H1FY23.
- The merchandise trade deficit narrowed to \$61 billion from \$78.3 billion in Q2FY23, according to Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data.
- Regarding the BoP position in April-September 2023 (H1FY24), there was an accretion of \$27 billion, compared to a depletion of \$25.8 billion in the year-ago period, the RBI noted.
- Services exports grew by 4.2 per cent Yo-Y on the back of rising exports of software, business and travel services, the RBI said. Net invisible receipts were higher in H1FY24, owing to higher net receipts of services.

25. India's Steel Sector records remarkable growth, emerges as the 2nd largest global producer

- India has emerged as a global force in steel production and the 2nd largest producer of steel in the world.
- Domestic finished steel production stands at 89.711 million tonnes, which is 14.3% higher than corresponding period last year (CPLY).
- The domestic steel consumption stood at 87.066 million tonnes, which is 14.9% higher than CPLY of 75.765 million tonnes.
- Domestic crude steel production was 94.114 million tonnes, with a growth of 14.7 % when compared to the production of 82.072 million tonnes in the same period last year.
- During April November 2023, finished steel imports increased from 3.751 million tonnes last year to 4.253 million tonnes in the current year, witnessing a growth of 13.4%.

26. UP and Bihar get maximum special assistance for capital expenditure and investment

- Out of '1,67,518.6-crore special assistance(loan) allocated by Centre under the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for capital expenditure/investment, UP has been highest recipient, securing '22,857.9 crore(14% of the total release) over the last 4 years.
- Ministry of Finance reveals that in FY2023-24, up to December 13, the State has already received '12,458.43 crore.
- This amount constitutes a significant portion, accounting for 21 per cent of the total assistance released, which stands at '60,307.19 crore. This amount constitutes a significant portion, accounting for 21 per cent of the total assistance released, which stands at '60,307.19 crore.




- The Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure was launched in FY2020-21. The scheme has been expanded and continued as 'Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2023-24' with allocation of '1.3-lakh crore'.
- This includes an amount of '1-lakh crore under Part-I of the Scheme, which has been allocated to States in proportion to their share of Central taxes as per the award of the 15th Finance Commission and incentive amounts of '30,000 crore for reform-centric and sector-specific areas scrapping old vehicles, urban planning reforms, financing reforms in urban local bodies to make them creditworthy for municipal bonds, housing for police personnel above or as part of police stations, unity malls, children and adolescent' library and digital infrastructure.
- Interestingly, while UP and Bihar are the top two States which have fulfilled the above-mentioned criteria and received maximum allocation under the Scheme in the last four years, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Kerala and Punjab are among the States which have received about 1-2 per cent of the total released amount under the Scheme.
- In fact, data shows that Andrha Pradesh, Kerala, Manipur and Punjab have not received any allocation in 2023-24 and as per the Ministry of Finance information provided to the Lok Sabha this month; these States have not met the eligibility criteria prescribed under the Scheme.
- The objective of the Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure/Investment is to enhance capital expenditure by the States.


 The guidelines of the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2023-24 specify targets for capital expenditure for each State in the financial year 2023-24 to qualify for the second instalment under Part-I (Untied) of the Scheme for that fiscal year.

27. Sukanya Samriddhi Schemes' interest rates hiked up to 20 bps for Q4FY24

- The Centre hiked the interest rates of some of the small savings schemes, such as Sukanya Samriddhi Scheme, 3year Time Deposit, for the January-March 2024 quarter.
- As per the latest revised list, the interest rate of Sukanya Samriddhi Scheme will be 8.2%, while for 3-year TD it would be 7.1% for the last quarter of the current fiscal. Earlier, interest rates for Sukanya Samriddhi Scheme and 3-year TD were 8.0%, 7.1%.
- The PPF rates were kept unchanged for more than 3 years. It was last tweaked in April-June 2020, when it was slashed to 7.1 per cent from 7.9 per cent.

 - Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar will inaugurate the 5th edition of Global Ayurveda Festival in Thiruvananthapuram in Kerala.
 - The Global Ayurveda Festival (GAF) 2023 would be held in the state capital of Kerala from December 1-5, with the theme 'Emerging Challenges in Healthcare and a Resurgent Ayurveda'.
 - Delegations from over 70 countries will be present at the event, which underlines the growing recognition of Ayurveda's relevance in addressing global health concerns.
 - The highlights of the festival include experts-led scientific sessions focusing on the latest scientific advancements in Ayurveda, high level industry and institutional participation showcasing innovative Ayurveda-based products, services and research initiatives as well as presentations of posters and papers.
 - It also said that the National Arogya Fair at GAF will showcase a diverse range of medicinal plants and their utilisation in Ayurvedic preparations. All major Ayush institutions in the country will put up their stalls at the expo and there will be pavilions of 20 Ayurveda colleges.
 - GAF 2023 will also see India's first dedicated Business-to-Business (B2B) meet on Ayurveda medical tourism, connecting healthcare pioneers with worldwide buyers and showcasing the country's wealth of Ayurvedic healthcare resources
- 2. Government Approves Terms Of Reference For 16th Finance Commission

- The government has approved the 'Terms of Reference' for the 16 Finance Commission, which makes recommendations on sharing of tax revenues between the Centre and states. The recommendations would cover a five-year period commencing April 1, 2026.
- The commission would submit its report by Oct. 31, 2025.
- The 15th Finance Commission was constituted on Nov. 27, 2017.
- It made recommendations covering a six-year period commencing April 1, 2020 through its interim and final reports.
- Article 280(1) of the Constitutions lays
 down the modalities for setting up of a
 Finance Commission to make
 recommendation on the distribution of
 net proceeds of taxes between the
 Union and states; allocation between
 states of respective shares of such
 proceeds; grants-in-aid and the revenues
 of states and measures needed to
 supplement the resources of
 'panchayats' during the award period.
- The distribution between the Union and states of the net proceeds of taxes which are to be, or may be, divided between them under Chapter I, Part XII of the Constitution and the allocation between states of the respective shares of such proceeds, are among the terms of reference (ToR) approved by the Cabinet.
- 3. Ministry of Tourism launches National Best Tourism Village and National Best Rural Homestays Competition 2024
 - Ministry of Tourism has launched National Best Tourism Village



Competition 2024 and the National Best Rural Homestay Competition 2024 to strengthen the promotion and development of Rural Tourism in the country.

- The earlier version of the National Best Tourism Village Competition 2023 recognized 35 villages all over India in Gold, Silver, and Bronze categories.
- To foster collaboration and create a conducive environment for the growth of Rural Tourism, the Ministry has actively engaged Governments, industry stakeholders, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and local communities through these competitions. This multi-stakeholder approach synergizes the efforts to strengthen the rural economies.
- The competition was launched on World Tourism Day i.e., 27th September 2023, and the applications for the competitions are open from 15th November to 31st December, 2023.

4. Gajraj System: Railways to install Al-based surveillance system to prevent elephant deaths on track

- The Indian Railways will be installing an AI-based surveillance system to prevent elephant deaths on railway tracks.
- These surveillance system will be installed on 700 kilometres of route passing through forest areas.
- Forest areas in Assam, West Bengal, Odisha, Kerala, Jharkhand and some parts of Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu which are home to elephants. wE can call it 'Gajraj System

- Jute Mark India provides collective identity and assurance on origin and quality for traditional jute & jute diversified products. So far, 55 vendors have registered for availing Jute Mark India Logo. Union Minister of State for Textiles, Smt. Darshana Jardosh.
- The Government has approved an
 Umbrella scheme namely the <u>National</u>
 <u>Jute Development Program (NJDP) with
 a total outlay of Rs 485.58 crore for
 <u>implementation during 2021-22 to</u>
 <u>2025-26</u> for overall development and
 promotion of the Jute Sector.

14. Centre approves financial assistance of over 338 crore rupees to Gujarat and 634 crore rupees for Himachal Pradesh

- The Centre has approved the financial assistance of over 338 crore rupees to Gujarat, which was severely affected by the Cyclone Biparjoy.
- The Home Ministry has also approved an additional financial assistance of around 634 crore rupees from the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) to Himachal Pradesh which was severely affected due to floods, cloudbursts, and landslides.

15. National Mission For Clean Ganga Targets Cumulative Sewerage Treatment Capacity Of 7,000 MLD By December, 2026

- Under Namami Gange Programme, in the Ganga basin, a total of 195 sewerage infrastructure projects have been taken up with a cost of '31,344.13 crore for creation & rehabilitation of 6,173.12 Million Litres per Day (MLD) of Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) capacity.
- National Mission for Clean Ganga targets to sanction a cumulative treatment capacity of 7,000 MLD by Dec 2026.

16. Central Tribal University to be set up in Telangana

- The Parliament passed the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2023 bill to establish a central tribal university in Telangana.
- The university will be built at a cost of '900 crore.
- The university is expected to be set up in Mulugu and is named after tribal goddesses Sammakka and Sarakka.
- As per the state and objects of the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2023, the Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal University aims to fulfil regional aspirations by enhancing access and quality of higher education in Telangana.
- The new university is expected to promote higher education and research along with tribal art, culture, customs and technological advancements for the tribal population of India.
- With an added focus on tribal education, the bill states that the Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal University will fulfil its education and other activities like other central universities.
- The Central Universities Act, of 2009
 was enacted to establish and
 incorporate central universities to
 support and improve the education and
 research ecosystem across the states of
 India.

17. Cabinet approves declaration of Surat Airport as an International Airport

- The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has approved the proposal to declare Surat Airport as an International Airport.
- Surat Airport will not only become a gateway for international travelers but also facilitate seamless export-import



operations for the thriving diamond and textile - industries.

18. Rate of Permanent Disablement Benefit (PDB) and Dependant's Benefit (DB) increased under ESI Scheme

- The 192nd Meeting of Employees' State Insurance Corporation was held today at ESIC Headquarters under the Chairmanship of Shri Bhupender Yadav, Union Minister for Labour and Employment, Environment, Forest and Climate Change and Chairman, ESIC.
- In order to neutralise the impact of inflation, the proposal to increase the basic rate of Permanent Disablement Benefit (PDB) and Dependant's Benefit (DB) was approved by ESI Corporation.
- The PDB is paid at the rate of 90% of wages in the form of monthly payment depending upon the extent of loss of earning capacity as certified by a Medical Board.
- The DB is paid at the rate of 90% of wage in the form of monthly payment to the dependants of a deceased Insured person in cases where death occurs due to employment injury or occupational hazards.

19. UGC says, no foreign higher educational institutions to be allowed to offer any programme in India without its prior approval

- University Grant Commission (UGC) has mandated that no foreign higher educational institution (HEI) will offer any programme in India without the prior approval of the commission.
- The regulations also mandate that the HEIs shall not offer programmes under any franchise arrangement and that such programmes shall not be recognised by the UGC.

- This includes Twinning Programmes, Joint Degree, and Dual Degree Programmes.
- UGC also noted that edtech companies that are giving advertisements for offering degree and diploma programmes in online modes in association with some foreign universities/institutions, are not permissible under the franchise agreement and any such programme or degree will not have UGC recognition.
- The University Grants Commission is a statutory organization under the Ministry of Education, Government of India, established by an Act of Parliament in 1956 for the promotion and co-ordination of University education and for the determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research in Universities, and for the purpose of performing its functions under this Act.

20. In a first, exploration licences to private agencies for mineral projects

- In a first, the Ministry of Mines directly sanctioned exploration licences to five Notified Private Exploration Agencies (NPEAs) for critical and deep-seated mineral projects.
- These licensees selected by the Centre sans any auction process would, however, be allowed to participate in the auction of the said minerals, a privilege that was previously not granted.
- A total of 17 projects, including 11 of critical minerals, provided to the five NPEAs are in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Gujarat and Karnataka.
- Gemcokati Exploration, an NPEA in Maharashtra, acquired the highest six



- projects. Kolkata-based Maheshwari Mining secured four projects. Both Geovale Services and Geoexplore secured three projects each, while United Exploration received one project.
- The exploration blocks will contain a variety of minerals, including iron ore, graphite, platinum group elements (PGE), gold, bauxite, nickel, cobalt, and rare earth elements (REE).
- Since March 2022, the ministry has notified 16 Private Exploration Agencies to take up exploration projects through state governments, funded by the National Mineral Exploration Trust (NMET).
- The Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, MMDR Act was amended through the MMDR Amendment Act, 2021, w.e.f. 28/3/2021 which, inter alia, empowers the central government to notify entities, including private entities, that may undertake prospecting operations.
- On August 17, 2023, an amendment to the MMDR Act identified 24 minerals, including graphite, nickel, PGE, REE, potash, among others, as critical and strategic minerals. A comprehensive list of 29 minerals was included in the 'Seventh Schedule' of the Act, opening the possibility for these private exploration agencies to obtain exploration licenses for these minerals.

21. Ola founder Bhavish Aggarwal's Krutrim announces ChatGPT rival

- Krutrim Si Designs, the artificial intelligence (AI) venture of Ola cofounder Bhavish Aggarwal unveiled Krutrim, its base large language model (LLM).
- Krutrim has joined the increasinglycompetitive AI race dominated by

- players such as Google, Microsoft and OpenAl.
- Krutrim, meaning "artificial" in Sanskrit, is a family of LLMs, including Krutrim base and Krutrim Pro, which will have multimodal, larger knowledge capabilities, and many other technical advancements for inference.

22. 'India's fastest' solar-electric boat Barracuda launched

- Taking ahead the cause of eco-friendly maritime transportation, Barracuda, said to be India's fastest solar-electric boat, was launched on at the yard of Navalt Solar and Electric Boats, located off Aroor in Alappuzha.
- Named after the swift, long fish, Barracuda was designed by Navalt and can be deployed even in the rough seas as a workboat to ferry up to 12 passengers.
- This cutting-edge vessel was jointly developed by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders and Navalt.

23. PM Modi inaugurates Swarved Mahamandir in Varanasi

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the world's largest meditation centre Swarved Mahamandir in Varanasi.
- Verses of the Swarveda have been carved upon the walls of the Mahamandir a seven-floor superstructure.
- Following the inauguration of the Swarved Mahamandir, Modi along with UPChief Minister Yogi Adityanath took a tour of the centre that can seat 20,000 people.



24. Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh to inaugurate Good Governance Week 2023 on 19th December, 2023

- Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inagurated the Good Governance Week (Sushasan Saptah) celebrations to be held from 19th December 2023 to 25th December 2023, the Good Governance Day.
- The Good Governance Week 2023 is the third consecutive year of week-long celebrations organized by Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG), Government of India.
- The Good Governance Week events yield very positive outcomes and generate a great sense of commitment and togetherness in the Government's steadfast objective of fostering administrative reforms.
- On this occasion, administrations of States, UTs and at the district level share the platform with Government of India and highlight the best practices in administration which in turn promotes cooperative federalism and improves the discharging of our administrative functions in a cohesive manner that further improves the lives of our citizens.

25. Post Office Bill 2023

- The Parliament passed the Post Office Bill that seeks to simplify the legislative framework to facilitate the evolution of India Post into a citizen-centric service network.
- The Post Office Bill, 2023 seeks to repeal the 125-year-old Indian Post Office Act and consolidate and amend the law relating to post offices in the country.
- It was introduced in the Rajya Sabha on August 10 2023 and passed on

- December 4. Subsequently, the bill was passed in the Lok Sabha on December 18, 2023.
- The Bill maintains that the government will not have any 'exclusive privilege' over conveying letters.
- The Director General of Postal Services, who will head India Post will have the power to decide on matters pertaining to tariff and supply of the postal stamps.
- Moreover, the Bill exempts India Post from any liability for lapses in the postal service. However, the government may intercept an article sent via India Post on grounds of security and public order.

26. India Records 112 Deaths in 2022 from Tiger Attacks

- The Centre informed that in 2022 a total of 112 deaths took place in the country due to tiger attacks.
- In a written reply to Lok Sabha, Union Minister for Forest, Environment and Climate Change Bhupinder Yadav informed that the highest number of deaths is 85 in Maharashtra followed by 11 in Uttar Pradesh.
- He said during the past five years 302 people died in tiger attacks.

27. Lower house of Indian parliament passes 3 criminal law bills, replacing IPC, CrPC, Evidence Act

- The Lok Sabha passed the three crucial bills that will replace a raft of British-era laws after a day-long discussion in the Lower House.
- The Bharatiya Nyaya (Second) Sanhita will replace the Indian Penal Code, the Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha (Second) Sanhita the Code of Criminal Procedure, and Bharatiya Saksha (Second) Bill the Evidence Act, 1872.



- The bills were passed even as 97 opposition MPs remained suspended and away from the all-important proceedings. The three bills were first introduced in the house in August during the monsoon session of the Parliament.
- The Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha (Second) Sanhita will now have 531 Sections, down from the 533 Sections that the first bill had.
- The Bharatiya Sakshya Bill remains unchanged and has 170 Sections. Of these, 23 Sections have been sourced from the Indian Evidence Act.

