Important Current Affairs

Economy

1. Rs 1,61,497 crore gross GST revenue collected for June 2023; records 12% Year-on-Year growth

The gross GST revenue collected in the month of June, 2023 is '1,61,497 crore of which CGST is '31,013 crore, SGST is '38,292 crore, IGST is'80,292 crore and cess is '11,900 crore (including '1,028 crore collected on import of goods). The revenues for the month of June 2023 are 12% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year.

2. NHB operationalises Rs 10,000crore Urban Infrastructure Development Fund(UIDF)

The National Housing Bank (NHB) has operationalised the Rs 10,000-crore UIDF announced in this year's Budget for creation of urban infrastructure in tier-2 and tier-3 cities.

As many as 459 tier-2 cities with population of 50,000 to less than a lakh and 580 tier-3 cities with population of one lakh to less than a million as per 2011 census are covered under UIDF as of now. Interest rate on UIDF loans has been kept at bank rate minus 1.5%.

3. India's direct tax mop-up in FY24 rises 16% to Rs 4.75 trillion so far

India's direct tax collection soared 16 per cent to touch Rs. 4.75 trillion this finacial year, showing continuity in revenue growth despite external headwinds. It said that the numbers so far 'continue to register steady growth.' On a gross basis, collection from direct taxes, which includes income and corporation taxes, grew 14.65 per cent to Rs. 5.17 trillion.

4. GST Council Meeting highlights: 28% GST rate on full value of online gaming

The 50th GST Council has recently concluded in New Delhi. A 28% GST rate has been levied on the full value of gaming, horse racing, and casinos which comes as a drawback to online gaming companies. Further, the council members exempted GST on key import of pharma products like cancer drug Dinutuximab, and Food for Special Medical Purposes (FSMP).

5. ADB retains India's growth forecast at 6.4 percent for current financial year

The Asian Development Bank retained India's economic growth forecast at 6.4 percent for the current financial year and 6.7 percent for the next, The ADB said



robust domestic demand will continue to support the region's recovery. In an update to its Asian Development Outlook, the ADB said inflation is expected to continue to fall, approaching pre-pandemic levels.

6. India Needs Average Annual 7.6% GDP Growth To Become Developed By 2047: RBI

India could become a developed country by 2047 with an average annual real GDP growth of 7.6 per cent over the next 25 years, said an article published by the Reserve Bank in its July bulletin. During 2022-23, India recorded a growth of 7.2 per cent. The RBI's projection for GDP growth for the current fiscal year is 6.5 per cent.

7. HDFC Bank crosses \$100 billion valuation, becomes world's 7th largest bank

Days after its merger with HDFC Ltd, HDFC Bank joined the exclusive club of companies with a market capitalisation of \$100 billion. This makes it the seventh-largest lender globally. The bank's market capitalisation crossed \$150 billion, making it bigger than Morgan Stanley, Goldman Sachs and Bank of China.

8. IMF raises India's growth forecast to 6.1% for current fiscal

International Monetary Fund (IMF) has raised India's growth forecast, projecting a Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth of 6.1 per cent in the current fiscal. In the World Economic Outlook that was released in April, the IMF had projected India's GDP at 5.9 per cent in the current fiscal.

9. India's per capita income set to grow by 70% to \$4,000 by 2030: Standard Chartered Bank report In a recent research report, Standard Chartered Bank has said that it predicts India's per capita income is poised to experience significant growth, soaring by nearly 70 per cent to reach \$4,000 by fiscal 2030, up from \$2,450 in fiscal 2023. This surge is expected to help the country achieve the status of a middle-income economy, boasting a GDP of \$6 trillion.

National

1. Dream11 secures BCCI lead sponsor rights for Rs 358 crore

Fantasy gaming platform Dream11 on Friday won the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI)'s lead sponsor rights for Rs 358 crore. Byju's had an optional agreement with the BCCI until November, but they decided to end the contract in March. Since then, Team India has been without a jersey sponsor and



even played the recent World Test Championship final without one.

2. Home Minister Amit Shah approves release of Rs 6,194 cr disaster relief fund to 19 states

Home Minister Amit Shah today approved the release of over Rs 6,194 crore to 19 State governments under the State Disaster Response Fund(SDRF).

The amount includes Rs 1,209.60 crore as central share of SDRF to four states -- Chhattisgarh, Meghalaya, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh -- for 2022-23.

