## 2. General Awareness

- Purpose: Test the candidate's general awareness of the environment and its application to society. Focuses on current events, matters of everyday observation, and knowledge in various fields including:

  - Culture
  - Geography
  - Indian Economy
  - General Polity
  - Indian Constitution
  - Scientific Research

## 3. General Science

- Physics: Thermodynamics, Mechanics, Newton's Law of Motion, Gravity, Motion, Pressure, Units of Measurements, Sound, Heat & Temperature, Electronics, Magnetism, Ohm's Law, Number Systems, Fiber Optics, Communication Modes, etc.
- Chemistry: Chemistry of Everyday Life, Commonly Used Chemicals, Important Catalysts, Reactions, Commercial Applications of Chemicals, Acidic and Basic Solutions, Atomic Numbers, Elements and their Symbols, Electrochemistry, etc.

### **6. Computer Fundamentals, MS Excel, MS Word, Communication, Internet, WWW, and Web Browsers**

## 7. Computer Based Examination Guidelines

- Objective Type: Multiple-choice questions
- Normalization of Marks: Using the formula published by the Commission
- Answer Key: Tentative answer keys will be published; candidates can submit representations with a fee.

## 8. Physical Endurance & Measurement Tests (PE&MT)

### A) Male Candidates (Including Ex-servicemen and Departmental Candidates)

- Upto 30 Years: 1600m race in 7 minutes, Long Jump: 12½ feet, High Jump: 3½ feet.
- 30-40 Years: 1600m race in 8 minutes, Long Jump: 11½ feet, High Jump: 3¼ feet.
- Above 40 Years: 1600m race in 9 minutes, Long Jump: 10½ feet, High Jump: 3 feet.

### B) Female Candidates (Including Departmental Candidates and Widows/Divorced/Judicially Separated Women Candidates)

- Upto 30 Years: 800m race in 5 minutes, Long Jump: 9 feet, High Jump: 3 feet.
- 30-40 Years: 800m race in 6 minutes, Long Jump: 8 feet, High Jump: 2½ feet.
- Above 40 Years: 800m race in 7 minutes, Long Jump: 7 feet, High Jump: 2¼ feet.

## 9. Physical Measurement

- Male Candidates:
  - Height: 170 cms (Relaxable by 5 cms for residents of hill areas and Delhi Police personnel's sons).
  - Chest: Minimum 81-85 cms (4 cms expansion).
- Female Candidates:
  - Height: 157 cms (Relaxable by 5 cms for residents of hill areas and Delhi Police personnel's daughters).

## 10. Medical Standards

- Candidates should be in sound health, free from disease, defect, or deformity.
- Vision: 6/6 in better eye, 6/36 in worse eye (correctable to 6/9 or 6/12).

## 11. Trade Test (Qualifying)

- Candidates must appear for the Trade Test (Reading & Dictation) to assess their capability to transmit and receive messages.
  - Dictation: Hindi and English; mistakes greater than 50% result in disqualification.
  - Reading Test: Candidates must read a passage both in Hindi and English.

## 12. Test of Proficiency in Computer Operation (Qualifying)

- English Word Processing Speed Test: 1000 key depressions in 15 minutes.
- Basic Computer Functions: MS Word, MS Excel, and MS PowerPoint.
  - MS Word: Text formatting (underline, font style, font size).
  - MS Excel: Merge cells, font styles, font colors.

- MS PowerPoint: Insert text boxes, images, and slides.