28. Parliament passes 'Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill, 2023'

- The Lok Sabha passed the Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill, 2023, repealing the Press and Registration of Books Act, 1867.
- The Bill has already been passed by Rajya Sabha in the Monsoon Session.
- It will make the registration of periodicals simple and simultaneous, through an online system without the requirement of any physical interface.
- The title registration proces which sometimes took 2-3 years, would now be done in 60 days

29. Parliament passes 'Telecommunications Bill, 2023'

- The Parliament has passed the 'Telecommunications Bill, 2023' with the approval of Rajya Sabha with amendments.
- The Bill has already been passed by Lok Sabha.
- It has been brought to transform and reform telecom sector, services, and its networks.

- The Bill seeks to amend and consolidate the law relating to the development, expansion, and operation of telecom services.
- The Bill seeks to replace the 'Indian Telegraph Act, 1885'.

30. Central Railway launches safety 'panic button' feature for women passengers

- With a view to strengthen security of women passengers in trains, Central Railway (CR) has introduced 'panic button' system to alert officials in case of an emergency.
- The security feature Red push button installed inside each of the four ladies coach of a local train was launched last week on a trial basis.

31. Union Minister Unveils Commemorative Stamp for AllA Goa's First Foundation Day

- Union Minister of AYUSH Sarbananda Sonowal marked the first foundation day of the All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), Goa by releasing a commemorative postal stamp in New Delhi.
- The satellite centre of AIIA in Goa was dedicated to the nation by Prime Minister Narendra Modi last year. AIIA is a premier centre for Ayurvedic research and treatment.
- The AIIA Goa, spanning a vast 50-acre campus, is meticulously modelled after its counterpart in Delhi. Its mission is to provide advanced preventive, diagnostic, and tertiary healthcare facilities.

32. CISF to replace Delhi Police for security duty of Parliament building complex

 The Union Home Ministry has approved the deployment of the Central



Industrial Security Force (CISF) in the Parliament complex.

- The decision comes days after the December 13 security breach in the Parliament.
- The Delhi Police, however, will continue to provide security outside the parliament building complex.

33. LIC gets time till 2032 to achieve minimum public shareholding norms

- Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC)
 will get time till May 2032 to comply
 with Minimum Public Shareholding
 (MPS) norms prescribed by the
 Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- As of September 30, 2023, the government owns 96.5 per cent in LIC.
 The government divested 3.5 per cent of its shareholding in LIC last year, and accordingly, it got listed on stock exchange.
- Rule 19A of the Securities Contract
 Regulation Rules says every listed
 company, other than a public sector
 company, shall maintain a public
 shareholding of at least 25 per cent.
- Such a company will get three years from the date of listing to ensure MPS.
 Such a provision aims to bring more public as shareholding. The public can be an individual or an institution.

34. Govt extends zero import duty & agri-cess exemption on masur till March 2025

- The government has extended current effective zero import duty on masur dal (lentil) till March 2025 in order to ensure steady supply of the key pulse from international market and keep domestic prices under check.
- However, the government has not extended the current import duty

- structure on three crude edible oils -palm oil, soyabean oil and sunflower oil. India is the world's largest producer and import of pulses.
- According to a finance ministry notification, the exemption of zero import duty on masur as well as agriinfra cess of 10 per cent has been extended till March 2025
- This exemption on masur was valid till March 2024.
- It imported 24.96 lakh tonnes pulses during 2022-23.

35. MHA declares Muslim League Jammu Kashmir, Masarat Alam faction as 'unlawful association'

- The Union Home Ministry declared the Muslim League Jammu Kashmir
 Masarat Alam faction (MUK-MA) as an 'unlawful association' under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (UAPA).
- This organisation and its members are involved in anti-national and secessionist activities in J&K supporting terrorist activities and inciting people to establish Islamic rule in J&K." Union Home Minister: Amit Shah.

36. Government issues notice to nine offshore cryptocurrency platforms for non-compliance under Prevention of Money Laundering Act

- The Financial Intelligence Unit India has issued compliance show cause notices to nine offshore Virtual Digital Assets Service Providers.
- Virtual Digital Assets Service Providers were brought into the ambit of Anti Money Laundering, Counter Financing of Terrorism (AML-CFT) framework under the provisions of the Prevention of



- Money Laundering Act, 2002 in March 2023.
- The nine cryptocurrency exchanges served with the notices are <u>Binance</u>, <u>KuCoin</u>, <u>Huobi</u>, <u>Kraken</u>, <u>Gate.io</u>, <u>Bittrex</u>, <u>Bitstamp</u>, <u>MEXC Global and Bitfinex</u>.
- Digital asset service providers, whether operating within or outside India's borders, and involved in activities such as converting between digital assets and traditional currencies, transferring digital assets, safeguarding or managing digital assets, or utilizing instruments that grant control over digital assets, must undergo registration with the Financial Intelligence Unit India (FIU IND) as a 'Reporting Entity.'
- Additionally, they are obligated to adhere to a specified set of responsibilities outlined in the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) of 2002.
- Financial Intelligence Unit India (FIU-IND) was set by the Government of India vide O.M. dated 18th November 2004 as the central national agency responsible for receiving, processing, analyzing and disseminating information relating to suspect financial transactions.
- FIU-IND is also responsible for coordinating and strengthening efforts of national and international intelligence, investigation and enforcement agencies in pursuing the global efforts against money laundering and financing of terrorism.
- FIU-IND is an independent body reporting directly to the Economic Intelligence Council (EIC) headed by the Finance Minister.

37. Cabinet approves projects worth Rs.5,500 crore for Bihar, N-E

- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs(CCEA) chaired by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi, gave its go ahead to construction of a bridge on Bihar and widening of a road in Tripura entailing an investment of over Rs 5500 crore.
- CCEA approved a 4.56 km-long six-lane bridge over the Ganga connecting Digha and Sonepur in Bihar at a cost of Rs.3064.45 crore.
- The CCEA also approved a Rs.2,486.78 crore project of improvement and widening of 135-km stretch of the national highway from Khowai to Harina in Tripura. Thakur said the project would reduce the distance by 28km and the time taken by half. He said the project would improve connectivity between different parts of the state as well as between Tripura and Assam. The project includes a loan of Rs.1,511.70 crore from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The project is expected to take two years to be completed.
- The CCEA also approved the minimum support price (MSP) for copra for 2024. The MSP for milling copra was increase by Rs.300 per quintal to Rs.11,160 per quintal and for ball copra by Rs.250 per quintal to Rs.12,000 per quintal. Thakur said the MSPs had more than doubled since 2014-2015, when the MSP for milling copra was Rs.5,250 per quintal and ball copra was Rs.5,500 per quintal. He said there had been "record procurement" this season, with more than 1.33 lakh metric tonnes of copra procured at Rs.1,493 crore in total.

38. Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav launches National Transit Pass System

Union Environment Minister Bhupender
 Yadav launched the National Transit



Pass System (NTPS) pan-India to facilitate the seamless transit of timber, bamboo, and other forest produce across the country.

- NTPS is envisioned as a 'One Nation-One Pass' regime that will contribute to the ease of doing business.
- NTPS is designed for user convenience, featuring desktop and mobile

- applications for easy registration and permit applications.
- Presently, 25 States and Union
 Territories have adopted the unified permit system, streamlining interstate business operations for producers, farmers, and transporters.





International

1. COP28 Kicks Off in Dubai with Visionary Leadership and Urgent Climate Appeals

- The 28th Conference of the Parties (COP28) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) commenced in Dubai, marking a pivotal moment in the global fight against the escalating climate crisis.
- World leaders, policymakers, and climate experts from 198 parties have gathered for the two-week conference.

2. India re-elected to International Maritime Organisation with highest vote tally

- In elections held at its assembly for the 2024'25 biennium, India was re-elected to the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) Council with the highest tally.
- India's re-election falls under the Category of 10 states with "the largest interest in international seaborne trade", alongside Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Spain, Sweden, and UAE.
- India secured the large-scale support of the international community at the International Maritime Organisation for India to continue to serve the global maritime domain.
- The International Maritime Organisation (IMO) is the leading authority that regulates the maritime industry, which supports global trade, transportation, and all marine operations.

3. JT-60SA: World's biggest experimental nuclear fusion reactor inaugurated in Japan

 JT-60SA, the world's largest and most advanced nuclear fusion reactor started

- its official operations in Japan's Ibaraki Prefecture.
- JT-60SA is a joint initiative between the European Union and Japan.
- The JT-60SA reactor is a six-storey-high machine, which is kept in a hangar in Naka north of Tokyo.
- It comprises a doughnut-shaped
 "tokamak" vessel set to contain swirling
 plasma heated up to 200 million
 degrees Celsius. JT-60SA is a forerunner
 for its big brother in France, the underconstruction International
 Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor
 (ITER).JT-60SA and ITER both are to
 coax hydrogen nuclei inside to fuse into
 one heavier element, helium, releasing
 energy in the form of light and heat.

4. ADB to provide Rs 250 million to strengthen India's power sector

- The Asian Development Bank has approved a Rs 250 million policy-based loan to strengthen India's power sector by improving financial sustainability and facilitating the shift to renewable energy.
- This policy-based loan will help reduce barriers to scale up commercial financing for clean energy and contribute to India's fulfillment of its climate change mitigation commitment
- The Power Sector Reform Program (Subprogram 1) is the first of a two-part program to strengthen the development of markets for power trade and related ancillary services.
- This will facilitate the integration of intermittent renewable energy given India's target of 50 per cent of its power generation capacity from non-fossil fuel sources by 2030.



- These policy actions will, among others, help accelerate the deployment of solar and other renewable energy technologies, promote the use of renewables in the agriculture sector, and optimize dispatch of power plants to reduce emissions.
- The loan will also enable measures to improve the financial performance, corporate governance, and service quality of electricity distribution companies (DISCOM) and create a conducive environment for private sector investment.
- It will aid in the implementation of an incentive-based results-oriented approach to improving DISCOM performance on parameters including losses, cost recovery, metering and timely payment of dues in order to access government budget support.

5. Akshata Krishnamurthy becomes the first Indian citizen to operate a Mars rover

- Akshata Krishnamurthy is an Indian woman who created history as she became the first person from the country to operate the Mars rover with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in the United States.
- Akshata is a PhD holder from the MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology).
 She is among the few Indians who joined NASA for a full-time opportunity.

6. US Prez nominates Indian American global venture capitalist to IDFC Board

 President Joe Biden has nominated prominent Indian-American global venture capitalist Deven Parekh as a member of the Board of Directors of the International Development Finance

Corporation, a development finance institution and agency of the US government.

- Parekh, the managing director at software investment firm Insight Partners, was nominated for the post last week.
- His nomination will be for a period of three years.
- By statute, the US International Development Finance Corporation (DFC) Board of Directors includes four members recommended to the President from Senate and House leadership.

7. World Radiocommunication Conference 2023 appoints UAE's Mohammed Al Ramsi as Chairman

- United Arab Emirates' Mohammed Al Ramsi has been appointed Chairman of World Radiocommunication Conference 2023 (WRC 23).
- The event is being held in Dubai, UAE, from November 20th to December 15th, 2023.
- WRC is organised by International
 <u>Telecommunication Union (ITU)</u> every
 four years to revise the global use of
 radio-frequency spectrum,
 geostationary-satellite and non geostationary-satellite orbits.
- This year, more than 4,000 government officials and 900 international organisations from 193 countries are attending the conference.

8. Italy withdraws from China's Belt and Road project

 Italy has formally notified China of its withdrawal from Beijing's ambitious belt and road infrastructure initiative (BRI), a



- significant trade and infrastructure project.
- The Italian prime minister, Giorgia
 Meloni, has long been critical of the
 project and had expressed her intention
 to withdraw from the deal, seen by
 many as an effort by China to buy
 political influence. Italy became the only
 G7 nation to join the initiative in 2019.
- The BRI scheme envisions rebuilding the old Silk Road to connect China with Asia, Europe and beyond with vast amounts of infrastructure spending on roads and shipping routes. However, critics see it as a tool for China to spread its geopolitical and economic influence – a state-backed campaign for global dominance.
- China spent \$240bn (£195bn) bailing out countries struggling under their BRI debts between 2008 and 2021, data showed in March this year.
- More than 100 countries have signed agreements with China to cooperate on BRI infrastructure and building projects since the scheme was launched in 2013.

9. The UN peacekeeping mission in Mali ends after 10 years

- The United Nations ended its 10-year peacekeeping mission in Mali following the government's request that alleged the force was inadequate to respond to growing violent extremism in the West African nation.
- The U.N. effort in Mali has been the deadliest peacekeeping mission in the world, with more than 300 personnel killed.
- Mali officially the Republic of Mali, is a landlocked country in West Africa.
- Landlocked Mali has struggled to contain an Islamic extremist insurgency since 2012. Extremist rebels were forced from

power in northern cities the following year with the help of a French-led military operation. But rebels regrouped in the desert and began launching attacks on the Malian army and its allies — which soon included the U.N. force.

10. COP28 concludes with historic agreement to try to tackle the climate crisis

- The United Nations Climate Change conference, COP28, has concluded with a historic agreement to transition away from fossil fuels, triple renewable energy and increase climate finance for the most vulnerable.
- It aims to keep alive the goal of the Paris Agreement to try to limit long-term global average near-surface temperature to 1.5C above the pre-industrial era.

11. Indian-American Medical Student Rijul Maini Crowned Miss India USA 2023

- This year, the Miss India USA pageant was crowned to Rijul Maini, a medical student from Michigan held in New Jersey.
- The 24-year-old Indian-American aspires to be a surgeon and hopes to serve as a role model to women everywhere.
- Meanwhile, Greeshma Bhat of Virginia was declared first runner-up and Ishita Pai Raikar of North Carolina was the second runner up.

12. China launches deepest lab on Earth

- The world's deepest and largest underground laboratory became operational in China, state news agency Xinhua reported
- The report said that the 2,400-metredeep physics laboratory in located in southwest China's Sichuan Province.



- The report mentioned the scientists think that the lab provides a major boost to the global search for dark matter, which is a hypothetical form of matter that appears not to interact with light or the electromagnetic field.
- It is expected that the lab will open up new frontiers in deep-earth experiments as the extreme depth will help the scientists by blocking most cosmic rays that mess with the observation.

13. Noma added to WHO list of neglected tropical diseases

- The World Health Organization (WHO) announced that the gangrenous disease noma has been added to its official list of neglected tropical diseases (NTDs).
- Primarily found in sub-Saharan Africa, noma mainly affects malnourished children between the ages of 2 and 6 years. Poor oral hygiene, malnutrition, weakened immune systems, and extreme poverty are among the risk factors.

14. Amongst the leaders in gender equality, Finland awards International prize to Aghanistan-based NGO

- Finland, awarded the International Gender Equality Prize for 2023 to an NGO in Afghanistan that works to promote and protect the rights of women in Afghanistan.
- The organisation Afghan Women Skills Development Center does important humanitarian work to promote the safety of Afghan women.

15. Kuwait's new emir Sheikh Mishal takes oath of office

 Kuwait's new emir, Sheikh Mishal al-Ahmad al-Sabah, has been formally

sworn in before parliament to begin his rule.

- The new emir, took over after the passing of his half-brother, Sheikh Nawaf al-Ahmad al-Sabah.
- The 83-year-old Sheikh Mishal is Kuwait's third ruler in just over three years.

16. Over 1 mn Afghan children facing severe malnutrition, says WHO chief

- The World Health Organisation (WHO)
 has said that over one million children in
 Afghanistan are facing severe
 malnutrition.
- As per WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus the country needs \$ 185 million to fight against malnutrition.
- He also wrote on X that 30 per cent of the total Afghanistan population faces acute food insecurity.

17. UN announces 2024 as International Year of Camelids

- The UN has designated 2024 as the International Year of Camelids.
- Camels, llamas, alpacas, vicuas and guanacos are an important source of livelihood for millions of families - most of them pastoralists - in dryland and mountainous rangeland ecosystems around the world.
- The Year is meant to raise the public's and policymakers' awareness of the significant role of camelids.
- The resolution for the International Year of Camelids, proposed by the Government of Bolivia and presented by Ecuador as Country Chair of the Group of Latin American and Caribbean Countries (GRULAC), was approved by the UN General Assembly on 17 October 2017



upon recommendation by FAO (Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN).

18. Angola quits OPEC over oil production quotas disagreement

- Angola says it will leave the
 Organization of the Petroleum
 Exporting Countries (OPEC) over a
 disagreement regarding production
 quotas, a move that will bring the group
 down to 12 members.
- Angola, which first joined OPEC in 2007, has struggled to meet production quotas over the past several years.
- The country is joining others, such as Qatar and Ecuador, that have left OPEC.
- OPEC Headquarters: Located in Vienna, Austria.
- Angola is one of the largest oil exporters in Sub-Saharan Africa, alongside Nigeria.
- Founded in 1960, the 13-member OPEC cartel in 2016 partnered up with 10 other producers to form OPEC+ to gain more clout.
- Without Angola, OPEC countries will produce about 27 million barrels of oil per day, about 27 percent of the global supply.

19. Pakistan successfully tests Fatah-II guided multi-launch rocket system

- Pakistan's military wing Inter-Services
 Public Relations (ISPR) claimed it had
 successfully conducted the flight test of
 Fatah-II, a guided multi-launch rocket
 system (MLRS).
- Equipped with state-of-the-art avionics and navigation system, Fatah-II is capable of engaging targets with high precision up to a range of 400 kilometres.