3. Centre announces Tomato Grand Challenge hackathon

The Centre has announced the Tomato Grand Challenge (TGC) hackathon aimed at addressing the availability and affordability of tomatoes for consumers and ensuring fair value for tomato farmers. The challenge has invited innovative ideas across the tomato value chain. Winning ideas will be evaluated, developed into prototypes, and implemented on a large scale.

4. India's first domestically built 700 MW nuclear reactor starts commercial operation in Gujarat India's first indigenously developed 700 MW nuclear power reactor at the Kakrapar Atomic Power Project (KAPP) in Gujarat started

commercial operations. The Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) is building two 700 MW pressurised heavy water reactors (PHWRs) at Kakrapar, which is also home to two 220 MW power plants.

5. World Bank approves USD 255.5 million loan to improve technical education in India

The World Bank has approved a USD 255.5 million loan to assist India in raising the standard of its technical education and expanding the number of jobs prospects available to students. More than 3,50,000 students will benefit annually from the project's assistance of 275 government-run technical institutes.

6. NCUI collaborates with Google Cloud to launch an E-commerce Application to empower Indian coopera

Cooperative body National Cooperative Union of India (NCUI), partnered with Google Cloud to launch its e-commerce application for Indian cooperatives. The launch took place at the two-day 17th Indian Cooperative Congress (ICC) on July 1-2, 2023 in New Delhi.

7. Prime Minister Modi inaugurates Sai Hira Global Convention Centre in Puttaparthi, Andhra Pradesh



Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that the next 25 years of India's Independence is going to be "Kartavya Kaal" as the country is giving top priority to its "kartavya" (duties). The convention centre will be the centre of spiritual conferences and academic programs.

8. Centre's Fiscal Deficit At 11.8% Of Full Year Target: CGA Data

The central government's fiscal deficit at the end of May stood at 11.8% of the full-year budget estimates for 2023-24. The fiscal deficit was 12.3% of the 2022-23 budget estimates in the same period of the last year. In the Union Budget, the government aimed to bring down the fiscal deficit during the current financial year 2023-24 to 5.9% of the GDP

9. Amit Shah to inaugurate conclave on Primary Agricultural Credit Societies on July 14

Union Home and Cooperation
Minister Amit Shah will inaugurate
a day-long conclave to discuss
ways to strengthen Primary
Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS)
through Farmer Producer
Organisations (FPOs) in the national
capital.

The PACS have a huge member base of around 13 crore farmers,

out of which more than 86 percent of farmers in the country are small and marginal. Currently, there are more than 95000 PACS, of which only about 63,000 PACS are functional

10. Urban 20 (U20) Mayoral Summit concludes with handover of the Communiqu to G20 Leaders

The two-day Urban 20 Mayoral Summit, hosted by the chair city Ahmedabad, in Gandhinagar, concluded with the handover of the Communiqu from the Mayors to G20 leaders.

The Communique was officially endorsed by 105 cities across the world, the highest ever number of endorsements received to date for any U20 Communiqu. The Communiqu is aligned with the G20 theme of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' 11. Agri Ministry asks banks to promote Rs 1 lakh crore Agriculture Infrastructure Fund

The Agriculture Ministry asked banks to promote Rs 1 lakh crore Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF) for creation of necessary infrastructure in the farm sector. The AIF is a financing facility launched on July 8, 2020 for creation of post-harvest management infrastructure and community farm assets.



12. Cabinet approves changes to Jan Vishwas Bill to decriminalise offences in 42 laws

The Union Cabinet on Wednesday cleared the Jan Vishwas (Amendment of Provisions) Bill, 2022 that proposes to decriminalise various offences in 42 laws, including minor ones that invite jail term.

The Jan Vishwas (Amendment of Provisions) Bill, 2022 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on December 22, 2022 and its aim is to reduce the compliance burden on individuals and business

13. Centre releases Rs 7,532 crore to states under SDRF

The finance ministry on Wednesday released Rs 7,532 crore to 22 state governments under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) amid rain causing havoc in the northern parts of the country. The State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) has been constituted in each state under Section 48 (1) (a) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005.

14. Union Cabinet clears commercial mining of lithium & 5 other critical minerals

The Union Cabinet Wednesday approved amendments to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, that will pave the way for commercial mining of six critical minerals ' lithium, beryllium, niobium, tantalum, titanium and zirconium ' and deepseated minerals like gold, silver and copper.

