

# RRB ALP Selection Process 2024

The RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 comprises four stages. Initially, candidates must clear the Stage I CBT. Those who qualify in Stage I proceed to the next stage, the Stage II CBT. Those who qualify in CBT 2 proceed to the next stage, CBAT. For candidates applying for RRB ALP, document verification follows upon clearing these stages.

- CBT Stage I
- CBT Stage II
- Computer-Based Aptitude Test
- Document Verification

## RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 CBT 1

To become an Assistant Loco-Pilot (ALP) through the Railway Recruitment Board (RRB), candidates will undergo a structured RRB ALP Selection Process 2024. The first crucial step in this journey is the Computer-Based Test (CBT) Stage 1, designed to qualify in nature.

## RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 CBT 2

The RRB ALP (Railway Recruitment Board Assistant Loco Pilot) Selection Process for the year 2024 includes a multi-stage examination to identify and recruit skilled candidates for the position of Assistant Loco Pilot. The CBT (Computer-Based Test) Stage II is a crucial phase of this selection process, designed to evaluate candidates' proficiency in various subject areas and their trade-specific knowledge.

RRB ALP CBT Stage II comprises two distinct parts: Part A and Part B. Part A assesses candidates' proficiency in mathematics, reasoning, basic science & engineering, and their awareness of current affairs. This segment of the exam features a total of 100 questions to be answered within a time frame of 90 minutes.

## RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 Computer Based Aptitude Test

For candidates applying for the position of Assistant Loco-Pilot (ALP), the RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 includes a third-round assessment known as the Computer Based Aptitude Test.

This test serves as a critical evaluation of candidates' aptitude and abilities required for the role. Unlike the previous rounds, this stage does not involve negative marking, ensuring a fair assessment of candidates' potential.

**Test Objective:**

The primary objective of the Computer Based Aptitude Test is to assess candidates' suitability for the position of Assistant Loco-Pilot, particularly focusing on their cognitive and decision-making skills.

**Qualifying Score:**

To successfully clear this round, candidates must achieve a minimum score of 42 marks. It's essential to note that no relaxation in these minimum marks is permitted, emphasizing the importance of meeting this criterion.

**Scoring System:**

Unlike previous rounds, there is no negative marking in the Computer Based Aptitude/Psycho Test. Candidates are encouraged to answer questions to the best of their abilities without the fear of losing marks for incorrect responses.

## RRB ALP Selection Process 2024 Document Verification

Upon successfully clearing the preceding rounds of the selection process, candidates will proceed to the crucial stage of Document Verification. During this phase, candidates are required to present all the necessary original documents along with their copies for thorough scrutiny.

**Purpose of Document Verification:**

The Document Verification stage serves as an important step to confirm the authenticity of candidates' qualifications, eligibility, and personal information. It ensures that candidates meet all the required criteria and possess the essential credentials to proceed further in the selection process.

**Document Checklist:**

Candidates must arrive at the Document Verification session fully prepared with the following:

Original copies of all relevant educational certificates and mark sheets.

Proof of age and date of birth.

Proof of identity, such as Aadhar card, passport, or voter ID.

Category certificate (if applicable).

Disability certificate (if applicable).

Any other documents as specified in the official notification.