20. BRICS group to double in 2024 after Saudi, Iran, UAE, Egypt, Ethiopia join ranks

- The BRICS club of emerging market countries is expected to double on January 1st when Saudi Arabia, Iran, the United Arab Emirates, Ethiopia and Egypt join the group.
- In August 2023, the current members of the group Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa invited six other countries to join them.
- Argentina formally rejected invitation to join BRICS.
- The newly elected President of Argentina, Javier Milei decided not to join the BRICS bloc of developing economies, saying that the timing for Argentina's membership in the bloc is not opportune.



Sports

1. Ruturaj Gaikwad becomes the fastest Indian to 4,000 T20 runs

- Ruturaj Gaikwad has become the fastest Indian to accomplish 4,000 runs in men's T20 cricket.
- He achieved the feat in the fourth T20I against Australia at the Shaheed Veer Narayan Singh International Stadium in Raipur.
- The 26-year-old only needed seven runs to achieve 4,000 runs in the shortest format of the game.
- Eventually, India posted 174/9 from their 20 overs.

2. R Vaishali becomes grandmaster, joins R Praggnanandhaa to become world's first brother-sister GM duo

- Indian chess ace R Vaishali joined younger sibling R Praggnanandhaa to become the world's first-ever brothersister Grandmasters duo and only the third woman from the country to earn the GM title, at the IV El Llobregat Open in Spain.
- Vaishali achieved the feat after crossing 2500 ELO rating points.
- She is the country's 84th GM.

3. India bags 3 gold, 5 silver and 1 bronze medals in IBA Junior World Boxing Championship

- On the last day of IBA Junior World Boxing Championship 2023, India bagged three gold, five silver and one bronze medals in Yerevan, Armenia.
- Akansha won gold in 70 kg category, Pari clinched gold medal in 48 kg weight category, while Nisha won gold in 52 kg category. In 52 kg weight category, Vini

- won silver medal, while Srishti Sathe won silver medal in 63 kg weight
- In the boys' category, Jatin won the silver medal in the 54 kg category.
 While Hardik Panwar in 80 kg category, Ameesha Kereta in the 54 kg category and Prachi Tokas in the 80 kg weight category had to settle for silver medals only.

4. Jimmy George Award for Sreeshankar

- Olympian M. Sreeshankar, the long jump silver medallist in the Commonwealth Games and Asian Games, has won the 35th Jimmy George Foundation Award for the best sportsperson of Kerala.
- The award carries a cash prize of Rs 1 lakh and a plaque.
- The award will be presented to Sreeshankar at the Jimmy George Sports Academy at Peravoor, Kannur, on December 22.

5. Men's Volleyball Club World Championship to begin in Bengaluru

- FIVB (Fdration Internationale de Volleyball) Men's Volleyball Club World Championship 2023 will commence at the Koramangala Indoor Stadium in Bengaluru .
- This is the first time that the prestigious tournament will be held in India.
- The five-day tournament will see six teams compete for the top honours.
- Prime Volleyball League Season 2 champions, Ahmedabad Defenders, will become the first Indian team to feature in the competition.
- The Defenders qualified for the Club World Championship after winning the Prime Volleyball League earlier this year.



 Setter Muthusamy Appavu will lead the Defenders. The top two teams in the group stages will qualify for the semifinals on December 9, and the final will be played on December 10.

6. Italy Wins Admiral's Cup 2023 Held At Indian Naval Academy

- The 12th edition of 'Admiral's Cup'
 Sailing Regatta concluded with a
 glittering closing ceremony at Ettikulam
 Beach at Indian Naval Academy (INA),
 Ezhimala, Kannur, Kerala.
- Team Italy represented by Midshipman Avallone Antonio & Midshipman Creati Carlo Leonardo won the Admiral's Cup 23.
- Team India represented by Midshipman PPK Reddy and Cadet GY Reddy was the Runners-Ups.

7. First-ever Khelo India Para Games begins in New Delhi

- The first-ever Khelo India Para Games kicked off today in New Delhi. More than 1,400 participants from across 32 states and Union Territories including Services Sports Control Board are participating in the 8-day event.
- Youth Affairs and Sports Ministry has said that athletes participating in the Khelo India Para Games will receive comprehensive medical coverage. The Ministry said that the medical coverage includes emergency medical services, on-site medical teams and access to necessary healthcare facilities.

8. Jaspreet Kaur shines with a gold; Yogesh Kathuniya adds to Haryana's tally

 Jaspreet Kaur won the paralifting gold medal in the elite 45kg category with an

inspired effort of 85kg at the Khelo India National Para Games.

- The girl from Punjab stood head and shoulders above the rest of the field, even as Sapna Shah from Gujarat took silver with 47kg.
- Sonam Patil of Maharashtra won bronze, with her best of 40kg.

9. Badminton pair Satwiksairaj-Chirag selected for Khel Ratna

- India's premier badminton men's doubles pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty is in line to receive the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award, the country's highest sports prize. The pair has had a remarkable year, reaching as many as six finals, winning five.
- They won at the Asian Games, Asian Championships, Swiss Open, Indonesia Open and Korea Open.

10. Antim Panghal named UWW Rising Star of the Year

- Two-time World under-20 champion and senior Worlds bronze medallist Antim Panghal (53kg) has been named United World Wrestling (UWW) Rising Star of the Year 2023 in women's section.
- Antim won a silver in her senior Asian championships debut, defended her U-20 World title and then won bronze at the World championships.
- The medal in Belgrade made the 19year-old the youngest Indian to win a medal at the World Championships.
 Soon after, Antim traveled to Hangzhou for the Asian Games and won a bronze medal at 53kg.



11. Hardik Pandya to captain Mumbai Indians in IPL 2024, Rohit Sharma's 10-year-reign comes to an end

- In a momentous development, Mumbai Indians have appointed the returning Hardik Pandya as their captain for the IPL 2024 season, taking over the reins from Rohit Sharma after a 10-year stint as skipper.
- Hardik, who led Gujarat Titans to IPL crown in 2022, was traded back to MI after two years. Rohit, along with MS Dhoni, has won the title most times for his franchise ' five.

12. Khelo India Games to be held in Tamil Nadu in January, 2024

- Khelo India Games will be held in Tamil Nadu in January next year. The State Government said that the games will be held in Chennai, Coimbatore, Madurai and Trichy from 19th to 31st January, 2024.
- More than 5,500 sports persons and over 1,600 coaches are expected to participate in the event. More than 1000 referees and 1200 volunteers will be part of the sporting event.
- For the first time, squash will be included in Khelo India games.

13. Aryna Sabalenka, Novak Djokovic named as 2023 ITF World Champions, pair achieve special feat

- Novak Djokovic and Aryna Sabalenka were honored by the International Tennis Federation as the 2023 ITF World Champions.
- The pair were the only singles players who managed to reach at least the semifinals of all four Grand Slam events this year.

- This is Djokovic's eighth ITF World
 Champion award, which is also a record.
 He finished the year as ATP No. 1 for a
 record-extending eighth time, where he
 bagged the Australian Open, French
 Open and US Open, which also took his
 majors' total to a men's leading 24. He
 was also runners-up at the Wimbledon
 and led the men's tour with seven titles.
- This is the first time Sabalenka has received this honour. She won the Australian Open this year, which was also her first Grand Slam title. She was runners-up at the US Open, and also made it to the semifinals of the French Open and Wimbledon. She also made her debut at No. 1 in the WTA rankings in September this year and finished the year at No. 2, behind Iga Swiatek.

14. Paes, Amritraj become first Asian men to be inducted into International Tennis Hall of Fame

- Former doubles world No. 1 Leander
 Paes and broadcaster and promoter
 Vijay Amritraj of India have become the
 first Asian men to be inducted into the
 International Tennis Hall of Fame.
- Besides the duo, renowned journalist and writer Richard Evans have also been elected in the Ultimate Honour in Tennis.
- Paes, an 18-time Grand Slam champion in doubles and mixed doubles, has been selected in the player category, while Amritraj and United Kingdom's Evans are inductees in the contributor category, which is considered for election every two years. The contributor category recognises true pioneers, visionary leaders, or individuals/groups who have made a transcendent impact on the sport.

- The triumph capped off one of the most dominant campaigns in Indian domestic cricket history, with Haryana being unbeaten throughout the competition.



19. IPL Auction 2024: Mitchell Starc becomes most expensive player

- Mitchell Starc of Australia emerged as the most expensive player in the history of the Indian Premier League (IPL) at the auction in Dubai.
- He was bought by Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) for '24.75 crore, breaking the record of Pat Cummins who was picked up for '20.5 crore by Sunrisers Hyderabad.

20. Maharashtra bags women's and AAI wins men's title events in Guwahati

- In team events of the 75th Inter State-Inter Zonal Badminton Championship 2023, Maharashtra bagged women's and Airport Authority of India (AAI) won the men's title events in Guwahati
- The prestigious national championship organized by Badminton Association of India is being held in Assam after four years.
- The dominant AAI team appeared in both the men's and women's team finals and managed to win the title in the men's category as they outclassed Karnataka 3-0.
 In the women's team event final, Maharashtra dominated AAI 3-0 with impressive displays from Shruti Mundada, Alisha Naik and the doubles pair of Simran Singhi and Ritika Thaker

21. Kiyana, Harsh win gold in Asian Youth Chess Championships

 Two Indian youngsters, Kiyana Parihar (U-8 Girls) and Harsh Suresh (U-16 open) won gold medals in the 25th Asian Youth Chess Championships (Classical), held at Al Ain Convention Centre in UAE.

- Kiyana had also bagged the silver medal in the Asian U-8 Girls rapid chess championship held last week.
- Three Indians, AS Sharvaanica (U-8 Girls), Aarit Kapil (U-8 Open) and G Tejaswini (U-18 Girls), won silver medals in their respective classical championships, while Aadya Ranganath won a bronze in the U-10 girls category.
- AS Sharvaanica, who had bagged two gold medals earlier in the 25th Asian Youth festival in U-8 Girls rapid and U-8 girls blitz categories, became the only player to win medals in all three (blitz, classical and rapid) categories.
- The Soviet players, who played under the FIDE flag, reigned supreme by winning four gold, four silver and two bronze medals while China bagged two gold, one silver and one bronze medals.
- India had bagged nine medals, including four gold (Bhagyashree Patil U-18 girls, Sapariya Ghosh U-14 girls, A S Sharvaanica U-8 girls and Muhammad Shyan Ibrahim U-8 Open), in the Asian Youth Rapid Chess Championships held December 13.
- The Asian Blitz Chess Championships held on December 17 saw three Indian girls -- V C Nivedita (U-12 girls), Pratitee Bordoloi (U-10 girls) and A S Sharvaanica -- win the gold medals for the country.

22. Women's Cricket: India achieve historic feat with maiden Test victory over Australia in one-off match in Mumbai

 India recorded their maiden victory against Australia in a women's test match at Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai on 24 December 2023 with their comprehensive eight-wicket win in the one-off contest. This is India's first victory against Australia in 11 tests since



- the teams first clashed in the longest format in 1977.
- India had taken control of the match with a commanding 187-run lead in the first innings. They needed just 75 runs to win the match after bowling Australia out for 261 in the second innings. India reached the target just after lunch losing two wickets.

23. Anmol Kharb wins women's singles title at National Badminton Championships in Guwahati

- In Badminton, Anmol Kharb has won the women's singles title at the National Badminton Championships 2023 in Guwahati. The teenager lost the first game of the final to Tanvi Sharma but fought back to level the score. The men's singles title clash saw an upset as the unseeded Chirag Sen secured the national title after defeating fourth-seed Tharun M.
- In the mixed doubles summit clash, Dhruv Kapila and Tanisha Crasto defeated the sixth-seeded duo of Nitin Kumar-Navdha Manglam 21-13, 21-8 to claim their maiden national title.
 Priya Devi Konjengbam and Shruti Mishra lifted the women's doubles title with a win over Ritika Thaker-Simran Singh.
 The men's doubles final was an edge-of-the-seat thriller where K Pruthvi Roy-Suraj Goala caused an upset by defeating Krishna Prasad Garaga-Vishnuvardhan Goud Panjala.

24. Former South Africa captain Dean Elgar announces retirement from international cricket after India series

 Former South Africa captain Dean Elgar has announced his retirement from

- international cricket after a test series against India concludes early next month. Elgar, who has scored more than 5,000 runs with 13 centuries in his 84 tests, will play his final test at Newlands in Cape Town starting January 3.
- Elgar made his debut against Australia in Perth in 2011, making a duck in each innings in an inauspicious start to his 12year test career, which has yielded 5,146 runs, including a high score of 199 against Bangladesh in 2017.
- He is South Africa's eighth highest scorer in tests.
- Elgar was elevated to captain in March 2021, replacing Quintin de Kock, and led the Proteas to series wins in the West Indies and at home against India, and a draw in New Zealand.


25. Indian Olympic Association forms 3member ad hoc panel to run WFI

The project will involve nongovernmental organizations in implementing and monitoring the livelihood activities.

22. RIL ropes in DBS Bank for compressed biogas push

- In its push for adoption of greener energies, Reliance Industries has tied up with DBS Bank India to set up a financing program for farmers and aggregators for the management of crop residue that will be used to produce compressed biogas (CBG).
- The conglomerate, which is aggresively pursuing opportunities in non-fossil

- fuels, is also working on the generation of CBG touted as an alternative to CNG and other fossil fuels. Farmers usually burn agriculture residue since they don't have the means, the infrastructure and the logistics required to process them.
- DBS has been roped in as the finance partner for this.
- RIL has already started on a massive program to set up biogas facilities across the country starting with Barabanki in Uttar Pradesh. This plant is expected to reduce carbon emissions by 40,000 tonnes annually.
- The plan is to set up about 100 CBG plants across the country over the next five years. This would help in consuming more than 5.5 million tons of agricultural residue and organic waste, leading to 2 million tons reduction in carbon emissions annually.
- The company is setting up biogas facilities at multiple locations in UP by using surplus agro residue and organic waste.

- These multi-role state-of-the-art vessels will be indigenously designed, developed, and manufactured by the MDL.

33. SBI signs Rs 1,300 cr LoC with World Bank for rooftop solar projects

- The State Bank of India (SBI)said it has signed a \$165 million (over Rs 1,300 crore) Line of Credit (LoC) with the World Bank for promoting rooftop solar projects in the country.
- Earlier this week, SBI signed a 200
 million euro (about Rs 1,800 crore) LoC
 with the European Investment Bank (EIB)
 for supporting climate action projects.

34. Nabard and ADB jointly launch climate action initiative with tech support from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation

- The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) has teamed up with the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to help the farming sector tackle the adverse impact of climate change.
- The two organisations, in association with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, will tap climate capital to fund agricultural, natural resources and rural development (ANR) initiatives.

35. Maruti Suzuki signs MoA with Haryana government to set up second JIM

- Maruti Suzuki India (MSIL)said it has signed a memorandum of agreement (MoA) with the government of Haryana to set up second Japan-India Institute for Manufacturing (JIM), at Kansala, in Rohtak.
- Spread over five acres, the existing ITI Kansala will be upgraded to a JIM with an investment of '5.8 crore as a CSR activity of the company.

36. JSPL Tie-Up With RINL To Secure Supply Of Liquid Steel To Upcoming Angul Plant

- Jindal Steel Power Ltd said its partnership with Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Ltd will ensure the supply of liquid steel to its upcoming hot strip mill at Angul in Odisha.
- JSPL said it has entered into a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with RINL for the operationalisation of the latter's blast furnace-3 (BF-3). JSPL Managing Director (MD): Bimlendra Jha.
- The blast furnace BF-3 at the RINL plant in Visakhapatnam has been closed since January 2021.
- The restart of the BF-3 is planned for Dec. 30, 2023, at a capacity of 2 lakh tonnes of hot metal per month.
- Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Ltd (RINL), under the Ministry of Steel, is among the top six steel manufacturing companies in India.
- There are three blast furnaces of 2.5 million tonne (MT) each at its plant in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh.
- JSPL will provide working capital support or raw material supply of Rs 800-900 crore under a pact signed between the companies.

37. Coca-Cola extends partnership with ICC till 2031

- The Coca-Cola Company and International Cricket Council (ICC) have signed an agreement at the latter's headquarters extending the partnership till end of 2031, becoming a brand having the longest association with the cricket body.
- In 2019, the Atlanta-based beverage major had entered into a four-year partnership with ICC covering major events.



38. Reliance Jio joins hands with IIT Bombay to launch Bharat GPT, to bring OS for smart TVs

- Jio is set to launch its new AI project Bharat GPT, in a joint venture with Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay.
- Jio is planning to introduce its Al project across all the segments of its company, stretching across all the sectors of the society. Ambani said that the next 10 years will be defined by large-language models and generative Al.