15. Centre Exempts Satellite Launch Services From GST

In order to support new businesses, the GST Council exempted satellite launch services provided by ISRO, Antrix Corporation Limited, and New Space India Limited (NSIL) from GST. This may also be extended to similar services provided by private sector firms. This decision will enable companies to provide competitive prices to launch satellites.

16. G20: Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors meeting to be held in Gandhinagar

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Dr Shaktikanta Das will jointly chair a meeting of the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors (FMCBG) to be held on July 17-18 in Gandhinagar where 66 delegations will be in attendance.

17. 3rd Sherpas G20 meeting to begin in Hampi, Karnataka

The third Sherpas meeting under India's G20 Presidency will begin in Hampi in Karnataka.

18. President of India to present the 'Bhoomi Samman' 2023 on 18th July, 2023

The President of India will present the 'Bhoomi Samman' 2023 on 18th July 2023 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi to 9 State Secretaries and 68 District Collectors along with their teams who have excelled in achieving saturation of the core components of Digital India Land Records Modernization Programme (DILRMP) 'the core of Governance. 19. Back Surat Diamond Bourse becomes world's largest office building, surpasses US Pentagon India has surpassed the US in one significant thing--having the world's largest office building. Gujarat has a record-breaking building to house its mammoth diamond industry. According to a report by CNN, the newly-opened Surat Diamond Bourse consists of 15-storey complex, built across more than 35 acres of land.

20. Lavasa, India's first private hill station, sold for Rs 1.8k crore

In a move that will address claims of hundreds of homebuyers and lenders, the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) has cleared the sale of India's first private hill station, Lavasa, to Darwin Platform Infrastructure. The NCLT order approving the resolution plan submitted by Darwin came after the lenders voted in favour of the resolution plan.

21. Amit Shah lays foundation stone of 108 feet tall statue of Lord Shri Ram in Andhra Pradesh

Union Home Minister Amit Shah laid the foundation stone of 108 feet tall statue of Lord Shri Ram in Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh through video conferencing.

The statue will be built at a cost of over 500 crore rupees.

The statue to be installed in Mantralayam will give the message of Sanatan Dharma to the entire world, and it will strengthen the Vaishnava tradition.

22. Airtel becomes first ICT provider to link over 20 million IoT devices

Bharti Airtel announced it has become the first Information and Communications Technology service provider in India to connect over 20 million devices through its Internet of Things solutions. IoT



describes the network of physical objects embedded with sensors, software, and other technologies for the purpose of connecting and exchanging data with other tech using internet.

23. In-Principle approval to set up 21 new Greenfield Airports in country

Government of India has accorded 'In-Principle' approval for setting up of 21 new Greenfield Airports namely- Mopa in Goa, Navi Mumbai, Shirdi and Sindhudurg in Maharashtra, Kalaburagi, Vijayapura, Hassan and Shivamogga in Karnataka, Dabra (Gwalior) in Madhya Pradesh, Kushinagar and Noida (Jewar) in Uttar Pradesh. 24. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will dedicate 1.25 lac PM Kisan Samriddhi Kendras to Nation In a bid to provide help to farmers in cultivation, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will dedicate 1.25 lakh centres of 'Pradhanmantri Kisan Samridhi Kendras (PMKSK) at a special function in Rajasthan's Sikar district on 27 July. The retail prices have increased by 11.5% over a year and 3% over the past month.

29. Bengaluru becomes first Indian city to join World Cities Culture Forum

Bengaluru has become the first Indian city to become part of the World Cities Culture Forum a global network of cities that share research and intelligence, and explore the role of culture in future prosperity. The network currently has 40 cities spanning six continents. Bengaluru being the latest addition is set to join the league of cities like New York, London, Paris.

30. Union Minister for Women and Child Development, Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani to inaugurate the G20 EMPOWER Summit in Gandhinagar

The G20 EMPOWER Summit is set to take place on August 1, 2023, at the Mahatma Mandir in Gandhinagar, Gujarat.

The summit, organised around the theme- 'Women-Led Development: ensuring a sustainable, inclusive, and equitable global economic growth', will witness the participation of delegates from across G20 nations, invited guest countries and international organisations.

International

1. New Zealand says it's the first to ban thin plastic bags from supermarkets

New Zealand will become the first country to ban the thin plastic bags that supermarket customers use to collect their fruit and vegetables. The new ban will also extend to plastic straws and silverware, as the government expands a campaign against single-use plastics it started in 2019 when it banned the thicker plastic shopping bags that customers used to carry home.

