SSC CHSL Tier 2 Exam Pattern

The SSC CHSL Tier-II exam is a Computer Based Test (CBT). It includes a Skill Test for Data Entry Operators (DEOs) and a Typing Test for Lower Division Clerks (LDCs) and Junior Secretariat Assistants (JSAs). The detailed SSC CHSL Tier 2 exam pattern is as follows:

SSC CHSL Skill Test/ Typing Test Exam Pattern

Candidates had to appear for the skill test or typing test in Tier 2 of the examination. The details of the typing test are as follows:

SSC CHSL Tier 2 Marking Scheme

In the exam, candidates will face a penalty of 1 mark deducted for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III. The errors in the Skill Test will be calculated to two decimal places.

Errors In Skill Test	Upto 2 Decimal Points

Module I of Section III, which includes the Computer Knowledge Test, is mandatory but only needs to be cleared to qualify. This means candidates must pass the Computer Knowledge Test, but the marks obtained in it do not affect the overall score directly.