39. ONDC partners with Google, Meta to reach small businesses

- Ministry of commerce-backed ecommerce protocol Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) announced two separate partnerships with Google and Meta, to expand its outreach to small businesses through Google Maps and WhatsApp.
- This, in turn, will help the service scale up its net transactions per month among consumers and large enterprises alike.
- With Google Maps, ONDC is onboarding the Kochi Metro as a mobility service on its platform. Users can make ticket bookings for the metro service directly in Google Maps, through the ONDC framework.
- For Meta, ONDC is being integrated into WhatsApp, where small businesses will be able to streamline their onboarding process on the framework. The move will also form a key part of Meta's focus on monetizing its India market in 2024

40. HDFC Life and NKGSB Co-Operative Bank announce corporate partnership

41. PNGRB, World Bank studying pathways for transmission of Hydrogen via gas pipelines

- The Petroleum and Natural Gas
 Regulatory Board (PNGRB) has joined
 hands with the World Bank and
 initiated a study to develop pathways
 for transmission of Hydrogen in natural
 gas pipelines both on its own and as
 Hydrogen blended with Compressed
 Natural Gas (CNG).
- Under the initiative of National Green Hydrogen Mission, the Government of India has taken significant steps.
- The study comprises of mapping demand and supply of Hydrogen, Technical Assessment of the existing pipeline network for its compatibility, commercial assessment of the pipeline sector, identifying bottlenecks in of policy and regulatory framework and framing of roadmap milestones till 2040 for expeditious implementation of Hydrogen-blending in India.

42. India, Russia ink pacts on construction of future power units of Kudankulam nuclear plant

 India and Russia have decided to expand their civilian nuclear cooperation, with Moscow willing to share technology for a small modular reactor used in power generation, even as both sides are pushing towards the completion of Phase 1 the of 6,000MW



Kudankulam nuclear power project in Tamil Nadu.

- The small modular reactors have a power generation capacity of 75MW to 300MW.
- The small modular reactors these are advanced nuclear reactors — have a power generation capacity of 75MW to 300MW.
- The Kudankulam nuclear power plant, India's largest, is being built in Tamil Nadu with the technical assistance of Russia. The construction began in March 2002.
- Since February 2016, the first power unit of the Kudankulam NPP has been steadily operating at its design capacity of 1,000 MW. The plant is expected to start operating at full capacity in 2027, according to Russian state media.

43. Centre, Assam sign peace pact with ULFA faction

- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), the Assam government and the pro-talks faction of the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) signed a memorandum of settlement.
- The ULFA was born during the antiforeigners movement of 1979 demanding a sovereign State for the Assamese people after several Bengali speaking people crossed over to India post 1971.

Schemes

1. The Government of India has disbursed over 2.60 Lakhs Crore rupees to more than 11 Crore farmers under the PM-KISAN scheme

- The government has introduced Face recognition and Aadhaar identification based eKYC of farmers to ensure transparency in the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme (PM-Kisan).
- To ensure good governance and transparency in direct benefit transfer to farmers, a new eKYC has been initiated after the release of the 13th PM-Kisan fund.
- The Government of India has disbursed over 2.60 Lakhs Crore rupees to more than 11 Crore farmers under the PM-KISAN scheme.
- In the scheme, an amount of six thousand rupees is transferred annually in three equal instalments of two thousand rupees directly into the bank accounts of the farmers.
- The PM-KISAN Scheme was launched in February 2019 to provide financial assistance to all cultivable landholding farmer families across the country.

2. Government to set up subsidised staple food stores at Delhi Metro Stations

- The central government will make available kitchen essentials such as onion, pulses and atta at subsidised prices to consumers by opening retail stores at major metro stations in the national capital this month.
- If the project is successful, it plans to extend it to other cities like Mumbai, Chennai and Bengaluru which have metro rail networks, the official said.
- Elevated prices of food essentials wheat, rice, pulses, sugar, onions - is a

- major concern for the union government, which will face voters in the general elections in April-May 2024.
- The first store will be opened at Central Delhi's Rajiv Chowk metro station, to tap into the high footfall it receives. It will be owned and operated by National Cooperative Consumers' Federation of India Ltd.
- NCCF an organisation that procures agricultural commodities like food grains, pulses, spices, oil seeds, pharmaceutical items and other consumer goods on behalf of the government and sells to consumers at reasonable rates.

3. Finance ministry gave Rs 10,000 crore advance for MGNREGS from contingency fund: Govt

- The finance ministry has provided Rs 10,000 crore as advance for the rural employment guarantee scheme from Contingency Fund of India, over and above the budgetary allocation of Rs 60,000 crore.
- Financial allocation of Rs 60,000 crore was made for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) for the financial year 2023-24 at budget estimate stage.
- The MGNREGS is a flagship scheme aimed at enhancing livelihood security of households in rural areas of the country by providing at least 100 days of guaranteed wage employment in a financial year to every household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work.



4. DARPG launches Scheme and Web-portal for National Awards for e-Governance 2024

- The Web-portal (http://www.nceg.gov.in) for National Awards for e-Governance (NAeG) 2024 has been launched on 8th December, 2023.
- The formal launching was organised by the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG).
- The Central Ministries / Departments as well as the Principal Secretaries (AR) and (IT) and the DCs/DMs of all the 28 States and 8 UTs of India as well as Award Winners of NAeG 2023 were invited for the launch ceremony in hybrid mode.

5. Railways withdraws emergency cashless treatment scheme

- The Indian Railways has withdrawn the Cashless Treatment Scheme in Emergency (CTSE), a medical facility which benefitted a few lakh serving and retired employees and their dependent family members across the country.
- A pilot project for providing cashless treatment during emergencies in private Railway-empanelled hospitals was initially launched in metro cities in 2016. Later the ambit of the scheme was expanded across the railway network facilitating serving and retired employees and their dependent family members to avail treatment in private hospitals during emergencies.

6. Indian Forest & Wood Certification Scheme launched to promote Sustainable Management of forests and agroforestry

 The Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change has launched the Indian Forest & Wood Certification Scheme.

- This national forest certification scheme offers voluntary third-party certification designed to promote sustainable forest management and agroforestry in the country.
- About the Scheme:
- The scheme includes forest management certification, tree outside forest management certification, and chain of custody certification.
- The Indian Forest and Wood Certification Scheme can provide market incentives to various entities that adhere to responsible forest management and agroforestry practices in their operations.
- This includes state forest departments, individual farmers, or Farmer Producer Organizations engaged in agroforestry and farm forestry, as well as other woodbased industries in the value chain.
- The Forest Management certification is based on the Indian Forest Management Standard, consisting of 8 criteria, 69 indicators and 254 verifiers, which is an integral part of the National Working Plan Code 2023, launched earlier this year.
- A separate Trees Outside Forests
 Standard, is now introduced as a part of the newly launched Indian Forest & Wood Certification Scheme.
- The Indian Forest and Wood Certification Scheme, will be overseen by the Indian Forest and Wood Certification Council, which will act as a multistakeholder advisory body.
- The Council is represented by members from eminent institutions such as Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education, Forest Survey of India, Quality Council of India, Indian Institute of Forest Management including representatives from the Ministries of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and



Ministry of Commerce and Industry, State Forest Departments, Forest Development Corporations, and representatives from wood-based industries.

- Indian Institute of Forest Management, Bhopal will act as the scheme operating agency and will be responsible for overall management of the Indian Forest and Wood Certification Scheme.
- The National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies under the Quality Council of India will accredit the certification bodies which will carry out independent audits and assess adherence of various entities on the standards prescribed under the scheme.

7. Atal Pension Yojana (APY) enrolments crosse the 6 crore mark

- The total enrolment under the Atal Pension Yojana (APY) has crossed 6 crore, with over 79 lakh enrolments in the current Financial Year.
- The APY, a flagship social security scheme of the Government of India, was launched on 9th May 2015 to provide old age income security to Indian citizens, with a particular focus on the poor and workers in the unorganized sectors.
- The Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA), in the recent past, has taken several initiatives for awareness creation of the scheme including the release of a one-page simple APY flyer/handout in Hindi, English, and 21 regional languages.
- Under the APY, the subscriber is eligible to get triple benefits, as guaranteed by the Govt. of India, i.e. lifelong monthly pension of Rs. 1,000 to Rs. 5,000 from the age of 60 years, depending on their

- contributions, which itself would vary based on the age of joining the APY.
- The same pension would be paid to the spouse of the subscriber after the demise of the subscriber and on the demise of both the subscriber and spouse, the pension wealth as accumulated till age 60 of the subscriber would be returned back to the nominee.

8. 69% of the total 44.46 crore loans sanctioned under Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, have been sanctioned to women

- As on 24.11.2023, out of total 44.46 crore loans sanctioned under Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), 30.64 crore (69%) have been sanctioned to women.
- PMMY was launched on 08.04.2015 to provide collateral free institutional credit to Small/ Micro enterprises for income generating activities.

9. PMBJP achieves generic medicines sales of Rs 1,000 crore this year

- The government said the Pradhan
 Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana
 (PMBJP) achieved a landmark of selling generic medicines worth Rs 1,000 crore this year.
- A total savings of about Rs 5,000 crore was made by people who purchased medicines from the Jan Aushadhi Kendras, which is present in more than 785 districts across the country, an official release said.
- Govt has set a target to open 25,000
 Janaushadhi Kendras across India by
 March 2026.



10. MSME Ministry launches 3 sub-schemes under RAMP programme; makes ZED scheme free for women

 MSME Minister Narayan Rane launched three sub-schemes under the ministry's existing RAMP ((Raising and Accelerating MSME Productivity) programme to encourage the adoption of sustainable technology in business, boost the circular economy and address delayed payments issue.

The MSME Green Investment and

- Financing for Transformation Scheme

 (MSE GIFT Scheme) will help enterprises adopt green technology with interest subvention and credit guarantee support while the MSE Scheme for Promotion and Investment in

 Circular Economy (MSE SPICE Scheme) is the first-ever scheme in the government to support circular economy projects which will be done through credit subsidy and support MSME sector towards zero emissions by 2070, the ministry said in a statement.
- The third scheme <u>MSE Scheme on</u>
 Online Dispute Resolution for Delayed Payments, said ministry, is a first-of-its-kind scheme to synergise legal support with modern IT tools and artificial intelligence in order to address the issue of delayed payments for micro and small enterprises.
- The key objectives of RAMP are to accelerate centre-state collaboration in MSME promotion and development, enhance the effectiveness of existing schemes of the MSME Ministry for technology upgradation, strengthen the receivable financing market for MSMEs, enhance the effectiveness of CGTMSE, promote guarantee for greening initiatives of MSEs and women-owned MSEs, and

- reduce cases of delayed payments to MSEs.
- Moreover, the <u>ZED scheme</u> of the ministry, which aims to promote manufacturing without any negative impact on the environment, has now been made completely free for womenled MSMEs. In addition, the government will guarantee payment of 100 per cent financial support for the certification cost under the scheme.

11. Union Minister Smriti Irani inaugurates National Programme on Anganwadi-cum-Crches in New Delhi

- Women and Child Development Minister Smriti Irani inaugurated National Programme on Anganwadi-cum-Crches in New Delhi.
- Government has planned to open 17 thousand creches all around the country and urged states and districts officials to identify groups of women construction workers and women farm labourers who can take advantage of the initiative.

12. Rajasthan and Andhra Pradesh have commissioned higher capacity under solar park scheme

- Rajasthan and Andhra Pradesh ' have deployed higher capacities through the solar park scheme.
- The <u>Scheme for 'Development of Solar Parks and Ultra Mega Solar Power Projects'</u> was rolled out in December 2014 with an aggregate capacity of 20,000 MW.
- Further, the capacity of the Solar Park Scheme was enhanced to 40,000 MW in March 2017 to set up at least 50 Solar parks. The timeline of the scheme is up to 2023-24.
- Objective of the Scheme :



- The objective of this scheme is to provide land and transmission to RE developers on a plug-and-play basis. i.e, the infrastructure such as land, roads, power evacuation system water facilities are developed with all statutory clearances/approvals. Thus, the scheme helps expeditious development of utilityscale solar projects in the country.
- The capacity of the Solar Parks is generally 500 MW and above. However, smaller parks (up to 20 MW) are also considered in States/UTs where there is a shortage of non-agricultural land. It is estimated that 4-5 acres per MW of land is required for setting up of solar parks
- Under the solar park scheme, the Union Ministry of New and Renewable Energy provides Central Financial Assistance (CFA) of up to '25 lakh per solar park for the preparation of a Detailed Project Report (DPR). Besides this, CFA of up to '20 lakh per MW or 30 per cent of the project cost, including grid-connectivity cost, whichever is lower, is also provided for achieving the milestones prescribed in the scheme
- The total Central Grants approved under the Scheme is '8,100 crore. Solar Energy Corporation of India & Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA) implement the scheme and also handle the funds being made available under the scheme.

13. PMKVY Trains 1.4 Crore Candidates, Announces India Skills 2023-24

- The Government has said that nearly one crore 40 lakh candidates have been trained so far under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) since its launch in 2015.
- The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship said, PMKVY aims to

- provide avenues for the Indian youth to access short-term skilling opportunities.
- Under the Skill India Mission, MSDE launched its flagship scheme, Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) on 15 July 2015.
- PMKVY 4.0 (FY 2023-26) was announced in the last Union Budget 2023-24 with an aim to skill lakh of youth and provide training in courses on Industry 4.0, AI, robotics, mechatronics, IoT and drones.
 PMKVY 4.0 has received the approval of EFC and the same has been submitted for the approval of the cabinet.
- However, the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance has granted approval for the release of funds under PMKVY 4.0 based on the Expenditure Finance Committee (EFC) Memorandum with the condition of early approval of the scheme from the Cabinet.

The broad design principles of PMKVY 4.0 are:

- Customized courses with high employability and duration up to 210 hours.
- ii. The scheme aims to synergize vocational and educational streams and increase the network of quality training providers by increasing partnerships of educational institutions termed Skill Hubs.
- iii. Skill Hubs can be set up in Central and State Government Schools, Higher Educational Institutes (HEIs), Colleges and Universities (including Skill Universities) with requisite infrastructure for providing Shortterm Training under PMKVY.
- iv. Skill Training is being imparted through Skill India Centres in Educational Institutes, Government



- Institutions, PMKKs, ITIs, JSSs, IITs, IIMs and others
- v. Focus is given on skilling in Futuristic/New Age job roles pertaining to Industry 4.0, Web 3.0, AI/ML, AR/VR, Drone Technology etc
- vi. Skill courses will be selected as per industry demand, largely mapped in the district Skill Development Plan.
- vii. Special Projects for identified areas and groups in agriculture, handicraft and high-end courses.
- viii. Skill India Digital to be a singlepoint enrolment and provide a platform for candidate training life cycle

14. Jal Jeevan Mission Achieves 72% Rural Tap Water Coverage, Eyes 100% In 2024

- Under Jal Jeevan Mission, approximately 72% of rural households now have access to tap water connections, according to official data.
- In 2024, the Jal Shakti ministry faces the crucial target of achieving the 100% coverage of tap water connection to every rural household -a commitment made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2019. Nine states and Union Territories have already achieved 100% coverage.

15. PLI schemes attracted over Rs 95,000 cr investment till Sep 2023: Centre

 The production-linked incentive (PLI) schemes for 14 sectors have attracted over Rs 95,000 crore in investment till September this year, an official statement said.

- According to the Commerce and Industry Ministry, as many as 746 applications have been approved till November 2023 under these schemes.
- In the Union Budget 2021-22, the government announced an outlay of Rs 1.97 trillion for the schemes.
- The sectors included electronics, telecommunication, pharma, white goods (AC and LED light components), and textiles. The aim is to enhance India's manufacturing capabilities and exports.
- It added that of the USD 101 billion worth of total electronics production in 2022-23, smartphones constituted USD 44 billion, including USD 11.1 billion as exports.
- Import substitution of 60 per cent has been achieved in the telecom sector and India has become almost self-reliant in Antennae, GPON (Gigabit Passive Optical Network) and CPE (Customer Premises Equipment).
- About PLI in the white goods (AC and LED light components), it said that 64 companies have been selected under the scheme.
- Out of this, 34 would invest Rs 5,429 crore for air conditioner components and 30 would invest Rs 1,337 crore for LED component manufacturing.

16. Women account for approximately 49% of the total Ayushman cards created, says Health Ministry data

- Women account for approximately 49% of the total Ayushman cards created and approximately 48% of total authorised hospital admissions, noted data released by Health Ministry.
- Ayushman cards are made under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri-Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY), which



- provides health cover of '5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation.
- Currently as per government figures 55 crore individuals corresponding to 12 crore families are covered under the scheme and many states and union territories implementing AB PM-JAY
- have further expanded the beneficiary base, at their own cost.
- Government data further revealed that as of December 20, 2023, approximately 28.45 Crore Ayushman Cards have been created since the inception of the scheme, out of which, approximately 9.38 crore Ayushman Cards have been created during the year 2023.