2. China's Qu-Dongyu re-elected unopposed as head of FAO

In a significant development at the ongoing FAO Conference in Rome, Qu Dongyu has been re-elected unopposed as the head of the United Nations' Food and



Agriculture Organization (FAO) for the period 2023-2027.

3. NATO's Jens Stoltenberg to stay on as chief for another year

NATO members has extended the tenure of the alliance's Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg by one year, following failed efforts to settle on a consensus successor for the role. The announcement comes a week before the NATO leaders summit in Vilnius, Lithuania that is sure to be dominated by the Western military alliance's reponse to the conflict in Ukraine. Rinkevics sworn in as the country's new President who has pledged to fight for inclusion and equality. Rinkevics was foreign minister from 2011 until his official resignation in July 2023. Latvia capital is Riga.

6. NATO leaders gather in Lithuania for key summit

NATO leaders are gathering in Lithuania for a crucial summit that could shape the direction of the war in Ukraine and the future of the Western alliance.

The 31 allies hope to show Russia they have the resolve to support Ukraine militarily for the long term. They arrive with a welcome boost after Turkey dropped its objections to Sweden joining the alliance.

7. UAE becomes first Arab country

to get observer status at Asia-Pacific Group on Money Laundering A delegation from the UAE is participating with observer status in the plenary of the Asia/Pacific Group on Money Laundering (APG), a Financial Action Task Force-Style regional body (FSRB), taking place this week in Vancouver, Canada. 1. India beat Iran to win Asian Kabaddi Championship in Busan, South Korea

The Indian men's kabaddi team won the 11th edition of the Asian Kabaddi Championship beating Iran 42-32 in the final in Busan, South Korea. This is India's eighth title in nine editions.

Six teams - India, Iran, Japan, Korea, Chinese Taipei and Hong Kong - participated in the Championships. Pawan Sehrawat was the captain of Indian Kabbadi team in this tournament.

2. Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra clinches Lausanne Diamond League title.

Neeraj Chopra clinched the Lausanne Diamond League 2023 title with the best throw of 87.66 meters in the 5th attempt. This is his second successive Diamond League victory.

Germany's Julian Webber slid secured second place with a best

throw of 87.03 meter while Jakub Vadlech of the Czech Republic got third place with an 86.13 meter throw. In September 2022, Neeraj became the first Indian athlete to win the Diamond Trophy.

3. Yuki Bhambri wins maiden ATP doubles title in Mallorca, Spain In Tennis, India's Yuki Bhambri clinched his maiden title on the ATP World Tour, winning the doubles trophy at the Mallorca Championships with South African partner Lloyd Harris, in Spain. The 30-year-old Indian Bhambri, who is ranked 75 in the ATP doubles tennis rankings, is all set to jump up to a career-best 58th position in the standings.

4. Mirabai Chanu & Bindyarani Devi selected in the selected in the 4-member Indian weightlifting team for the Hangzhou Asian Games Tokyo Olympic Silver medalist Mirabai Chanu headlines the India Weightlifting team for the upcoming Asian Games.

The four-member also includes the Commonwealth Gold medalist Bindyarani Devi. Mirabai will participate in the 49 kg category, while Bindyarani will feature in the 55 kg.

6. India registers remarkable reduction in poverty; 415 million people out of poverty level in just 15 years: UN

A total of 415 million people moved out of poverty in India within just 15 years from 2005/2006 to 2019/2021, the UN said



It said that 25 countries, including India, successfully halved their global MPI values within 15 years, showing that rapid progress is attainable. These countries include Cambodia, China, Congo, Honduras, India, Indonesia, Morocco, Serbia, and Vietnam.

7. 21% unorganised workers exit PM pension scheme

4. Chinese rocket becomes 1st methane-fueled launcher to reach orbit

A private Chinese company has launched the world's first methane-liquid oxygen space rocket into orbit. The Zhuque-2 carrier rocket blasted from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in northwest China. The first launch attempt of the Zhuqu-2 in December had failed.

5. MoU signed between OneWeb India and Gujarat Government to set up India's first private satellite network

An Internet ransomware virus 'Akira' that steals vital personal information and encrypts data leading to extortion of money from people has been reported in cyberspace, the country's federal cybersecurity agency said in the latest advisory. This computer malware is targeting Windows and Linuxbased systems. 'Akira is reportedly active in cyberspace.

