The SSC JHT Examination is conducted in two stages — **Paper I** (Objective Type – Computer-Based Test) and **Paper II** (Descriptive – Translation and Essay Writing). Below is the detailed and well-structured syllabus for both papers:

Paper I: Computer-Based Test (CBT)

Mode: Online

Type: Objective Multiple Choice Questions

Total Marks: 200

Duration: 2 hours (2 hours 40 minutes for candidates using a scribe)

Sections Covered:

- **General Hindi (100 Marks)**
 - Understanding of Hindi language and grammar
 - Vocabulary and word usage
 - Synonyms and antonyms
 - Sentence structure and error spotting
 - Correct usage of phrases and idioms
 - Fill in the blanks, cloze test, and reading comprehension
 - Usage of appropriate grammar rules and syntax
 - Understanding of Hindi literature elements

The level of the questions is equivalent to the degree standard (Bachelor's level).

- Comprehend literary and official language nuances
- Present structured thoughts in the form of essays on general topics

The difficulty level of Paper II will align with the minimum educational qualifications prescribed for the post, which is typically a **Bachelor's Degree with Hindi and English as main subjects.**