- 1991-batch Indian Forest Service Officer of Madhya Pradesh cadre Kanchan Devi has been appointed as the Director General (DG) of the Indian Council of Forestry Research Education (ICFRE)

1. All-India House Price Index Moderates To 3.4% In Q2 FY24: RBI Data

- The all-India House Price Index (HPI) moderated to 3.4% in the July-September quarter of 2023-24 from 4.5% in the year-ago period, according to data released by the Reserve Bank of India. The RBI releases HPI-based on transaction-level data received from the registration authorities in 10 major cities.
- The cities are Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Chennai, Delhi, Jaipur, Kanpur, Kochi, Kolkata, Lucknow, and Mumbai.
- "All-India HPI growth (year-on-year)
 moderated to 3.4% in Q2:2023-24 from
 5.1% in the previous quarter and 4.5% a
 year ago; annual growth in HPI varied
 widely across the cities ranging from
 the high growth of 6.5% (Chennai) to a
 contraction of 0.2% (Jaipur),".
- On a sequential (quarter-on-quarter)
 basis, all-India HPI contracted by 1.2% in
 the second quarter of 2023-24; seven of
 the 10 cities witnessed price increase in
 housing registration during the latest
 quarter.

2. In 2022, India accounted for 66% of malaria cases in WHO South-East Asia Region: World Malaria Report

- In 2022, India accounted for 66% of malaria cases in the WHO South-East Asia Region noted the new ' 2023 World Malaria Report ' published by the World Health Organization (WHO).
- It adds that almost 46% of all cases in the region were due to Plasmodium vivax, which is a protozoal parasite and a human pathogen, which is the most

- frequent and widely distributed cause of recurring malaria.
- Released earlier this week, the report highlights that despite strides in expanding access to insecticide-treated nets and medicines to help prevent malaria in young children and pregnant women, more people were getting sick with malaria.

3. Nandan Nilekani, Nikhil Kamath On Forbes Asia Heroes Of Philanthropy List

- Nandan Nilekani, co-founder of Infosys Ltd., KP Singh, chairman emeritus at DLF Ltd., and Nikhil Kamath, co-founder of Zerodha, have been named on the 17th edition of Forbes Asia's Heroes of Philanthropy list.
- The unranked list "highlights business leaders who are donating from their fortunes and giving personal time and attention to their select causes", Forbes said in a press release.
- The annual list, which spotlights 15
 philanthropists, does not include
 corporate philanthropy except for
 privately-held companies where the
 individual is a majority owner.
- As per Forbes, Nandan Nilekani, cofounder and chairman of tech giant Infosys, have made it to the list for donating Rs 320 crore (\$38 million) to his alma mater IIT Bombay in June.

4. Crime against women: 4.45 lakh FIRs filed in 2022, almost 51 every hour. Delhi tops

 According to the annual crime report of the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), Delhi registered the highest rate of crime against women in the country in 2022.



- The national capital recorded 14,247 cases in 2022 with a rate of 144.4 (per lakh), which was way above the national average of 66.4.
- The crime against women in the national capital stood at 14,277 in 2021 and 10,093 in 2020.
- The NCRB data revealed that Uttar Pradesh registered 65,743 crime against women FIRs in 2022 followed by Maharashtra 45,331, Rajasthan 45,058, West Bengal 34,738 and Madhya Pradesh 32,765.
- These five states together contributed 50.2% (2,23,635 cases) of the total cases lodged in the country in 2022

5. India's emission intensity reduced by 33% between 2005 and 2019: Govt report

- India reduced its GDP emission intensity by 33 per cent between 2005 and 2019, achieving the target 11 years in advance, according to a government report.
- The report also said India's GDP grew at a cumulative annual growth rate of 7 per cent but its emissions rose by only 4 per cent per year during this period.
- The country has been successful in decoupling its economic growth from planet-warming greenhouse gas emissions.

6. India Ranks 49th In World Digital Competitiveness Ranking Among 64 Economies: Report

 India ranked 49th in the world digital competitiveness ranking (WDCR), among the 64 economies marking its significance in cybersecurity knowledge, according to the International Institute for Management Development (IMD) report.

- The report said the ranking also underlined India's lack on the fronts like technology and future readiness.
- It stressed the leading economies in this year's ranking are akin to "digital nations," implying countries that actively promote the comprehensive integration of digital technologies, encompassing AI, across governmental, corporate and individual spheres.
- IMD found that in the Asia-Pacific region, India's position slipped to the 12th spot among the 14 countries, after being 11th for the last four consecutive years.
- On the other hand, among the 27
 nations with a population of more than
 20 million, India ranked 18th, falling two
 positions compared to last year, it
 added.
- Shedding light on India's knowledge in the cybersecurity space the report emphasised that the country has improved on parameters like talent, training and education, but retreated on a sub-factor of scientific concentration.
- Graduates in sciences and R&D productivity by publication emerged as the top strengths.
- Additionally, in terms of technology, India stood at the 50th spot as enforcing contracts, wireless broadband, and internet users were the biggest weaknesses, while investment in telecommunications, along with IT and media stock market capitalisation proved as the biggest strengths for the company.

7. Kolkata Is The Safest City With Least Crime Rate For Third Year In Row: NCRB

 For the third year in a row, Kolkata has been declared as the safest city in India with least number of cognisable offences per lakh population, according



to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) 2022 data.

- In 2022, Kolkata recorded the least number of cognisable offences per lakh population -- 86 cases per lakh people.
- The city has witnessed a drop of 16 per cent in cases as compared to last year.
 According to the NCRB 2021 data, the city recorded 103.4 cases of cognisable offences per lakh people. The rankings were decided after comparing Kolkata against 18 other cities that have a population of over two million.
- According to the latest NCRB data, based on cases recorded and shared by the state governments to the Centre, the metropolitan city was followed by Maharashtra's Pune, with 280.7 cases per lakh people and Telangana's Hyderabad with 299.2 cases per lakh people, PTI reported.

8. Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan report highest urban unemployment in July-September

- According to data released by the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) of the National Sample Survey Office, Himachal Pradesh topped the urban unemployment chart with 33.9%, followed by Rajasthan with 30.20% among the age group of 15 to 29 years during July-September 2023, against the national average of 17.3% of the same age group during the period.
- Rajasthan registered 39.4% of urban female unemployment in the quarter as against 27.2% in males, the PLFS data revealed.
- Jammu & Kashmir also reported a high urban unemployment rate of 29.8% in the age group.
- Unemployment was high among females at 51.8% in the quarter compared to

19.8% among males in the July-September quarter.

9. Solar power potential of 75,000 GW by 2050 possible with long-duration storage: Report

- Solar power generation capacity can go up to 75,000 gigawatts by 2050 globally with long-duration storage capacity, a report by the International Solar Association (ISA) and LDES Council, said.
- The report, presented at COP28 in Dubai, emphasized the transformative potential of combining solar energy with LDES to ensure continuous, reliable, and affordable renewable energy.
- The report emphasized the necessity of LDES to fully realize the potential of solar installations for complete decarbonization and achieving a solar capacity of 75,000 GW by 2050.
- It presented a case study of isolated island utilities in the US, demonstrating the financial viability of LDES in areas with limited interconnectivity and high local fuel costs. The combination of solar, wind, and LDES emerges as the most cost-effective solution for achieving 100 percent renewable energy.
- The LDES Council estimates that LDES will become a USD 4 trillion industry by 2040, with an installed capacity potential of 8 TW, the statement said.
- This growth is essential for enabling solar energy to meet global electricity demands affordably and reliably.
- The report also identified barriers to the widespread adoption of solar and LDES, including regulatory challenges, financing issues, and technical limitations, and proposed solutions to overcome these hurdles.



10. Hal, Bel And Mazagon Docks Psus Among World's Top 100 Arms Producing Companies: SPIRI REPORT

- According to a SIPRI report, sales of arms and military services by the 100 largest armament companies in the world reached \$597 billion in 2022. Geopolitical tensions and the Russian invasion of Ukraine fuelled increased demand for weapons globally.
- Indian defence PSUs Hindustan
 Aeronautics, Bharat Electronics, and
 Mazagon Docks are among the top 100
 arms-producing companies.
- The US dominates the list, but its revenues fell by 7.9%. Asian arms companies, including those in China and India, benefited from sustained government investment in military modernization reported

11. India set to become 3rd largest economy by 2030, GDP to be around 7% in 2026-27: S&P Global Ratings

- India is set to become the world's third largest economy by 2030, S&P Global Ratings said in its latest report. It said that the nation's GDP growth would be around 7 per cent in 2026-27 fiscal year.
- In its Global Credit Outlook 2024, S&P predicted a 6.4 per cent GDP growth in the fiscal year year through March 2024 as compared 7.2 per cent in the previous financial year This would mean that India will surpass Japan and Germany

12. India ranks 7th in Climate Change Performance Index

 India has been placed 7th in this year's Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI).

- The country improved one rank from the previous one, and also remained among the highest performers.
- According to a report released during the global climate conference (COP-28) in Dubai, India maintained its top 10 position for the fifth year in a row.
- The Index evaluates the climate mitigation efforts of 63 countries and the European Union, covering over 90 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- China, the largest polluter came in at number 51 while the US, the second biggest emitter came in at number 57.
- India's past performance in the CCPI ranking shows significant improvement from 31st rank in 2014 to seventh in 2023.

13. ITC becomes world's 3rd most valuable tobacco company after London-based BAT sinks

- Diversified conglomerate ITC, with a market cap of \$67 billion (Rs 5.6 lakh crore), surpassed British American Tobacco Plc (BAT) to become the third most valuable tobacco company in the world.
- London-based BAT, which sells cigarettes, tobacco, and other nicotine products, has seen a sell-off in its shares in the past week, rendering its market cap below ITC to \$64 billion.
- US-listed Philip Morris International and Altria Group currently occupy the top spots above ITC as the two most valuable tobacco companies in the world. The evolving stricter regulations and growing awareness of health risks have been squeezing tobacco companies' traditional business lately, driving declines in cigarette volumes in some markets.



14. Bengaluru tops in acid attacks against women in 2022, followed by Delhi and Ahmedabad, reveals NCRB data

- Bengaluru witnessed the highest number of acid attacks against women in the country in 2022, with the city police registering six cases, according to the latest report released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB)
- Among the 19 metropolitan cities listed in the NCRB data, Bengaluru recorded eight women falling prey to acid attack last year, followed by Delhi with seven women, and Ahmedabad recorded five cases, according to NCRB.

15. Adani Green Energy ranked second-largest global solar PV developer: Mercom

18. Myanmar surpasses Afghanistan as world's largest source of opium

- Myanmar has surpassed Afghanistan to become world's largest source of opium in 2023 after a third consecutive year of expanding cultivation fueled by the country's civil war, the United Nations said in a new report.
- After the Taliban imposed a ban on drugs in 2022, opium cultivation in Afghanistan decreased by 95%, leading to a global shift in the opium supply to Myanmar.

19. RBI report: State's finances improved for the second consecutive year

- The report mentioned that the improvements by the state in their finances in the financial year 2021-2022, were sustained even in the current financial year 2022-2023.
- The State's combined gross fiscal deficit (GFD) stood at 2.8 percent of the gross domestic product (GDP).
- This figure is below the budget estimate for the second consecutive year.
- The States anticipate prudent fiscal management for 2023-24, with the consolidated GFD budgeted at 3.1 percent of GDP. The implementation of goods and services tax (GST) has led to increased tax buoyancy for the states," the report said. The state's total outstanding liabilities are budgeted to be

at 27.6 percent of GDP for 2023-24, from 31 percent in 2020-21

20. Presence of Indian banks via subsidiaries increased to 417 in FY23: RBI

- Indian banks increased their overseas presence through the subsidiaries route to 417 during 2022-23, from 399 at the end of the preceding fiscal, as per Reserve Bank data released.
- Their employee strength, too, rose 0.5 per cent and 6.2 per cent for foreign branches and subsidiaries, respectively, during 2022-23.
- The survey covers 14 Indian banks having overseas branches or subsidiaries and 44 foreign banks having branches or subsidiaries in India.
 On the other hand, the number of branches and employees of foreign banks in India contracted during 2022-23 to 774 from 858 in 2021-22.

21. For the 6th time, Hyderabad emerges as the best city to live in India

- For the sixth time, Hyderabad has raced ahead of all its competitors to be crowned as the best Indian city to live in, according to the Mercer's Quality of Living (City Ranking) survey, 2023.
- The factors that pushed it to the top are political stability, healthcare, education, infrastructure, and socio-cultural environment.
- Prior to Covid-19 pandemic, Hyderabad had won this Mercer recognition five times in a row between 2015 and 2019. And while its global ranking slipped a few places this time - from 143 in 2019 to 153 in 2023 - it still stayed ahead of all other Indian cities like Pune (154), Bengaluru (156), Chennai (161), Mumbai (164), Kolkata (170), and Delhi (172).



22. Pune breaks record: 3,066 parents read stories to their children for four minutes

- The Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC)'s event of 'parents telling story to their child' has made it to Guinness Book of World Records with 3,066 parents simultaneously telling stories to their children for four minutes.
- The earlier record of 2,479 parents simultaneously telling stories to their children was held by China.
- The event was a part of the Pune Book Festival, organised by the National Book Trust from December 16 to 24 on the grounds of Fergusson College, aimed to inculcate reading habits in children.

23. Developing nations spent record high on debt in 2022 says World Bank

- Developing countries spent nearly half a trillion dollars to service their external public and publicly guaranteed debt in 2022, draining funds from critical health, education and climate needs, and putting the poorest countries at increasing risk of "tumbling into a debt crisis," the World Bank said
- In its latest International Debt Report, the bank said the debt-service payments - including principal and interest - rose 5% to a record \$443.5 billion from a year earlier amid the biggest surge in global interest rates in four decades. It said the payments could shoot 10% higher in 2023-2024.
- The 75 poorest countries were hardest hit, said the report, now in its 50th year. Their external public debt service payments reached a record \$88.9 billion in 2022 and would surge by 40% over the 2023-2024 period. Their interest payments alone had quadrupled since 2012 to \$23.6 billion, it said.

 The World Bank and other multilateral creditors, helped fill the gap, providing a record \$115 billion in new financing for developing countries in 2022, the report said.

24. Shah Rukh Khan named top Asian celebrity in the world for 'saving' Bollywood

- Shah Rukh Khan has clinched the top spot in the "Top 50 Asian Celebrities In The World" list for 2023.
- Published by the UK-based Eastern Eye newspaper, the list sees Khan outshining global stars from cinema, television, music, arts, literature and social media.
- His blockbuster hits, Pathaan and Jawan, along with the much-anticipated Dunki, have played a pivotal role in reviving the Hindi cinema industry.

25. With \$10 b in 4 years, TN ranks fourth in attracting FDI

- Cumulative Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) inflow in to Tamil Nadu has touched nearly \$10 billion in the last four years from the period between October 2019 and September 2023.
- Tamil Nadu ranks fourth in attracting
 FDI in the period between Oct 2019 and
 September 2023, after Maharashtra,
 Karnataka and Gujarat--but a distant
 fourth. The tiny states of Haryana and
 Telangana are close behind Tamil Nadu.
- With the Tamil Nadu Global Investors
 Meeting scheduled to take place on
 January 7 and 8, 2024 in Chennai, the
 State government hopes to attract more
 investment to the State.

26. Hyderabad ranked 1st in food adulteration cases: NCRB

 Hyderabad has ranked first in the country for food adulteration cases,



according to the data released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).

Telangana stands second, closely followed by Andhra Pradesh.

 In 2022, a total of 291 cases of food adulteration were reported across 19 major cities in India.

27. IndiGo makes history, becomes first Indian airline to carry 100 million passengers a year

- IndiGo, India's preferred carrier has created history by becoming the first Indian airline to carry 100 million passengers in a single calendar year. With this achievement, it has joined a select club of global carriers to operate on such a scale.
- This development further cement IndiGo's standing among the 10 largest airlines in the world by passenger traffic.

28. UP now second-largest economy in India

- In a major milestone achieved by the Yogi Adityanath government, Uttar Pradesh has emerged as the second largest economy of India after Maharashtra in terms of gross domestic product (GDP) share.
- In the context of GDP share, UP has outpaced states such as Tamil Nadu (9.1 per cent), Gujarat (8.2 per cent) and West Bengal (7.5 per cent).
- States like Karnataka (6.2 per cent),
 Rajasthan (5.5 per cent), Andhra Pradesh
 (4.9 per cent) and Madhya Pradesh (4.6 per cent) are significantly behind UP.

30. Union Minister Bhupender Yadav launches a NITI Aayog report, 'A Green and Sustainable Growth Agenda for the Global Economy'.

 In a collaborative effort, NITI Aayog, in partnership with International Development Research Centre (IDRC) and Global Development Network (GDN), published a report, 'A Green and Sustainable Growth Agenda for the Global Economy' based on the proceedings of the G20 international conference held in New Delhi on 28-29 July 2023, featuring 40 leading experts from 14 countries.

31. Delhi, followed by Bangalore and Mumbai lead India's crypto adoption: Report

- A report by crypto trading platform CoinSwitch showed Delhi maintained its lead in India's crypto adoption, followed by Bangalore and Mumbai.
- The parameter for this was in terms of value invested:Delhi (9 per cent),
 Bangalore (8 per cent) and Mumbai (5 per cent). Ghaziabad claimed the 10th position in the list of the top invested cities, replacing Patna.