7. Jupiter-3, world's largest private satellite, set for launch by SpaceX's Falcon Heavy

SpaceX Falcon Heavy rocket will launch Maxar Technologies' largest ever satellite, the Jupiter 3. The communications platform will join others in the Hughes Jupiter satellite fleet already in orbit, which provides broadband internet services to North and South America.

The satellite will be the world's largest commercial communications satellite once it's fully deployed.



8. ISRO rocket carrying seven Singaporean satellites lifts off from Sriharikota

ISRO launched its proven PSLV rocket carrying seven Singaporean satellites from Satish Dhawan Space Centre.

ISRO's trusted workhorse Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle is the DS-SAR Radar Imaging Earth Observation satellite, which has been developed under a partnership between DSTA (representing the Government of Singapore) and ST Engineering, Singapore.

Indian Army contingent comprising of 43 personnel left for Mongolia. The contingent will participate in the 15th edition of bilateral joint military exercise 'NOMADIC ELEPHANT-23'. India and Mongolia have a shared commitment to regional security and cooperation.

5. Indian, Indonesian naval ships to



Two frontline Indian Naval ships INS Sahyadri and INS Kolkata arrived in Indonesia's Jakarta to participate in the Maritime Partnership Exercise (MPX) with the Indonesian Navy. INS Sahyadri is the third indigenously designed and built Project-17 class stealth frigate and INS Kolkata is the first indigenously designed and built stealth destroyer of the Project-15A class. Both the ships have been built at Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd, Mumbai.

6. Ashok Leyland bags major orders worth Rs 800 crore from Indian Army

Ashok Leyland, the Indian flagship of the Hinduja Group and the largest supplier of logistics vehicles to the Indian military, announced on that it had won major orders for defence vehicls, valued at Rs 800 crore. The contracts awarded to Ashok Leyland include for the production of 'field artillery tractors' (FAT 4x4) and 'gun towing vehicles' (GTV 6x6).

7. Back India hands over INS Kirpan to Vietnam in landmark move

'On completing 32 years of illustrious service to the nation, Indian Naval Ship Kirpan has been decommissioned from the Indian Navy and handed over to Vietnam People's Navy (VPN) at Cam Ranh, Vietnam. According to the Indian

Navy chief, this marks the first time India has handed over a full operational corvette to a foreign country.

Bastille Day is celebrated as the anniversary of Storming of the Bastille in 1789 during the French Revolution. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been invited as the guest of honour.

3. Multilateral development banks pledge upto \$27 bn for India's green growth

European Investment Bank has pledged one billion euros to develop a large-scale hydrogen industry hub, while the ADB intends to provide \$20-\$25 billion over five years to support India's green growth during International Conference on Green Hydrogen (ICGH-2023), held between July 5-7 in India. The World Bank also approved \$1.5 billion to aid India's low-carbon transition. ICGH-2023 held in New Delhi

4. India Permits Potato Imports From Bhutan Without License Till June 2024

India on Monday permitted imports of potatoes from Bhutan without any license for one more year till June 2024. Earlier, it was allowed till June 30 this year.

The DGFT said that the import of 17,000 metric tonnes of fresh (green) areca nut without a minimum import price condition from Bhutan will also also be allowed through land customs station Chamurchi. Imports of fresh or chilled potatoes stood at \$1.02 million in 2022-23.

5. Adani group announces full-load commencement of power supply to



Bangladesh from 1600 mw thermal plant

The Adani Group announced the commissioning of India's first transnational project at Godda in Jharkhand to supply power to the Bangladesh electricity grid. Chairman Gautam Adani called on Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in Dhaka following the full load commencement of power supply to Bangladesh from the Group's Ultra Super-Critical Thermal Power Plant.

6. India's Razorpay launches first international payment gateway in Malaysia

India's home-grown fintech and payments solutions provider Razorpay has announced the launch of its first international payment gateway services in the Malaysian market with Curlec. In Feb 2022, Bengaluru-headquartered Razorpay which was established in 2014, announced its first international expansion into South-East Asia with the acquisition of a majority stake in Curlec.

7. India contributes \$1 million to the United Nations to promote the Hindi language

Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj, India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations announced that India has made a voluntary contribution of \$1 million to the UN. This contribution aims to support the promotion of the Hindi language within the organization and foster inclusive dialogue and understanding.

