Candidates well-versed in reading, writing and speaking Sindhi through formal study or as native speakers should opt for this achievable optional. The rich literary heritage encompasses religious, philosophical and scientific texts. Diligent preparation is key.

 - Phonological, morphological, and syntactical features of Sindhi language.
- 3. Major Dialects of Sindhi Language:
 - o Overview of the major dialects spoken within the Sindhi language.
- 4. Sindhi Vocabulary:
 - Stages of growth of Sindhi vocabulary, including pre-partition and postpartition periods.
- 5. Historical Study of Writing Systems (Scripts) of Sindhi:
 - o Examination of various writing systems used historically in Sindhi language.
- 6. Changes in the Structure of Sindhi Language in India after Partition:
 - Analysis of the structural changes in Sindhi language post-partition, influenced by other languages and social conditions.