32. India Skills Report finds Kerala the most preferred State to work

- Kerala is the most preferred state to work for employable talent in the country, with Kochi being the top choice among Indian cities for female job aspirants, according to the 'India Skills Report 2024', released by talent assessment firm Wheebox in partnership with organisations including Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) and All India Council for Technical Education.
- Kerala pushed Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh to the second and third spots respectively to emerge on top in the category.
- While Kochi was the top choice for female job seekers, Thiruvananthapuram was the third preferred destination. For male employable talent, Kochi and



- Thiruvananthapuram were the third and fifth choices respectively among cities in the country.
- For both male and female job seekers combined, Kochi and Thiruvananthapuram figured in the second and fourth positions respectively.
- As per the report, Kerala was second in terms of 'highest employable resources in the 18-21 years age group'.
 "Telangana has the highest concentration of employable talent in the age group of 18-21 with 85.45% found employable followed by Kerala with 74.93% employable resources in this age group," it said.
- Thiruvananthapuram clinched the third spot among cities in the 'highest employable resources in the 18-21 years age group' category. "Among top cities with employable talent in the age group of 18-21, Pune came first with 80.82% of candidates found highly employable, followed by Bengaluru with 72.18% and then Thiruvananthapuram with 67.22% employable in this age group," the report pointed out.

33. PV Sindhu makes it into Forbes list of highest paid women athletes in 2023

- Badminton star PV Sindhu has made it into the list of 2023's highest paid women athletes by Forbes where she finished at the 16th spot alongside gymnast Simone Biles with her \$7.1 million earnings. Last year Sindhu was placed 12th with her \$7.1 million earnings in a list which was led by Japanese tennis star Naomi Osaka.
- The list is being headed by Polish tennis star Iga Swiatek who is valued at \$23.9 million. She won the French Open and

- ended the year as the No.1 ranked player in the world.
- She is followed by freestyle skiing star Eileen Gu from China whose value is \$22.1 million. Tennis player Coco Gauff comes in at 3rd with \$21.7 million while the same sports' UK's Emma Raducanu (\$15.2 million) Japan's Naomi Osaka (\$15 million), Belarus's Aryna Sabalenka (\$14.7 million), US's Jessica Pegula (\$12.5 million), US's Venus Williams (\$12.2 million), Kazakhstan's Elena Rybakina (\$9.5 million) and Canada's Leylah Fernandez (\$8.8 million) close out the top 10.

34. Banks log 12.2% growth in FY23, gross bad loans down for 5th year: RBI report

- The consolidated balance sheet of scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) expanded in 2022-23 by 12.2%, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said in its Report on Trend and Progress of Banking in India 2022-23, released on December 27. The expansion was driven by credit to retail and services sectors, the report said. Deposit growth also rose; this, however, trailed credit growth.
- According to the report, higher net interest income and lower provisioning drove net interest margin (NIM) and profitability higher in 2022-23. The improvement in asset quality of banks, which started in 2018-19, continued during 2022-23, the report showed.
- Number of frauds reported in April-September FY24 doubled on an annual basis to 14,483 from 5,396 seen in the same period last year, the report said. However, the amount involved in the frauds reduced from Rs 17,685 crore to Rs 2,642 crore, it added.




The key highlights of the report are:

- The capital to risk weighted assets ratio (CRAR) of SCBs was 16.8 per cent at end-September 2023, with all bank groups meeting the regulatory minimum requirement and the common equity tier 1 (CET1) ratio requirement.
- The improvement in asset quality of banks that began in 2018-19 continued during 2022-23 and H1:2023-24, with gross non-performing assets (GNPA) ratio at 3.2 per cent at end-September 2023.
- Higher net interest income and lower provisioning boosted net interest margin (NIM) and profitability in 2022-23.
- The combined balance sheet of urban co-operative banks (UCBs) expanded by 2.3 per cent in 2022-23, driven by loans and advances. Their capital buffers and profitability improved through 2022-23 and Q1:2023-24.
- The consolidated balance sheet of non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) expanded by 14.8 per cent in 2022-23, led by double digit credit growth. Profitability and asset quality of the sector also improved in 2022-23 and in H1:
- 2023-24, even as the sector remained well-capitalised with CRAR higher than the regulatory requirement.

- Number of complaints recieved under the RB-IOS by consumers increased by 68.2 per cent in 2022-23.
- This report is a statutory publication in compliance with Section 36 (2) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949. It showcases the performance of the banking sector, including cooperative banks and NBFCs.

35. India 15th in top 25 AI nations but has 'greatest upward potential'

- India may be 15th among the top 25
 Artificial Intelligence nations, but it has the 'the greatest upward potential' according to research by Tufts
 University's business school, the Fletcher School.
- At the top is the US, followed by China, fighting for global leadership in AI followed by the UK, Japan, and Germany.
- In15th spot, India is ahead of Brazil, Argentina, Indonesia, Mexico, Turkey & Thailand.





Important Days

1. World AIDS Day | 1 December

- Each year, on 1 December, the world commemorates World AIDS Day. People around the world unite to show support for people living with HIV and to remember those who have died from AIDS-related illnesses.
- World AIDS Day 2023, theme 'Let communities lead".
- According to WHO reports, Globally, 9.2 million people do not have access to the HIV treatment that they need. Each day 1700 lives are lost from HIV-related causes, and 3500 people are infected, with many not knowing their status or having access to treatment.

2. International Day For the Abolition of Slavery | 2 Dec

- The International Day for the Abolition of Slavery, 2 December, marks the date of the adoption, by the General Assembly, of the United Nations Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others (resolution 317(IV) of 2 December 1949).

9. International Day Of Neutrality | 12 December

- International Day of Neutrality is commemorated on December 12 every year to raise awareness regarding the importance of neutrality in intergovernmental relations and to strengthen peace and security at the global level.

- A constitutional body that falls under the Government of India, the Bureau of Energy Efficiency assists in the development and implementation of strategies and policies to reduce excessive consumption of energy. The committee also executed 'The Energy Conservation Act' in 2001.

11. Vijay Diwas, marking India's triumph over Pakistan in 1971 war, being celebrated

- It also includes punishment against misleading advertisements, false product descriptions, or any kind of guarantee of products and services. The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) will impose fines and penalties against the companies for such false and misleading advertisements.

 Turkey, the United Kingdom, the United
 States, and the European Union.
- GPAI has a Council and a Steering
 Committee, supported by a Secretariat
 hosted by the OECD, and two Centres of
 Expertise: one in Montreal (CEIMIA, the
 International Centre of Expertise in
 Montreal for the Advancement of
 Artificial Intelligence) and one in Paris (at



INRIA, the French National Institute for Research in Digital Science and Technology). Currently, GPAI has four working groups on the themes of Responsible AI, Data Governance, the Future of Work, and Innovation and Commercialization.

 India is a founding member of GPAI, having joined initiative on June 15, 2020

- Moreover, the conference will deliberate on the role of Buddhist followers to become a Buddhist in the 21st century.



Science & Technology

1. ISRO Unveils XPoSat: India's Pioneering X-Ray Polarimeter Satellite

- India is gearing up to launch its inaugural, as announced by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO).
- The mission aims to delve into the polarisation of intense X-Ray sources.
- The XPoSat spacecraft is set to orbit in Low Earth Orbit at an altitude of approximately ~650 km and a low inclination of around six degrees. It will be carrying two scientific payloads. These payloads enable simultaneous studies of temporal, spectral, and polarisation features of bright X-Ray sources.
- The mission's primary objectives include measuring X-Ray polarisation in the 8-30 keV energy band and conducting longterm spectral and temporal studies of cosmic X-Ray sources in the 0.8-15 keV energy band. With an anticipated mission life of five years, XPoSat's payloads will observe X-Ray sources during the spacecraft's transit through Earth's shadow, particularly during eclipse periods.
- The primary payload, POLIX (Polarimeter Instrument in X-rays), developed by the Raman Research Institute (RRI) in Bengaluru with support from various ISRO centres, is designed to measure the degree and angle of polarisation in the medium X-ray energy range.
- The secondary payload, XSPECT (X-ray Spectroscopy and Timing), developed by the U.R. Rao Satellite Centre (URSC), ISRO, will provide spectroscopic information within the 0.8-15 keV energy range.
- The XPoSat mission is scheduled to be launched by the Polar Satellite Launch

Vehicle (PSLV) from the Satish Dhawan Space Center in Sriharikota.

2. Aurobindo Pharma Gets USFDA Nod for HIV Drug

- Aurobindo Pharma has received approval from the U.S. health regulator to market a generic medication for the treatment of human immunodeficiency virus infection. The company has received final approval from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration to manufacture and market Darunavir tablets in strengths of 600 mg and 800 mg.

5. Researchers of IISER Bhopal conduct maiden genome-sequencing of Jamun plant to study its medicinal value

- The Indian Institute of Science
 Education and Research (IISER) Bhopal
 has completed the first-ever genome
 sequencing of the Jamun plant,
 scientifically called 'Syzygium cumini'.
- The Jamun plant is known for its medicinal properties, fruits, and ornamental value.

 the research team sequenced the S.cumini genome from the world's largest tree genus Syzygium using Oxford Nanopore and 10x Genomics sequencing technologies to understand the genomic and evolutionary basis of the plant's medicinal values.

6. IBM releases first-ever 1,000-qubit quantum chip

- IBM has unveiled the first quantum computer with more than 1,000 qubits ' the equivalent of the digital bits in an ordinary computer.
- For years, IBM has been following a quantum-computing road map that roughly doubled the number of qubits every year.
- The chip unveiled called Condor, has 1,121 superconducting qubits arranged in a honeycomb pattern. It follows on from IBM's other record-setting, birdnamed machines, including a 127-qubit chip called Eagle, released in 2021 and a 433-qubit one called Osprey, announced last year.

Quantum computers promise to perform certain computations that are beyond the reach of classical computers. They will do so by exploiting uniquely quantum phenomena, such as entanglement and superposition, which allow multiple qubits to exist in multiple collective states at once.

But these quantum states are also notoriously fickle, and prone to error. Physicists have tried to get around this by coaxing several physical qubits ' each encoded in a superconducting circuit, say, or an individual ion ' to work together to represent one qubit of information, or 'logical qubit'



7. Breakthrough Nutraceutical 'AKTOCYTE' by the Department of Atomic Energy Set to Transform Cancer Care

 successfully tested a novel, 3D-printed
 RDRE for 251 seconds (or longer than
 four minutes), producing more than

12. Aditya-L1: India's first solar mission to reach destination, 1.5 million km from Earth, says ISRO

- ISRO Chairman S Somanath has announced that Aditya-L1 will arrive at the Lagrangian point L1 on January 6.
- This point is 1.5 million km away from Farth.
- Launched from Sriharikota on September 2, India's first solar mission will perform an important manoeuvre upon reaching L1.
- Once it is successfully placed on L1 point, it will be there for the next five years, gathering all the data which are very important not for India alone but for the entire world.
- The spacecraft will study solar upper atmospheric dynamics, chromospheric and coronal heating, physics of the partially-ionised plasma, initiation of the coronal mass ejections, and flares. It will also observe the in-situ particle and plasma environment providing data for the study of particle dynamics from the Sun, magnetic field topology and magnetic field measurements in the solar corona.

13. Lupin Gets USFDA Nod For Generic Loteprednol Etabonate Ophthalmic Suspension

approval from the U.S. health regulator to market its generic Loteprednol Etabonate ophthalmic suspension indicated for temporary relief of seasonal allergic conjunctivitis. 14. Bengal researchers discover plant-growth promoting bacteria, name it after visionary Tagores


- A group of researchers from Visva-Bharati University's botany department have discovered a bacteria capable of boosting plant growth and named it 'Pantoea Tagorei' after Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore.
- The bacteria has immense potential to revolutionise agricultural practices, microbiologist Bomba Dam, assistant professor at the varsity's botany department said.
- In 1906, Rabindranth Tagore, who would become India's first Nobel Prize winner seven years later, sponsored three young men from Santiniketan to study agriculture and dairy farming at the University of Illinois in the USA.
- The Nobel Prize in Literature 1913 was awarded to Rabindranath Tagore "because of his profoundly sensitive, fresh and beautiful verse, by which, with consummate skill, he has made his poetic thought, expressed in his own English words, a part of the literature of the West"

15. IIT-M develops 3D-printed faces for black fungus survivors

- Researchers with the prestigious Indian Institute of Technology-Madras (IIT-M) have developed 3D-printed face implants for people suffering from Black Fungus, whose numbers have increased post Covid-19 pandemic.
- This new technology is expected to help patients with Black Fungus from



- economically-weaker sections due to its affordability.
- Black Fungus, also known as
 Mucormycosis, has been found in
 patients who tested positive for Covid 19, those with HIV/AIDS, uncontrolled
 diabetes, and other medical conditions
 and loss of facial features is one of the
 effects of the disease. Reconstructive
 surgery was considered as the most
 viable solution for people with Black
 Fungus, but many poor people weren't
- able to access the treatment due to its high cost.
- IIT-M has partnered with ZorioX
 Innovation labs, a start-up founded by Dental Surgeons in Chennai, to implement this initiative, which is based on metal 3D printing or additive manufacturing. While ZorioX Innovations Labs takes part in the surgical procedures, the IIT-M handles the design and 3D printing.





Defence

1. Cochin Shipyard launches 3 anti-submarine watercrafts for Indian Navy

- The first three ships in the series of eight Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts under construction in Cochin Shipyard Limited for Indian Navy were launched at CSL's Kochi Yard.
- The first three ships in this series should bear the name 'INS Mahe, INS Malvan and INS Mangrol upon commissioning into the Indian Navy.
- Contract for building eight ASW SWC ships was signed between Ministry of Defence (MoD) and Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL, on April 30, 2019. The Mahe Class of Ships will replace the in-service Abhay class ASW Corvettes of Indian Navy and are designed to undertake antisubmarine operations in coastal waters, Low Intensity Maritime Operations (LIMO) and Mine Laying Operations including subsurface surveillance.

2. India Approves Defence Acquisition Projects Worth Rs 2.23 Lakh Crore

- India has accorded an initial approval to defence acquisition projects worth Rs
 2.23 lakh crore that included procurement of 97 Tejas light combat aircraft and 156 Prachand combat helicopters, in a major move to significantly enhance the combat capabilities of the armed forces.
- The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, cleared the projects, at a time India is locked in a bitter military standoff with China at a number of friction points in eastern Ladakh for over three years.

- As per the defence ministry, 98 per cent of the total procurement worth Rs 2.23 lakh crore will be sourced from the domestic industries and that the move will give a substantial boost to the Indian defence industry in achieving the goal of 'Aatmanirbharta' (self-reliance) in defence industry.
- The DAC also approved a proposal of the Indian Air Force to upgrade its Su-30 fighter fleet by state-run aerospace major Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL).
- The DAC further accorded Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) or initial approval for procurement of two types of anti-tank munitions namely area denial munition (ADM) type-2 and type-3.
- 3. Defence Ministry Inks Rs 2,956 Crore Contract With BHEL To Procure 16 Super Rapid Gun Mount For Navy
 - The defence ministry sealed a Rs 2,956 crore deal with state-run Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd to procure 16 upgraded super rapid gun mount (SRGM) and accessories for Indian Navy.
 - The SRGM is a medium caliber antimissile and anti-aircraft defence weapon system that provides a sustained rate of fire and high accuracy.
 - The ministry said the upgraded SRGMs will be installed onboard Indian Navy's in-service and newly built ships.
 - "The Ministry of Defence has signed a contract with M/s Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL), Haridwar on Nov. 28 for procurement of 16 Upgraded Super Rapid Gun Mount (SRGM) along with associated equipment/accessories for Indian Navy under Buy (Indian) category at a total cost of Rs 2956.89 crore.



4. Indian Army's initiatives for employment to youth of Jammu and Kashmir, conducts twoday Job Fair in Srinagar

- Indian Army's initiatives for employment to youth of Jammu and Kashmir, Indian Army conducted a two-day Job Fair in Srinagar during last two days. The Job Fair was held at Chinar Nau Jawan Club, Boniyar. It attracted nearly 2500 youth of J&K for nearly 600 job vacancies.
- The event was organized in close cooperation with the Directorate of Employment, J&K which brought together employers from the Union Territory and outside, allowing the candidate to seek jobs in different sectors like agriculture & farming, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry and Handlooms.

5. Indian Navy Day | 4 December

- Indian Navy Day is celebrated every year on 4 December.
- Indian Navy Day holds a special place in the hearts of Indians and they celebrate it with great pride and valour.
- This special occasion is observed to celebrate "Operation Trident.
- It is important to note that the operation was launched by the Indian Navy against the Karachi Harbour during the war between India and Pakistan in 1971.
 They celebrate this day grandly.
- Indian Navy Day came into existence after a significant event during the Indo-Pak War of 1971. It is important to note that the war lasted from 3 December to 16 December, and it led to the formation of the independent nation of Bangladesh.