2. Rajasthan govt tables country's first gig workers bill

The Rajasthan government tabled the Rajasthan Platform-Based GIG Workers (registration and welfare) Bill, 2023 - the country's first such - which seeks to guarantee social security to gig workers. The bill provisions for monetary penalties if an aggregator fails to comply with the Act. The state government may impose a fine of Rs. 5 Lakh to Rs. 50 lakh for It's violation.

3. Rajasthan Assembly passes Minimum Guaranteed Income Bill

The Rajasthan Assembly passed The Rajasthan Minimum Guaranteed Income Bill, 2023, which seeks to cover the entire adult population of the state with a guarantee of wages



or pension. As per the Bill, all families of the state, whether urban or rural, will be able to get employment guarantee of 125 days every year.

Tamil Nadu

1. India's first 'Police Drone Unit' launched in Chennai

The Greater Chennai City Police (GCP) launched 'Police Drone Unit' for aerial surveillance over vast areas and quick detection of criminal activities.

All drones are equipped with builtin Artificial Intelligence (AI) capabilities and can be operated up to a distance of 5-10 Kms from the ground station (i.e.) the Drone Police Unit.

2. India gets its 36th and Tamil Nadu its first flying training school India now has 36 DGCA-approved frying schools. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA)recently gave its nod to EKVI Air Training Organization Pvt. Ltd. will be based at Salem Airport. This will be the first flying training organization (FTO) in Tamil Nadu.

3. Foxconn to invest Rs 1,600 crore in Tamil Nadu for component manufacturing

Taiwan's Foxconn Technology Group, a key supplier to Apple Inc, pledged to invest Rs 1,600 crore to set up a high-end electronics component manufacturing unit in Tamil Nadu's Kanchipuram district generating jobs for about 6,000 people. The investment to be made by Foxconn Industrial Internet (Fii), the largest subsidiary of Foxconn Technology Group.

1. UP govt approves two thermal power projects a 50:50 partnership

with NTPC

The Uttar Pradesh government approved two 'Obra D' thermal power projects of 800 MW each to be built at the cost of Rs 18,000 crore in Sonbhadra's Obra, a move aimed at providing cheaper electricity to the people of the state. The projects will be executed by the government with a 50:50 partnership with central government-owned power generator NTPC. 'Obra D' thermal power plants will be the first ultra super critical unit in the state. Jammu and Kashmir

India's first Tele-MANAS chatbot, which will start an instant conversation with people in distress, was launched in J&K. This year Kashmir saw the highest number of distress calls to the Tele-Manas centre. The initiative will ensure the availability of health



counsellors, clinical psychologists and consultants round-the-clock.

2. Srinagar bans sale of 'sharpedged weapons' amid rise in stabbing incidents

Srinagar authorities on Friday banned the sale, purchase, and carrying of 'sharp-edged weapons' in public places in view of several stabbing incidents in the city. The decision was taken apparently as a result of several recent incidents of stabbings reported several places in the district.

3. Jammu to pioneer India's first Cannabis Medicine Project

Jammu is going to pioneer India's first Cannabis Medicine Project. 'Cannabis Research Project' of CSIR-IIIM Jammu is a first of its kind in India initiated the project in Private Public Partnership with a Canadian firm, which has great potential to put the substance of abuse for the good of mankind, especially for patients suffering from neuropathies, cancer, and epilepsy.

At just 20 years old, Alcaraz became Wimbledon's third youngest men's champion, adding to his previous major victory at the US Open last year.

5. Marketa Vondrousova defeats Ons Jabeur 6-4, 6-4 to clinch women's title at Wimbledon

Marketa Vondrousova became the lowest-ranked woman to win Wimbledon, defeating 2022 runner-up Ons Jabeur 6-4, 6-4 in the final. Vondrousova is a 24-year-old left-hander from the Czech Republic who is ranked 42nd and was the first unseeded woman to play for the title at the All England Club in 60 years.

6. Tamil Nadu tops NITI Aayog's Export Preparedness Index 2022

Tamil Nadu has pipped Maharashtra and Gujarat to emerge as the top state among coastal states in the Niti Aayog's Export Preparedness Index 2022. The acronym SONAR stands for SOund Navigation And Ranging. Sonar is a device that uses ultrasonic waves to measure the distance, direction and speed of underwater objects. Sonar consists of a transmitter and a detector and is installed in a boat or a ship.