6. GRSE delivers largest ever survey vessel 'INS Sandhayak' to India Navy

- Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) Limited has delivered by the INS Sandhayak, the largest survey vessel ever built in India and the first in the series of four Survey Vessels (Large) being built by it, to the Indian Navy.
- GRSE has partnered with the Indian Navy for the last 62 years after delivery of the first indigenously-built INS Ajay in 1961
- The INS Sandhayak is the lead vessel in a series of four Survey Vessels (Large) or SVLs and is actually the reincarnation of another ship by that name.
- That ship also a survey vessel was commissioned into the Indian Navy in 1981 and decommissioned in 2021. The new INS Sandhayak and the remaining ships of the series are far more advanced than their predecessors that have all been decommissioned.
- These survey ships are capable of fullscale coastal and deep-water hydrographic survey of port and harbour approaches as well as the determination of navigation channels and routes.
- In addition, the Sandhayak-class of SVLs
 can undertake surveys of maritime limits
 and collection of oceanographic and
 geographical data for defence
 applications. Such data adds muscle to
 India's maritime capabilities. These ships
 can also carry a helicopter each,
 participate in low-intensity combat and
 function as hospital ships. They can also
 be used for Humanitarian Assistance and
 Disaster Relief operations.

7. INS SUMEDHA - Mission Deployed At Antsiranana, Madagascar

As part of Indian Navy's Long Range
 Mission Based Deployment, Indian Naval
 Ship Sumedha is undertaking port call at



- Antsiranana, Madagascar from 04 to 06 December 2023.
- The visit is aimed at reinforcing Indian Navy's commitment to enhance Maritime Security, building bridges of friendship and strengthening maritime co-operation with Madagascar.

8. INS Vikramaditya, INS Vikrant to be deployed for Milan-2024

- The Indian Navy has planned to deploy both its aircraft carriers INS Vikramaditya and INS Vikrant on the eastern seaboard during Milan-2024, a flagship international naval exercise hosted by Vizag from February 19-27 next year.
- Navies from the US, Japan, Australia, France, Bangladesh, South Korea, Vietnam, Indonesia and Malaysia are set to be among the participating nations

9. Indian Navy conducts bi-annual exercise 'Prasthan' off Mumbai coast

- The exercise, which is conducted every six months, was held on the R12A (Ratna) Platform of Oil & Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) around 83 km away from Mumbai harbour.
- The 'Prasthan' is conducted to validate measures and procedures to address various contingencies that may arise in the oil production platforms and was held in two phases.
- The Indian Navy, in conjunction with the Indian Air Force, deployed its antisabotage teams to neutralise security threats in the affected oil platform.

10. INDIAN ARMED FORCES CONTINGENT REACHES HANOI FOR JOINT MILITARY EXERCISE 'VINBAX-2023'

 The Indian Armed Forces contingent comprising 45 personnel reached Hanoi,

- Vietnam to take part in the fourth edition of Joint Military Exercise VINBAX-2023.
- The exercise will be conducted at Hanoi, Vietnam from 11th to 21st December 2023.
- Exercise VINBAX was instituted in 2018 and the first edition was conducted at Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh.

11. Defence Ministry approves Rs 2800 crore rockets for Pinaka weapon system

- In a major boost for the Indian Army, the Defence Ministry has approved a Rs 2,800 crore proposal for buying around 6,400 rockets for Pinaka multi-barrel rocket launcher systems.
- The Defence Ministry's Defence
 Acquisition Council's recent meeting had
 cleared the proposal for the acquisition
 of two types of these rockets, known as
 Area Denial Munition Type 2 and Type-3.
- The rockets would be procured by the Indian Army from indigenous sources only and two main contenders include the Economic Explosives Limited of Solar industriesand the Munitions India Limited-- one of the ammunitionproducing companies created by the corporatisation of the erstwhile ordance Factories.

12. India successfully flight tests indigenous high-speed flying-wing UAV

Defence Research and Development
Organisation (DRDO) has successfully
carried out a flight trial of Autonomous
Flying Wing Technology Demonstrator,
an indigenous high-speed flying-wing
Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) from
the Aeronautical Test Range,
Chitradurga in Karnataka.



- The successful flying demonstration of this autonomous stealth UAV is a testimony to maturity in the technology readiness levels in the country.
- With this flight in the tailless configuration, India has joined the elite club of countries to have mastered the controls for the flying wing technology.
- This UAV is designed and developed by DRDO's Aeronautical Development Establishment. The maiden flight of this aircraft was demonstrated in July 2022, followed by six flight trials in various developmental configurations using two in-house manufactured prototypes.

13. Akash missile system destroys 4 targets simultaneously during Air Force exercise

- The firepower of the indigenous Akash Missile system was demonstrated during the recent Astrashakti 2023 exercise at Suryalanka Air Force station in Andhra Pradesh.
- A single Akash missile system engaged four unmanned aerial targets simultaneously during the Astrashakti exercise held by the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- During the exercise, four targets came from the same direction in a close formation and split to attack defence assets from multiple directions simultaneously.
- India has become the first country to demonstrate the capability of engaging four targets simultaneously at around 30 km ranges by command guidance using a single firing unit.
- The Akash firing Unit was deployed with Firing Level Radar (FLR), a Firing Control Center (FCC), two Akash Air Force Launcher (AAFL) launchers having five armed missiles.

14. INS Shivaji Gets Original 'Vir Chakra' Awarded To 1971 War Hero

- The Indian Navy's premier technical training establishment, INS Shivaji, has received the original 'Vir Chakra' awarded to late Vice-Admiral Benoy Roy Chowdhury for his gallant actions during the 1971 India-Pakistan war.
- The Vir Chakra is an Indian wartime military bravery award presented for acts of gallantry on the battlefield, on land or in air or at sea.

15. Indian Air Force successfully testfires 'SAMAR' air defence missile system at Exercise Astrashakti

- In a major success for its in-house design and development efforts, the Indian Air Force has successfully testfired its SAMAR air defence missile system. The IAF has developed the Surface to Air Missile for Assured Retaliation (SAMAR) air defence missile system by using its old Russian-origin air-to-air missile systems.
- The Indian Air Force has carried out the successful firing trials of its in-house designed and developed SAMAR air defence missile system during exercise AstraShakti-2023 at Air Force Station Suryalanka held recently. The air defence system 'SAMAR' (surface-to-air missile for assured retaliation) has been developed by a unit under the IAF's Maintenance Command
- The system can engage aerial threats with missiles operating at a speed range of 2 to 2.5 Mach. The SAMAR system consists of a twin-turret launch platform with the capability of launching two missiles in single and salvo mode, depending on the threat scenario, the IAF officials said.



16. Navy unveils new epaulettes for Admirals

- The new epaulettes have the new golden Navy buttoncarrying the new naval crestwhich was unveiled last year, a red octagon as the backing to the national emblem, and a sword and a telescope.
- Navy said the new design is drawn from its naval ensign and inspired from the Rajmudra of Maratha ruler Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, reflecting the rich maritime heritage of Marathas.
- The new epaulettes are for the ranks of Admiral, Vice Admiral, Rear Admiral, Surgeon Vice Admiral and Surgeon Rear Admiral.
- Barring the medical officers, there would be around 100 officers of rank Rear Admiral and onwards, in the Navy.
- The new epaulettes have the new golden Navy button carrying the new naval crest which was unveiled last year, a red octagon as the backing to the national emblem, and a sword and a telescope. The ones for the medical officers have a red border as well.
- The earlier epaulettes for the same ranks did have a red backing for the national emblem, but not an octagonal one.
 Moreover, the button at the top of the epaulette reflected the old crest of the

- Navy which had a fouled anchor—a colonial era vestige.
- The old epaulettes carried a baton and a sword, but new ones carry an Indian sword and a telescope. The stars on the new epaulettes are also designed differently than the older ones.
- The new Navy button reflects the new crest, sans the fouled anchor which was a colonial era vestige. As per the Navy, the red octagon reflects the eight cardinal directions indicative of an all-round long-term vision. It is inspired by the new naval ensign that was unveiled last year and inspired from the Rajmudra of Maratha ruler Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj who had built the massive Maratha Navy which has a rich maritime legacy.
- The Navy said that the Indian sword represents being the cutting edge of national power and winning wars through dominance, defeating adversaries and overcoming every challenge, while the telescope symbolises a long-term vision, foresight, and a weather-eye in the changing world.
- The change is in line with the Indian Armed Forces' increasing efforts in the last two years to discard their colonialera vestiges, customs and traditions.

- Kissinger was at the height of his powers during the 1970s in the middle of the Cold War when he served as national security adviser and secretary of state under Republican President Richard Nixon.
- After Nixon's resignation in 1974 amid the Watergate scandal, he remained a diplomatic force as secretary of state under Nixon's successor, President Gerald Ford.
- Kissinger was the architect of the U.S. diplomatic opening with China, landmark U.S.-Soviet arms control talks, expanded ties between Israel and its Arab neighbors, and the Paris Peace Accords with North Vietnam.

1. Indian Army's Captain Geetika Koul becomes first woman medical officer to be deployed at Siachen

- Captain Geetika Koul from the Snow Leopard Brigade becomes the first woman medical officer of the Indian Army to be deployed at the world's highest battlefield, Siachen, after successfully completing the induction training at Siachen Battle School.
- The training programme at the prestigious Siachen Battle School is extremely tough and a candidate has to undergo preparation in high-altitude acclimatisation, special medical procedures and survival techniques. Siachen Glacier is in the northern part of the Himalayas. It is of strategic significance and is controlled by India but Pakistan claims it. 1. LIC amends norms for inclusion of shareholders' directors on its board

- State-owned insurer LIC has amended a framework to allow the induction of shareholders' directors on its board.
- The corporation would, upon notice of not less than one thousand shareholders or one-tenth of the total number of shareholders, whichever is lower, elect a shareholders' director through a general meeting of such shareholders.
- The person elected as a shareholders'
 director would be appointed by the
 board for a term of 4 years and eligible
 for re-election and re-appointment for
 another term of 4 years, it added.At
 present, LIC has five executive directors,
 including Chairman Siddhartha Mohanty,
 nine independent directors and one
 government nominee Director MP
 Tangirala.

2. With \$503 bn in reserves, LIC becomes world's fourth-largest insurer

- State-owned Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has become the fourth largest insurer in the world, ahead of US-based MetLife and Prudential Financial Inc.
- The LIC is only behind Germany's Allianz SE, China's China Life Insurance (CLI), and Japan's Nippon Life Insurance, according to a new ranking by capital market company S&P Global.
- The state-run insurer, which got listed in May 2022, has \$503.07 billion in reserves, while Allianz has \$750.20 billion, CLI has \$616.90 billion, and Nippon has \$536.80. Allianz SE, CLI, and Nippon Life Insurance Co are the three

- largest life insurance companies in the world, according to the ranking.
- S&P Global recently came out with a list of the world's 50 largest life insurers. In the list, Asia accounts for 17 spots on the list of top global life insurers, making it the region with the second-highest number.
- China and Japan share the top spot in Asia with five companies headquartered there.
- Mumbai-headquartered LIC ranked at the fourth position in the ranking

3. ICICI Pru Life, Ujjivan SFB enter into Bancassurance tie-up

- ICICI Prudential Life Insurance (ICICI PruLife) and Ujjivan Small Finance Bank (Ujjivan SFB) have entered into a bancassurance partnership for the distribution of life insurance products. Under the partnership, Ujjivan SFB will offer the entire suite of ICICI PruLife's protection, long-term savings and retirement products to its customers through its network.
- Insurance regulator IRDAI had in 2022
 widely thrown open the bancassurance
 channel for insurers as part of its overall
 effort to increase insurance penetration
 in the country and achieve the long-term
 goal of 'insurance for all' by 2047, when
 the country will celebrate its golden
 jubilee of independence.

4. LIC notifies hike in gratuity limit to Rs 5 lakh from Rs 3 lakh for agents

 Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) has notified an increase in gratuity limit to Rs 5 lakh from Rs 3 lakh for its agents.



- The increase was effected by amending the Life Insurance Corporation of India (Agents) Regulations, 2017.
- These regulations may be called the Life Insurance Corporation of India (Agents) Amendment Regulations, 2023, LIC said in a regulatory filing.

5. Life Insurers' Premium Income Rises Nearly 13% To Rs 7.83 Lakh Crore In FY23

- Premium income of life insurance companies grew 12.98 per cent to Rs
 7.83 lakh cr. in fiscal 2023 while that of general insurers increased by 16.4% to Rs 2.57 lakh cr. Private sector life insurers have clocked a growth of 16.34% in premiums, while the public sector life insurer recorded a 10.90% rise in premiums, as per the Irdai's annual report.
- Renewal premium continues to contribute the majority of total premiums underwritten by life insurers at 52.56 per cent in 2022-23. The rest 47.44 per cent is contributed by the new business premium.
- However, the growth in new business premium was higher at 17.90 per cent compared to renewal business at 8.88 per cent, as per the report.
- During 2022-23, Irdai said, life insurers issued 284.70 lakh new policies under individual business, out of which public sector insurers issued 204.29 lakh

- policies (71.75 per cent) and private life insurers issued 80.42 lakh policies (28.25 per cent).
- Profit after tax of the life insurance industry grew over five-fold to Rs 42,788 crore in 2022-23 against 7,751 crore in the preceding fiscal.
- The public sector reported 800 per cent profit profit, while private insurers together registered an increase by 72.36 per cent in 2022-23.

6. LIC to open branch office in GIFT City

- Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) has decided to open a branch office at GIFT City, the country's sole operational International Financial Services Centre.
- Already LIC has presence in 14 countries through branch offices, subsidiaries and joint ventures.
- IndiaFirst Life Insurance Company was the first life insurer to obtain registration for opening office in GIFT City.
- LIC directly operates through its branch offices in Fiji (Suva and Lautoka),
 Mauritius (Port Louis) and United Kingdom (Watford).
- Besides it has subsidiaries in Bahrain, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.
- LIC is now joining a select club of Indian life insurance companies who have established presence in GIFT City in Gujarat.



India & World

1. Out of Rs 1 lakh cr worth of FDI proposals from nations sharing land border with India, half is cleared

- The government has received foreign direct investment (FDI) proposals worth about Rs one lakh crore since April 2020 from countries sharing land border with India and half of those applications have been cleared so far.
- Countries which share land borders with India are China, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Bhutan, Nepal, Myanmar and Afghanistan.
- In April 2020, the government came out with a press note under which the Centre made its prior approval mandatory for foreign investments from countries that share land border with India to curb opportunistic takeovers of domestic firms following the Covid-19 pandemic.

2. India resumes imports of Venezuelan crude oil, Reliance seeks direct deal

- Indian refiners have resumed
 Venezuelan oil purchases through
 intermediaries, with Reliance set to
 meet executives from state firm PDVSA
 next week to discuss direct sales
 following the easing of U.S. sanctions on
 the South American country.
- India last imported Venezuelan crude in 2020.

3. India refuses to sign COP28 Declaration on Climate and Health

- India has refused to sign the COP28 Declaration on Climate and Health.
- The report also states the India cited the lack of practicality in curbing greenhouse

- gases use for cooling in the health sector, as the reason.
- The declaration has been signed by 124 countries till now with the US and India, which are among the top greenhouse gas emitters did not signed the declaration
- The declaration, aimed at addressing the critical intersection between climate change and global health, emphasises the need for swift and substantial reductions in greenhouse gas emissions.
- However, a sticking point emerged as the draft outlined a commitment to reducing greenhouse gases for cooling applications within healthcare infrastructure - a measure India finds difficult to comply with, sources said.

4. India joins Battery Energy Storage Systems Consortium for RE integration

- India became a member of the Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS)
 Consortium, an initiative led by The Global Leadership Council (GLC) of the Global Energy Alliance for People and Planet (GEAPP).
- As part of this collaborative effort, India stands among the pioneering nations committed to securing 5 Gw of BESS commitments by the conclusion of 2024
- India has taken significant steps for the integration of BESS, which will be crucial in supporting its goal of energy security and access to reliable round-the-clock energy for all.

In September this year, the Government of India approved a scheme committing to the development of 4,000 MWh of BESS projects by 2030-31, with financial support of up to 40% of the capital cost to developers in the form of Viability



Gap Funding (VGF). The scheme is expected to bring down the costs of BESS infrastructure projects and incentivise public-private partnerships.

5. India provides \$250 million Line of Credit to Kenya for agricultural modernisation

 India announced a \$250 million line of credit to Kenya for modernisation of its agricultural sector as Prime Minister Narendra Modi and visiting Kenyan President William Samoei Ruto agreed to strengthen bilateral ties in the field of defence, trade, energy, digital public infrastructure and healthcare.

6. Government of India and ADB sign \$175 million loan to improve connectivity in Madhya Pradesh

- The Government of India and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) signed a \$175 million loan to improve connectivity and resilience of roads in the state of Madhya Pradesh.
- The project will upgrade about 500 kilometers of state highways and major district roads to a standard two-lane feature.
- Since 2002, ADB has supported road development in Madhya Pradesh upgrading more than 9,000 kilometers of state highways and major district roads.
- This project continues these eorts and will connect rural areas to growth centres and industrial corridors and establish roads that are better, safer, and more climate-resilient.

7. NMCG Launches Global River Cities Alliance at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Dubai

 The Global River Cities Alliance (GRCA), led by the National Mission for Clean

- Ganga (NMCG) under the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, was launched at COP28, the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Dubai.
- GRCA is a unique alliance covering 275+ global river-cities in 11 countries, international funding agencies and is first of its kind in the world.
- The launch of GRCA, signifies a momentous step in global efforts toward river conservation and sustainable water management. Following this, partner countries are poised to coordinate post-COP activities, shaping the architecture of GRCA for effective implementation.
- **United Arab Emirates with countries** namely India, Egypt, Netherlands, Denmark, Ghana, Australia, Bhutan, Cambodia, Japan and river-cities of The Hague (Den Haag) from the Netherlands, Adelaide from Australia, and Szolnok of Hungary and International funding agencies the World Bank, Asian Development Bank (ADB), Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) and knowledge management institution like KPMG entering into a partnership, widely expanding the reach of the existing River Cities Alliance (RCA), formed by **NMCG** in association with National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) in 2021.

8. India joins UN's 'Race to Resilience' initiative at COP28

- India has joined the United Nations 'Race to Resilience', a global campaign to mainstream the idea of climate resilience in cities across India during the recently concluded COP28 event in Dubai.
- The Climate Centre for Cities (C-Cube) at the National Institute of Urban Affairs



(NIUA), under the ministry of housing and urban affairs, will spearhead this initiative.

- 'Race to Resilience' is a global platform to bring together non-state actors, investors, businesses, cities, regions, and civil society to increase the resilience of the most vulnerable to the climate crisis by 2030.
- In existence since 2020, the C-Cube has developed and implemented the ClimateSmart Cities Assessment Framework (CSCAF), a first-of-its-kind city assessment framework on climaterelevant parameters for Indian cities.
- Currently, the third round of the assessment is in progress for 220 cities across India. Under the CSAF framework, C-Cube has developed and delivered 26 training modules to improve aspects of urban planning, green cover, and biodiversity; energy and green buildings; mobility and air quality; water management and waste management.

9. Thiruvalluvar Statue Unveiled in France, Strengthening Cultural Ties

- In a significant cultural event, a statue of Thiruvalluvar, a revered Tamil poet and philosopher, was inaugurated in the French town of Cergy.
- The statue serves as a symbol of the deep-rooted ties that bind the two nations and stands as a testament to the enduring legacy of Thiruvalluvar's teachings.

10. India-United States Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Dialogue held in New Delhi

 India-United States Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism Dialogue was held in New Delhi to address illicit finance risk across both the countries. The meeting was held between Revenue Secretary Sanjay Malhotra and the US Treasury Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence, Brian Nelson.

11. Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence nations adopt New Delhi declaration

- India, the Chair of the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI), successfully hosted the GPAI Summit from December 12 - 14, 2023, at the Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. All 29 member nations of the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI) Summit, held in New Delhi, unanimously adopted the New Delhi Declaration.
- The New Delhi Declaration underscores the necessity of developing regulations, policies, and standards while addressing concerns surrounding misinformation, unemployment, transparency, fairness, protection of intellectual property, personal data, and upholding human rights and democratic values.

- The registration process will be free of cost adding that skilled labourers from all categories, including AC mechanics, and car painters, can register themselves on NSDC.

13. Saint Lucia's Tax Inspectors without Borders (TIWB) programme launched in partnership with India

 Tax Inspectors Without Borders (TIWB), a joint initiative of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Organisation for Economic

Cooperation and Development (OECD), launched a programme in Saint Lucia on 14th December, 2023.

- India has been chosen as the Partner Administration and will provide Tax Experts for this programme. This programme is the seventh TIWB programme which India has supported.
- This programme is expected to be of 12-18 months' duration in which India, in collaboration with the TIWB Secretariat and support of the UNDP Country Office, Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean, aims to aid Saint Lucia in strengthening its tax administration by transferring technical knowledge and skills to its tax administration, and through sharing of best practices. The focus of the programme will be on effective use of automatic exchange of information under the Common Reporting Standard (CRS) framework.

14. India tops global remittance flows at \$125 billion in 2023: World Bank

- India saw the highest amount of remittance inflows in the world in 2023 at \$125 billion, driven by several factors, including the country's agreement with the UAE, for promoting the use of dirhams and rupees for bilateral trade, the World Bank said.
- India was followed by Mexico (\$67 billion), China (\$50 billion), the Philippines (\$40 billion) and Egypt (\$24 billion).
- In a report, the World Bank further said growth in remittances in India is expected to halve to 12.4 per cent in 2023 from a historic peak of 24.4 per cent in 2022.



15. World Bank and Economic Affairs launch PPP Beginner's e-course in infrastructure capacity-building

- The PPP e-course is a infra-focused capacity-building programme jointly undertaken by the Infrastructure Finance Secretariat, DEA and the World Bank. The course aims to provide foundational knowledge and insights to individuals keen on understanding and contributing to the dynamic realm of PPPs in India.
- Dr. V. Anantha Nageswaran, Chief Economic Advisor of India. Shri Ajay Banga, President, World Bank Group.

16. Union Cabinet Nod For Migration, Mobility Pact With Italy Inked In November

- The Union Cabinet granted ex-post facto approval to sign and ratify the Migration and Mobility Agreement with Italy that allows Indian students temporary residence in the European nation for up to one year after studies to gather professional experience.
- The agreement was signed on Nov. 2 by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani.

17. India makes first-ever rupee payment for the purchase of crude oil from UAE

- India, the world's third-largest energy consumer, made its first-ever payment in rupees for crude oil purchased from the United Arab Emirates, signalling what could be a strategic push to promote the local currency globally.
- The move is part of India's broader efforts to diversify oil suppliers, cut transaction costs, and establish the rupee as a viable trade settlement.
- This initiative aligns with the Reserve Bank of India's move on July 11, 2022, allowing importers to pay in rupees and exporters to receive payments in the local currency.
- In July, India formalised an agreement with the UAE for rupee settlements, leading to the Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) making payments for purchasing one million barrels of crude oil from Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (Adnoc) in Indian rupees. Additionally, some Russian oil imports have also been settled in rupees.
- In the financial year 2022-23 (April 2022 to March 2023), India spent \$157.5 billion on importing 232.7 million tonnes of crude oil. Key suppliers included Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Russia, and the UAE, with West Asia contributing 58 per cent of all supplies. The domestic supply meets less than 15 per cent of the demand.


1. Cyclone Michaung Set To Make Landfall In Southeast India

- Cyclone Michaung is set to make a landfall in southeast India. The storm is expected to cross the coast of Andhra Pradesh near Bapatla, with a maximum sustained wind speed of 90 to 100 kilometers (56-62 miles) an hour, gusting to 110 kilometers.
- The cyclone is the sixth to develop in the Indian Ocean this year and fourth to form in the Bay of Bengal. Cyclone Michaung: The name was proposed by Myanmar, denoting resilience and fortitude.

- Tata Coffee Ltd's merger with Tata Consumer Products and TCPL Beverages & Foods gets NCLT Kolkata's nod, enhancing operational efficiency.
- Approved on November 10, 2023, the order was received by the company on December 1.
- This move aims to streamline management, boost synergy, and optimize operations for the global consumer product business. Tata Coffee primarily focuses on instant coffee extraction, branded coffee, and plantation activities. TCL's shares closed at Rs 279.75, marking a 0.68% increase on Friday's BSE.

2. Tata Power acquires Bikaner-Neemrana Transmission Project

- Tata Power has acquired Bikaner-Neemrana Transmission Project through a bidding process. Bikaner-III Neemrana-II Transmission Ltd is a special purpose vehicle (SPV) set up by PFC Consulting, for the project. The company has acquired Bikaner-Neemrana Transmission Project to boost renewable energy evacuation in India.
- The project, which will be developed on a Build-Own-Operate-Transfer (BOT) basis, will enable the evacuation of 7.7 GW of renewable energy from the Bikaner Complex in Rajasthan.
- The project entails establishment of a 340-km transmission corridor from Bikaner-III pooling station to Neemrana II substation.

 Tata Power will maintain the transmission project for a period of 35 years. It is estimated to cost Rs 1,544 crore and is expected to be commissioned within 24 months from the date of transfer of the project SPV.

3. NARCL finalises acquisition of two SREI companies

- The National Asset Reconstruction Company (NARCL) has finalised the acquisition of the two SREI companies SREI Equipment Finance and SREI Infrastructure Finance under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), paving the way for resolution of a Rs 32700-crore debt.
- NARCL was formed by the government in 2021 with public sector banks owning a majority stake in NARCL. Canara Bank is the sponsor bank.
- It has been set up with a strategic initiative to clean up banks' legacy stressed assets valued Rs 500 crore and above. It has so far aggregated debt of over Rs 25500 crore covering 6 assets.
- The SREI resolution plan received approval from the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), the Reserve Bank of India, and the Competition Commission of India.

4. Gautam Adani's group acquires 50.50 per cent stake in news agency IANS

 Gautam Adani increased his footprint in the media space when group flagship Adani Enterprises (AEL) announced the acquisition of a 50.50 per cent stake in news agency IANS India for an undisclosed sum. This is the conglomerate's third acquisition in this segment.



- This is the conglomerate's third acquisition in this segment. Adani had forayed into the media business in March last year when AMG Media Networks, a subsidiary of AEL, bought a 49 per cent stake in Raghav Bahl-curated digital business news platform Quintillion Business Media (QBML) for about Rs 48 crore.
- In November this year, the Adani group acquired the remaining 51 per cent to take full control of the entity. QBML operated the business and financial news digital media platform BQ Prime.
- Later that year, it acquired around 65
 per cent in broadcaster NDTV. BQ Prime
 has now been rebranded as NDTV Profit.
 Simultaneously, NDTV also announced
 that it has re-launched its business
 channel, NDTV Profit, after BQ Prime.

5. SBI invests '49.99 crore in Canpac Trends, eyes paper packaging industry

- State Bank of India has executed transaction documents to purchase 3,70,644 shares (6.35 per cent) of Ahmedabad-based Canpac Trends Private Limited at '1,349 per share, aggregating '49.99 crore.
- The Bank, in an exchange filing, said the investment in Canpac Trends, which is in the paper packaging industry, is being made with the objective of capital appreciation.

6. IBM to acquire Software AG's enterprise technology platforms, aiming to boost AI and Hybrid Cloud frontier

 BM, US-based IT giant, is set to acquire German software company Software AG's enterprise technology platforms for \$2.33 billion. The deal is aimed at enhancing its artificial intelligence and hybrid cloud offerings. The purchase will be funded with IBM's available cash, and includes Software AG's StreamSets and webMethods platforms, known for their application integration.

7. CCI Clears Alpha Alternatives Group Stake Purchase In Dilip Buildcon

- Fair trade regulator Competition
 Commission of India has granted an approval to Alpha Alternatives Group for the acquisition of a 10% stake in Dilip Buildcon.
- The transaction involves the acquisition of 9.99% of the equity stake in DBL by way of subscription to warrants by Alpha Alternatives Holdings Pvt Ltd, and its other entities.
- Ravneet Kaur, current Chairperson of CCI. The CCI cleared the deal under the green channel route.
- The commission has also approved the acquisition of 26% equity shareholding and investment in certain nonconvertible debentures in DBL's Special Purpose Vehicles by AAHPL along with its affiliates.
- The SPVs operate Hybrid Annuity Model projects (constructed and underconstruction projects) engaged in the road infrastructure sector in India.
- Meanwhile, in another deal, the antitrust regulator also gave its nod to purchase M&G Plc's 11 per cent stake in Trustroot Internet Pvt Ltd.
- Trustroot Internet is an online B2B ecommerce platform by the name of 'Udaan'.
- Under the green channel route, a transaction which does not raise any risk of an appreciable adverse effect on competition is deemed to be approved



on being intimated to the fair-trade regulator.

8. Blackstone To Buy 80% Of Sony Payment Unit For \$280 Million

- Blackstone Inc. will take a majority stake in a payment service provider under Sony Group Corp. for about \$280 million.
- Sony Group also operates a financial services business which includes Sony Bank and its subsidiary Sony Payment.
- Sony Bank will keep a 20% minority stake in the payment business, which is valued in total at 50 billion yen (\$350 million).

9. HDFC Bank board approves re-appointment of Atanu Chakraborty as chairman

- Private lender HDFC Bank said that its board has recommended the reappointment of Atanu Chakraborty as the part-time non-executive chairman and independent director.
- The bank further added that the matter is with the Reserve Bank of India for a second term of three years from May 5, 2024, to May 4, 2027 approval.
- Pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 and the Companies Act, 2013, the reappointment, HDFC Bank said, will be subject to the approval of the RBI and the shareholders of the Bank.
 Accordingly, the Bank will make an

application to the RBI in this regard under Section 35B of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

10. Competition Commission Clears IndusInd International Holdings-Reliance Capital Deal

- Fair trade regulator Competition
 Commission of India has cleared the
 proposed stake acquisition in Reliance
 Capital by IndusInd International
 Holdings Ltd, IIHL BFSI (India) Ltd, and
 Aasia Enterprises. Reliance Capital Ltd
 (RCL) is an RBI-registered non-banking,
 non-deposit-taking systemically
 important company (NBFC-CIC-ND-SI).
- The combination relates to the acquisition of a controlling stake in Reliance Capital Ltd by IndusInd International Holdings Ltd, IIHL BFSI (India) Ltd, and Aasia Enterprises.

11. RBI nod for I-Pru AMC and I-Pru Life to acquire 9.95% stake in RBL Bank

 The Reserve Bank of India has accorded its approval to ICICI Prudential Asset Management Company Ltd. and ICICI Prudential Life Insurance Company Limited to acquire an aggregate holding of up to 9.95 per cent of the paid-up share capital or voting rights in RBL Bank Ltd. The approval has been granted with reference to the application made by I-Pru AMC and IPru Life to RBI.



Agri-Business

1. Cabinet approves Minimum Support Price for Copra for 2024 season

- The MSP for Fair Average Quality of milling copra has been fixed at Rs.11,160/- per quintal and for ball copra at Rs.12,000/- per quintal for 2024 season.
- The MSP for 2024 season is an increase of Rs.300/- per quintal for milling copra and Rs.250/- per quintal for ball copra over the previous season.
- In order to provide remunerative prices to the cultivators, government had announced in the Union Budget of 2018-19, that MSPs of all the mandated crops will be fixed at a level of at least 1.5 times of all India weighted cost of production.
- In the last 10 years, the Government has increased MSP for milling copra and ball copra from Rs.5,250 per quintal and Rs.5,500 per quintal in 2014-15 to Rs.11,160 per quintal and Rs.12,000 per quintal in 2024-25, registering a growth of 113 percent and 118 percent, respectively.

2. UAE initiates process of investing \$2 billion in food parks in India

- The UAE has initiated the process of channelising its long-promised \$2-billion investments into food parks in India, starting with Gujarat, after the two countries sorted out concerns on curbs imposed by the Essential Commodities Act.
- The investments are being made as part of the four nation I2U2 (India-Israel-UAE-USA)
 initiative to develop a series of integrated food parks

1. Paytm to cut down on small-ticket loans after RBI tightens consumer lending norms, set to expand higher-ticket ones

- After the Reserve Bank of India tightened rules on consumer lending, Paytm has decided to cut down on disbursing loans under '50,000, said the digital payments firm In addition to this, the bank is likely to expand to higher-ticket loans
- The company is planning to reduce the proportion of small-ticket loans, also called postpaid loans, from its future loan distribution.

2. RBI allows REs to use HDFC Bank-Crunchfish AB's offline payments product

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has given a nod for regulated entities such as banks and non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) to adopt an offline digital payments product made by HDFC Bank in collaboration with Sweden's Crunchfish AB.
- HDFC Bank had stated that it would roll out this service as part of a limited pilot for four months in over 16 cities and towns. The product 'Offline Retail Payments' lets customers and merchants transact offline.
- The product 'Offline Retail Payments' lets customers and merchants transact offline. The solution, which functions in the absence of a network connection, is aimed at enhancing the adoption of digital payments in regions that lack sufficient network capacities.
- In February this year, HDFC Bank launched the pilot, in partnership with Crunchfish, to test offline digital payments for merchants and customers after the regulator in September 2022 selected the entity under the 'On Tap' application facility for the theme 'Retail Payments' of the Regulatory Sandbox to conduct a 'test phase' of the product.








13. INS Imphal, India's first warship named after a northeastern state, commissioned

- The Indian Navy commissioned its latest stealth-guided missile destroyer Imphal, at the Naval Dockyard, Mumbai.
- It is the first warship to have been named after a city from the Northeastern region, the approval for which was accorded by the President in April 2019. The ship was delivered by the

- Mazagon Dock Ltd to the Indian Navy on October 20, 2023.
- According to the Defence Ministry, the ship measures 163m in length and 17m in breadth, with a displacement of 7,400 tonnes and is among the most potent warships built in India. It is propelled by four powerful gas turbines, in a combined gas and gas configuration, and is capable of speeds in excess of 30 knots.
- INS Imphal is the third of the four 'Visakhapatnam-class destroyers developed and designed by the Indian Navy. Visakhapatnam-class destroyers are classified as P-15 Bravo or P-15B and are an upgraded version of P-15A Kolkata class destroyers.
- The other destroyers in the Visakhapatnam class are INS Visakhapatnam, INS Mormugao, Imphal and Surat, representing different regions of different states. The Destroyers just come next to the aircraft carriers in terms of capabilities and operational relevance.
- India's indigenous guided missile destroyer programme started in the 1990s with Project 15, the Delhi-class destroyer, followed by Project 15A, the Kolkata-class destroyer and now Project 15B.
